Minneapolis, Minnesota Thursday, May 27, 1954

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten
o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

Members present: Commissioners Ainsworth, Christensen, Hanson, and Chairman Matthews.

Member absent: Commissioner Scott.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

At 10:00 o'clock A.M., continued hearing was called for in the matter of the establishment of County Drainage Ditch No. 46. An additional bond in the amount of \$3,000.00, filed in the office of the County Auditor on May 27, 1954, on behalf of the petitioners was presented. A supplemental report, plans, and specifications for the establishment of said ditch were presented by Charles H. Soutter, Jr. The viewers' amended report of benefits and damages signed by Richard King, C. Elmer Keefe, and L. J. Gleason, was presented. Mr. Soutter explained the general drainage area and the plans for the ditch.

Various persons addressed the board in opposition to and in favor of the establishment of the ditch. A. G. Cooper, Attorney, stated that he represents 53 residents of the area who are opposed to the establishment of the ditch.

Commissioner Hanson moved, seconded by Commissioner Ainsworth that the Board take the matter under advisement.

Motion unanimously carried.

Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, June 1, 1954

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten
o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A letter received from R.C. Fernstrom, Mayor, Village of St. Louis Park, advising the County Board of the completion of work on a portion of Minnetonka Boulevard in St. Louis Park, was referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

A letter from the attorneys for the Minneapolis-Saint Paul Metropolitan Airports Commission, requesting the withdrawal from sale of a parcel of tax forfeited land needed for airport purposes, was referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings and the Clerk to the County Board was requested to notify said attorneys of the disposition of the matter.

A letter from Elmer H. Larson, Land Commissioner, recommending the withdrawal from sale of certain tax forfeited land described in Withdrawal from Sale List "No. 378-W" was read and referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

Two petitions requesting the appointment of Mrs. Viola Thompson, Assistant Superintendent of Schools, to fill the vacancy in the office

of the County Superintendent of Schools in the event such a vacancy occurs, were received as follows:

- 1. From School District No. 82, signed by Harry Nelson and 44 others.
- 2. From School District No. 102, signed by Herbert Becker and 31 others.

Said petitions were ordered placed on file.

Letters were received from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, as follows:

l. Advising of the acceptance of the H.V. Johnston Company bid for furnishing pure iron corrugated metal pipe arch culvert, being Project No. 5121, and requesting that the County Auditor be directed to set aside the necessary funds therefor from the Road and Bridge appropriation. Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

FOURTH, That the liens to be assessed for benefits against the tracts of land as shown in the viewers report shall be payable as follows:

One-tenth (1/10th) of the principal thereof on or before November 1st subsequent to the date of the filing of the lien provided by law in the office of the Register of Deeds of said Hennepin County, and one-tenth (1/10th) on the 1st day of November of each year thereafter until the wholeamount of said principal is paid.

The principal lien shall bear interest at the rate of Five per cent (5%) per annum from the date of the filing of the lien statement in the office of the Register of Deeds.

FIFTH, That said ditch so established, as specified in the final

report of the Civil Engineer be constructed according to law.

SIXTH, That the Chairman of this Board is hereby authorized and directed to issue an Order establishing said County Ditch No. 46.

A letter from the said Hardware Mutual Insurance Company of Minnesota declaring their intent for the use of the property if their offer to purchase the Vince A. Day Center property is accepted, was read.

Chairman Matthews called for additional bids, and there being none, at 10:10 o'clock A.M., Commissioner Scott moved, seconded by Commissioner Christensen, that the Board recess for fifteen minutes.

Motion unanimously carried.

At 10:25 o'clock A.M., Chairman Matthews again called the Board to order and then called three times for additional bidders. There were no additional bidders.

Mr. Goldie appeared before the Board representing the Minnesota Federation of Conservation, opposing the sale of the property.
