Tuesday, August 17, 1954

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., Stanley Cowle, Assistant Purchasing Agent, proceeded to open bids for bituminous surfacing of County Road No. 65 and State Aid Road No. 18. The bids were referred to the Purchasing Agent for a report back at the next Board meeting.

Monthly reports from Frank E. Adams, Veterans Service Officer, were presented and ordered placed on file.

A report on the budget of the Hennepin County Highway Department was received from O. A. Pearson, Budget Director, and ordered placed on file.

Letters were received from L. P. Zimmerman, County Engineer, as follows:

1. Recommending the acceptance of the low bid of La Rowe Equipment and Construction Company for improving State Aid Road No. 6.
6. Referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

2. Requesting transfer of funds from the "Aid to Towns and Villages" to the regular maintenance budget under "Schedule No. 1" and requesting the Purchasing Agent to replenish the Highway Department stock with 9,490 gallons of MC-3 and 11,428 gallons of Asphalt

Emulsion. Referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

3. Submitting agreements, plans and specifications for paving Penn Avenue South from West 54th Street to West 62nd Street and for improving Penn Avenue South from West 50th Street to West 54th Street. Referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

4. Notifying the Board of the completion of the contract for improving State Aid Road No. 7. Referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

A letter from John K. Harvey, Assistant County Attorney, relative to the transfer of certain property from the Village of Morningside to the Village of St. Louis Park was read and ordered placed on file.

A letter from Frank D. Bessessen, Court Commissioner, relative to patients under a hold order at the Minneapolis General Hospital was read and ordered held until receipt of formal claims.

A letter from Theodore R. Rix, Special Assistant County Attorney, submitting highway easement in re County Road No. 6 was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Contract and contract bond from Japs-Olson Company for furnishing Index Sheets for the office of the Register of Deeds were presented and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from O. A. Pearson, Purchasing Agent, requesting payment of various claims from the County Reserve Building and Maintenance Fund was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A petition signed by Mr. and Mrs. L. J. Endresen requesting that the County clean out Emerald Lake and its channels from algae and floating bog was presented and referred to Commissioner Ainsworth and the Engineer.

A letter from Byron W. McCullagh, Attorney for the Village of Crystal, requesting either an assignment or a quit claim deed from the County covering its interest in certain property originally acquired for the Beltline Highway, was read and referred to the Attorney for the Board and the Engineer.

Mr. Berg appeared before the Board requesting the purchase of the balance of the County Home property. The matter was referred to the Attorney for the Board.

William Cain, Chairman of the Township Board of Corcoran, appeared before the Board requesting financial assistance for improving township roads. The matter was referred to the Engineer and the Road and Lake Committee.

fork of the Crow River into Lake Minnetonka in connection with the proposed improvements for flood control as approved by the District and Division Engineers of the Army, was read.
