The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

Members present: Commissioners Ainsworth, Christensen, and Chairman Matthews.

Members absent: Commissioners Hanson and Scott.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

At ten o'clock A.M., the hearing, continued from October 21, 1954, was called for on the dissolution and attachment of Westview School District No. 138.

A letter was read from the Hennepin County School Survey
Committee recommending that that portion of Westview School District
located south of Highway No. 12 and east of Highway No. 18 be annexed
to the St. Louis Park School District No. 205, the remainder of the
district to be annexed to Wayzata School District No. 144.

A letter was read from Viola S. Thompson, Superintendent of Schools for Hennepin County, recommending that the petition for dissolution of School District No. 138 be denied, and if not denied, that said district be annexed to Wayzata School District No. 144 except that portion of the district which is located in the Village of St.

Louis Park which should be annexed to the St. Louis Park School District No. 205.

Frank N. Whitney, Attorney for Hopkins School District No. 225, and Mr. O. J. Parks appeared before the Board opposing the attachment of Westview School District to Hopkins School District.

John R. Clift, and Byron W. McCullagh, Attorney for Westview School District, addressed the Board urging the attachment of the district to Hopkins School District No. 225.

Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Christensen that the hearing be continued to Thursday, April 21, 1955, at 10:00 o'clock A.M., and that the matter be referred back to the School Survey Committee for further study and recommendation.

Motion unanimously carried.

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A monthly report from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, was ordered placed on file.

A budget report of the Hennepin County Highway Department, received from O. A. Pearson, Budget Director, was ordered placed on file.

O. A. Pearson, County Purchasing Agent, presented specifications for the following:

One 1-ton panel truck for the surveying crews and one 1-ton pickup truck for the Highway Department. Referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

Workmen's Compensation Insurance, diesel fuel oil and heating fuel oil, coffee, bakery goods, and milk for the County Jail, one 8-passenger sedan for the Sheriff, gasoline and oil for the Sheriff's office, farm feed for the Home School for Boys, and for publishing the official proceedings for the year 1955, the financial statement for 1954, the delinquent tax list for 1953, the proceedings outside

the County seat, and the financial statement outside the County seat.

All of the above specifications were referred to the Committee on Ways
and Means.

Letters were received from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, as follows:

- 1. Requesting payment of claims from the County Reserve Building and Maintenance Fund.
- 2. Requesting the transfer of funds from the Road Construction Fund to cover an overrun in the Carl H. Peterson Company contract for grading State Aid or County Road No. 156.
- 3. Notifying the Board of the acceptance of the low bid of the Kenneth D. Hacking Company for furnishing surety bonds for officials and employees of Hennepin County.
- 4. Requesting authorization for the purchase of essential supplies for the Coroner's office, the Home School for Boys, and the County Jail.
- 5. Requesting the cancellation of various balances in various contracts.

All of the above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, as follows:

- 1. Requesting authorization to cancel outstanding warrants.
- 2. Requesting the transfer of funds from the Emergency Fund to the Home School for Boys Fund, the Surveyor's Fund, the District Court Fund, the Examiner of Titles Fund, the Sheriff's Fund, the

the Sheriff-Jail Fund, the Coroner's Fund, and the Mental Examinations Fund.

The above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from G. Howard Spaeth, Commissioner of Taxation, returning the applications for reduction in the assessed valuation of property owned by Fulton Bag and Cotton Mills, Totten P. Heffelfinger, and Richard H. Pashina, because they are not properly before the Commissioner, was read. The applications were referred to Roy Haeg, Supervisor of Assessments for a report to be made to the County Board at its next meeting.

Letters were received from the Department of Health, City of Minneapolis, requesting the commitment of two patients to Glen Lake Sanatorium, and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Commissioner Matthews moved, seconded by Commissioner Ainsworth to wish all the County officials, employees, and citizens of Hennepin County a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

Motion unanimously carried.

At. 10:15 O'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisements for bids, O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, proceeded to open bids for rock salt and road tar for the Highway Department for the year 1955. The bids were referred to the Budget and Purchasing Agent for a tabulation and report to be made at the next Board meeting.

At 10:20 o'clock A.M., hearing was called for on the offer of George N. Stillman to purchase a portion of the County Home property containing approximately 19.6 acres for the sum of \$2000.00

per acre. A letter was read from Steiner & Koppelman, Inc. submitting a plat of the proposed development of the remainder of the Hennepin County Poor Farm property and recommending an over-all development of the area. It was agreed that the bidding would be on a per acre basis.

Desmond Pratt, Attorney, representing the Minneapolis Terminal Warehouse Company, accompanied by an officer of the company, stated that he had with him a certified check for \$5000.00 as evidence of good faith, and bid \$2100.00 per acre.
