The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten
o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

The meeting was called to order by Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, and there were present:

Commissioner Richard O. Hanson . . . First District

Commissioner Jens Christensen . . . Third District

Commissioner I. G. Scott Fourth District

Commissioner S. E. Ainsworth Fifth District

George W. Matthews, Commissioner from the Second District, was absent.

The Board proceeded to vote by secret ballot for the selection of a chairman for the ensuing year. Mr. Fitzsimmons named as tellers Commissioners Christensen and Hanson.

On the first ballot, Commissioner Hanson received two votes and Commissioner Scott received two votes.

On the second ballot, Commissioner Hanson received two votes and Commissioner Scott received two votes.

On the third ballot, Commissioner Ainsworth received two votes and Commissioner Scott received two votes.

On the fourth ballot, Commissioner Ainsworth received one vote, Commissioner Hanson received two votes, and Commissioner Scott received one vote.

On the fifth ballot, Commissioner Ainsworth received three votes and Commissioner Scott received one vote.

Mr. Fitzsimmons then declared Commissioner Ainsworth elected chairman of the County Board for the ensuing year.

The Board then proceeded to ballot for the selection of a vicechairman for the ensuing year.

On the first ballot, Commissioner Christensen received one vote, Commissioner Hanson received one vote, and Commissioner Scott received one vote, one ballot being blank.

On the second ballot, Commissioner Christensen received one vote, Commissioner Hanson received one vote, and Commissioner Scott received one vote, one ballot being blank.

A letter from the Village of St. Louis Park relative to the dredging of an area in Block 5, Brookside 2nd Addition was read and referred to L. P. Zimmerman, County Engineer.

Letters from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, notifying the Board of the acceptance of various low bids and requesting that the County Auditor be directed to set aside funds to pay for said contracts, were read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, recommending acceptance of various bids and requesting that the County Auditor be directed to set aside funds to pay for said contracts were read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,

o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by S.E. Ainsworth, Chairman.

Commissioner Matthews moved, seconded by Commissioner
Christensen to proceed to elect a vice-chairman of the County Board
by secret ballot.

Chairman Ainsworth designated Commissioners Christensen and Matthews to act as tellers.

Commissioner Hanson received three votes, two ballots being blank.

Chairman Ainsworth announced the election of Commissioner
Hanson as vice-chairman of the County Board.

Commissioner Ainsworth resigned as chairman of the County Board.

Vice-Chairman Hanson took the Chair.

Commissioner Matthews moved, seconded by Vice-Chairman Hanson that the resignation be accepted.

Christensen nay, Matthews yea, Scott nay, Vice-Chairman Hanson yea.

A letter from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, recommending acceptance of bids for furnishing gasoline and oil for the Sheriff's office was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Specifications received from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, for furnishing photographic paper and certificates of title and memorial sheets were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Hugo G. Erickson, City Engineer, thanking the Board, the County Engineer, and affected departments for the fine co-operation he received during the past year in completing paving projects in the City of Minneapolis was read and ordered placed on file.

Letters were received from L. P. Zimmerman, County Engineer, as follows:

1. Submitting annual resolutions required to carry out the work of the County Highway Department.

- 2. Relative to the release of slope permit across the property of P. B.Olson on State Aid Road No. 6.
- 3. Relative to the transfer of trunk highway routes to local units of government.

The above letters were referred to the Committee on Roads and Lakes.

4. Recommending salary rates for classifications not included in the agreement entered into between the County and the International Union of Operating Engineers, Local No. 49, and further recommending the establishment of a definite retirement age for employees of the County Highway Department.

Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Hanson to concur in the recommendation of the engineer on the salary rates and that the matter of the retirement age for highway employees be referred to the Road and Lake Committee to be considered at the Committee Meeting on Thursday, January 13, 1955, at ten o'clock A.M.
