Tuesday, February 8, 1955

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

Members present: Commissioners Christensen, Hanson, Scott, and Chairman Matthews.

Member absent: Commissioner Ainsworth.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A statement of balances in the County Revenue Allowances as of January 31, 1955, received from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, was ordered published with the proceedings of the Board and placed on file.

A monthly report from George G. Roadfeldt, County Extension Agent, was ordered placed on file.

A letter from Paul W. Keve, Assistant Chief Probation Officer, requesting authorization for an allowance to defray the cost of automobile parking charges for probation officers was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from L. P. Zimmerman, County Engineer, relative to traffic control on County highways was read and referred to the Road and Lake Committee. A letter from Nathan A. Cobb, Attorney for Oberg Boat and Supply Company, requesting release of an easement held by the County of Hennepin for well purposes, was read and referred to the next Board meeting for a proper resolution granting the release.

A copy of a letter from M. J. Hoffmann, State Commissioner of Highways, addressed to the Honorable Edward J. Thye, relative to the 75-25 matching proposal for County-FAS funds was read and referred to the County Engineer.

Contracts and contract bonds were received as follows:

- 1. From Post Publishing Company for publishing the proceedings of the County Board for the year 1955.
- 2. From Post Publishing Company for publishing the Financial Statement of the County of Hennepin for the year 1954.
- 3. From Ford Deep Rock Oil Company for furnishing fuel oil to Hennepin County during the year 1955.
- 4. From Cutler-Magner Company for furnishing rock salt to the Highway Department.

The above contracts and bonds were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, notifying the Board of the acceptance of the low bids for furnishing two diesel motor graders, binders with canvas jackets, and photostat paper and requesting that the County Auditor be directed to set aside funds to pay said awards were read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means. A letter from John K. Harvey, Assistant County Attorney, relative to the disposition of a County-owned truck, was read and referred to Rodney S. Wallace, the Attorney for the County Board, and O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent.

Specifications were received from O. A. Pearson, County Purchasing Agent, as follows:

- 1. For one 14 cubic yard hydraulic front end loader mounted on crawler type tractor.
  - 2. For aluminum sign blanks.
  - 3. For "Scotchlite" materials.

The above specifications were referred to the Committee on Roads and Lakes.

George Hedlund, Attorney, appeared before the Board representing Elmer Anderson, applicant for a license to sell non-intoxicating malt liquor on the premises formerly occupied by Clinton Aeshliman, whose license was revoked by the County Board on February 1st because of the sale of 3.2 beer to a minor.

Commissioner Scott moved, seconded by Commissioner Hanson that on and off sale licenses for sale of non-intoxicating malt liquor, expiring on June 30, 1955, be granted to Elmer Anderson, Town of Corcoran, with a proviso that Clinton Aeshliman, former proprietor, be prohibited from tending bar on the premises.

Mr. Rodney Wallace appeared before the Board in regard to the exchange of the Sheriff's Rescue Squad truck. The matter was referred to the Attorney for the Board.

A letter from Howard W. Perkins, County Surveyor, requesting authorization for Elmer J. Peterson, Chief Deputy Surveyor, to attend the annual Congress of Mapping and Surveying to be held in Washington, D.C. was read.

Commissioner Scott moved, seconded by Commissioner Hanson, that Elmer J. Peterson, Chief Deputy Burveyor, be authorized to attend the annual Congress of Mapping and Surveying to be held in Washington, D.C. from March 7 through 11, 1955; and

That his expenses incurred by such attendance be paid from the County Surveyor's appropriation upon presentation of a properly verified claim.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisements for bids, O. A. The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

Members present: Commissioners Christensen, Hanson, Scott, and Chairman Matthews.

A letter from the City of Hopkins requesting a strip of County-owned land for opening 16th Avenue South from 5th Street South to 2nd Street South, was read and referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings, and the County Engineer.

A letter from Roy Haeg, Supervisor of Assessments, requesting the employment of Ralph Moorhead on a temporary basis was referred to the Committee on Taxes. A letter was read from Theodore R. Rix, Special Assistant County Attorney, relative todamages to County Road No. 78 caused by the moving of a house by Peterson House Moving Company.

