The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten
o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A monthly report received from George G. Roadfeldt, County Extension Agent, was ordered placed on file.

A budget report for the Hennepin County Highway Department received from O. A. Pearson, Budget Director, was ordered placed on file.

A letter from George N. Stillman offering to purchase a portion of the remainder of the County Home property consisting of approximately 19.6 acres for the sum of \$2000.00 per acre, was read and referred to the Board.

A letter from Thorpe Bros. Inc. offering to purchase the balance of the County Home property consisting of approximately 41 acres for the sum of \$75,000.00 was read and ordered placed on file.

A letter from L. P. Zimmerman, County Engineer, submitting an agreement between the City of Minneapolis and the County of Hennepin for the improvement of a portion of S.A.R. No. 52 by repaying the

street car track area on Nicollet Avenue from Grant Street to Franklin Avenue, was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from R. E. Jacobson, Chairman, School District No. 138 (hearing on the dissolution of said School District No. 138 will be before the Board on December 16, 1954) submitting a petition for the attachment of the property in School District No. 138 situated in the Village of St. Louis Park to Independent School District St. Louis Park, was read and referred to the Committee of the Whole.

A letter from John K. Harvey, Assistant County Attorney, relative to a report on the injuries sustained by Carroll G. Patton, Torrens Title Examiner for Hennepin County, was read and referred to the County Board.

A letter from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, requesting the transfer of funds from the Sheriff-Jail fund to the M-B Coffee Company contract to cover an overrun in said contract, was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Specifications received from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, for rental of two vehicles for the Hennepin County Surveyor's office for the year 1955 were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Howard Moore, Secretary and Attorney for the Board of Park Commissioners, requesting that Hugo G. Erickson, City Engineer, be appointed in place of Edward Braddock in connection with the proceedings for the improvement of County Ditch No. 13 was read and referred to Commissioner Scott.

A letter from the Glen Lake Sanatorium Commission requesting information as to whether additional revenue would be available for 1955 in the event the 4.75 mills levied bring in more than the budget figures approved by the County Board for the Glen Lake Sanatorium was read and referred to the Attorney for the Board.

Tuesday, December 14, 1954

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

Members present: Commissioners Ainsworth, Christensen, Scott, and Chairman Matthews.

Member absent: Commissioner Hanson.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

Reports for the months of August, September, October, and November, received from Frank E. Adams, Veterans Service Officer, were ordered placed on file.

A report for the month of November received from George G. Roadfeldt, County Extension Agent, was ordered placed on file.

A letter from Geo. A. Totten, Jr., County Treasurer, requesting approval of additional collateral to guarantee County funds on deposit with Marquette National Bank was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A notice from the Minnesota Safety Council of the annual meeting to be held on Tuesday, January 4, 1955, at 12:15 noon in Hotel St. Paul was presented and the board members were asked to take note of the date.

Letters were received from L. P. Zimmerman, County Engineer, as follows:

- 1. Submitting an agreement between the County of Hennepin and the City of Minneapolis for the improvement of Nicollet Avenue from 38th Street to 57th Street. Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.
- 2. Recommending approval of various completed street improvement projects within the City of Minneapolis and requesting the transfer of the unexpended balances remaining in said contracts to the Road and Bridge Fund. Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from the Health Department, City of Minneapolis, requesting the commitment of a patient to Glen Lake Sanatorium was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

R. W. Aretz of the Lions Club of Waconia appeared before the Board and submitted a copy of a resolution adopted by the County Board of Carver County authorizing the erection of signs at the inter-

sections of Carver County highways and State Trunk Highways directing traffic from the trunk highways to Carver County municipalities and requested that the Lions Club of Waconia be authorized to erect similar signs on the right-of-way of County Road No. 148 south of Highway No. 7 at St. Bonifacius.
