Tuesday, September 28, 1954

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

Applications for license to sell non-intoxicating malt liquor were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, as follows:

- 1. Notifying the Board of the acceptance of the low bid of Black Top Service Company for grading and bituminous surfacing of a section of State Aid Road No. 3 and requesting that funds be set aside to pay for said contract.
- 2. Notifying the Board of the acceptance of the low bid of the Robert Ferris Company for construction of a storm sewer on State Aid Road No. 61 and requesting that funds be set aside to pay for said contract.
- 3. Requesting the transfer of funds to cover an overrun in the Anderson Aggregates Company contract for "Buckshot" for seal coat.

 The above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from L. P. Zimmerman, County Engineer, as follows:

- 1. Relative to the request of R.S. Lanier for the improvement of Noerenberg Channel, Lake Minnetonka. Referred to the Road and Lake Committee.
- 2. Submitting the application of C. L. Sorensen for a permit to dredge in front of the small dock, West Arm, Lake Minnetonka.
 Ordered placed on file.

A letter from F. G. Gunlaugson, Director, Bureau of Health
Maintenance for the City of Minneapolis, requesting the commitment of
a patient to Glen Lake Sanatorium was read and referred to the Committee
on Ways and Means.

A contract and contract bond from the Robert Ferris Company for the construction of a storm sewer were received and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A copy of a letter from Rollin B. Child, Clerk, Board of Education for School District No. 225, requesting that before action is taken by the County Board attaching School District No. 138 to School District No. 225, School District No. 138 vote to become liable for its proportionate share of three million dollars, the cost of the new senior high school now under construction at Hopkins. The letter was ordered held until the matter of the attachment of School District No. 138 comes before the Board.

A letter from M. W. Howell congratulating the County Board on its plan for diversion of the South fork of the Crow River into Lake Minnetonka, and suggesting that the water diverted from the Crow River

be first channelled into Lake Langdon, was read, ordered placed on file and the Clerk to the Board was requested to acknowledge receipt of the letter.

The Reverend Mr. William J. Nolan of Long Lake addressed the Board requesting the improvement of County Road No. 87 from Highway No. 12 to the bridge, approximately one thousand feet.

Commissioner Christensen moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott to refer the matter to the County Engineer with authority to act if there are funds available in this year's budget and weather permitting.

Motion unanimously carried.

A letter from Charles S. Bellows, as Attorney for the Village of Long Lake, requesting that he be notified if a petition for the incorporation of the Village of Orono is presented to the Board. The Clerk to the Board was requested to notify Mr. Bellows if and when such a petition is filed.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisement for bids, O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, proceeded to open bids for the wrecking of the buildings on the proposed detention home site. The bids were referred to Mr. Pearson for a report back to the Board at its next meeting.

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

Letters were received from Frank D. Bessesen, Court Commissioner, as follows:

- 1. Requesting payment of a claim for expense incurred by Ramsey County for examination of a mentally ill Hennepin County resident.
- 2. Requesting payment of the commitment charges for a Hennepin County resident incurred by Washington County.

The above letters were referred to the Attorney for the Board.

A letter from O'Neil J. Grathwol, Attorney, submitting a petition for the incorporation of the Village of Orono was read and referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

A letter from Charles Bellows, Attorney for the Village of Long Lake, submitting a copy of resolution adopted by the Long Lake Village Council October 11, 1954, annexing a portion of the Town of Orono was read and ordered placed on file.

A letter from E. J. Shannon, Assistant County Attorney, submitting a report of the awards of damages for the taking of land for the detention home and requesting the appropriation of funds to pay for the awards and expenses in connection therewith was read.

Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Christensen that Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, be directed to set aside the sum of \$56,368.58 from the County Reserve Building and Maintenance Fund for payment of said awards and expenses to date in connection with the condemnation of lands for the juvenile detention home site.

A letter from L. P. Zimmerman, County Engineer, notifying the Board of the completion of the resurfacing of Nicollet Avenue from Franklin to 38th Street and recommending that the unexpended funds in said contract be transferred back to the Road and Bridge Fund was read and referred to the Chairman of the Board.

Max Becker appeared before the Board relative to a tag he received from the State Highway Department for overloading his gravel truck and for spilling gravel on highways. The matter was referred to L.P. Zimmerman, County Engineer.

Commissioner Scott moved, seconded by Commissioner Ainsworth that the County Engineer and the Chairman of the Road and Lake Committee

be authorized to dispose of excess and obsolete snow fences to the various townships.

MacMillan in the amount of \$1592.50 had been accepted.

Christensen that Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, be directed to set aside the sum of \$1592.50 from the Road Construction Fund to the Gilbert H. MacMillan contract for preparing plans and drawings for the construction of said bridge on S.A.R. No. 61 over the M. & St. L. R.R. Co.