Commissioner Scott moved, seconded by Commissioner Christensen that the offer of Peterson House Moving Company in the amount of \$909.48 be accepted in payment of damages to County Road No. 78.

Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, March 1, 1955

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, March 15, 1955

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A monthly report received from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, was ordered placed on file.

A letter from Joseph Hlavac, Robbinsdale, Minnesota, submitting a claim for damages to his tire caused by hitting a hole in a county aid road (Nicollet Avenue) was read and referred to the Attorney for the Board.

A letter from Geo. A. Totten, Jr., County Treasurer, requesting Board approval of the use of facsimile signatures on County warrant-checks and the insuring of the depositor against loss through the unauthorized use of such facsimile signatures was read and referred to the Attorney for the Board.

A letter from Elmer H. Larson, Land Commissioner, submitting the application of Lucille H. Anderson to repurchase certain tax forfeited land was read and referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

A petition signed by W.R.Stephens, Jr., asking that his land be set off from School District No. 225 to School District No. 17 was presented and referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

Letters were received from John K. Harvey, Assistant County Attorney, as follows:

- 1. Submitting an order from the Railroad and Warehouse Commission requesting the Minneapolis, St.Paul, and Sault Ste. Marie Railway Company to install two 4-bulb fluorescent luminaires, one on either side of the crossing at Douglas Drive and the railroad tracks in the Village of Crystal. Ordered placed on file.
- 2. Relative to the application of Edwin F. Robb, Jr. for an abatement of his real property taxes.

Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott that the application be approved and included in the Tax Committee report with the regular list of approved tax applications.

Motion unanimously carried.

A plat of Starring Lake First Addition located in the Town of Eden Prairie was received and referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

A contract and contract bond from Minneapolis Standard Garage,
Inc. for furnishing gas and oil for the vehicles of the Sheriff's
office during the year 1955, were referred to the Committee on Ways
and Means.

A letter from F. G. Gunlaugson, Director, Bureau of Health Maintenance for the City of Minneapolis, requesting the commitment of a patient to Glen Lake Sanatorium, was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Harlan B.Strong, Attorney, requesting that the County Board abandon, release, and discharge the water main easement on a portion of the County Home property was read and referred to the Attorney for the Board.

A letter from Joseph W.Zalusky, Executive Secretary of the Hennepin County Historical Society, submitting copy of a letter from Lew C. Church, Attorney, addressed to Leslie W. Myers, relative to the acquisition by the Historical Society of legal title to the premises which it now occupies, was read.

Commissioner Hanson moved, seconded by Commissioner Ainsworth that the Board oppose the conveyance of the property to the Historical Society and that the Hennepin County Senate and House Delegations be notified of the opposition of the County Board to an amendment of the present law which would authorize such a conveyance for a nominal sum or without consideration.

The matter of a port upstream from the Minneapolis, Northfield and Southern Railroad bridge at Savage was discussed by the Board and it was moved, seconded, and unanimously carried that the Chairman of the Road and Lake Committee, the Engineer, and the Attorney for the Board meet with the Scott County officials to discuss the equitable sharing of the cost involved by the opening of the bridge and the congestion of traffic at the intersection of State Aid Roads No. 134 and No. 55.

Commissioner Ainsworth called the Board's attention to an unsightly dump known as the Brooks' Dump, located on old Trunk Highway No. 7 in the Township of Excelsior ( $SW_{4}^{1}$  of  $SE_{4}^{1}$  Sec. 31-117-23), and moved that the State Health Department be requested to investigate the

unhealthful conditions of the dump.

WHEREAS, It is believed that certain assurances can well be written into the proposed Constitutional Amendment that would remove any doubt as to the adoption of an equitable formula;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That the Board of County Commissioners of Hennepin County urges that the proposed amendment include specific assurances that an adequate proportion of the monies alloted to the Counties from the Road User Funds received from Motor Vehicle License Fees and Gasoline Taxes be assured by requiring that any formula for distribution of the funds be made on the basis of the proportion of the total population of a County containing a City of the first class to the total population of the State:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That we do hereby respectfully request our State Senators and Representatives to favorably support amendments to the proposed legislation that will assure Counties containing Cities of the first class an equitable share in the proposed distribution of Road User Funds.
