Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, March 22, 1955

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten
o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A letter from Gordon M. Fay, Winona County Highway Engineer, submitting a copy of resolution asking that the Minnesota Statutes be amended so as to prevent the Road and Bridge Fund from being hit by unnecessary bridge work within the county, by cities, villages, and burroughs of the third and fourth classes, was read and referred to L. P. Zimmerman, County Engineer.

Letters were read from Kenneth F. McNulty, Appraiser in the Tax Foffeited Land Department, submitting an appraisal on property of a former Old Age Assistance recipient, now deceased, and from John K. Harvey, Assistant County Attorney, submitting a form of resolution for the sale of said property. Both letters were referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

A letter from a committee consisting of representatives of the Board of Directors, Mortgage Bankers Association, Savings and Loan

Leagues, the Real Property Section of the Hennepin County Bar Association, and the Minneapolis Home Builders Association, organized for the purpose of considering methods for removing the backlog of cases in the Registrar of Titles Office and submitting a report of the conclusions reached, was read and referred to the Attorney for the Board.

A letter from the Minneapolis Central Labor Union relative to salaries paid teachers at the Glen Lake Sanatorium and copy of letter from George W. Matthews, Chairman, Board of County Commissioners, to the Central Labor Union, notifying the Union that the matter should be taken up with the Glen Lake Sanatorium Commission were read and ordered placed on file.

A letter from Edward V. Doyle, Chairman of the Boardof County, Commissioners for Waseca County, enclosing pamphlet relative to the expanding of the Southern School of Agriculture at Waseca, was read and referred to the County Engineer.

A contract and contract bond from Bryan Rock Products, Inc. for furnishing crushed rock to the County during the year 1955 were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Specifications were received from O. A. Pearson, Purchasing Agent, for the following:

- Bituminous materials medium curing cut-back asphalt,
   Grades 0,1,2,3, or 4.
  - 2. Bituminous materials Asphalt Emulsion Type RS 2.
- 3. Overhauling, painting, placing, removing and storing spar buoys and bay name signs, Lake Minnetonka.

The above specifications were referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

A letter from John K. Harvey, Assistant County Attorney, submitting a form of resolution disclaiming any county interest in an easement over County-owned property (the former County Home property), was read and referred to the Chairman of the County Board.

A letter from the State Department of Agriculture, Dairy and Food, relative to the hiring of a county weed and seed inspector, and submitting copy of the Attorney General's opinion relative thereto, was read and ordered placed on file.

A Summons and Complaint in the matter of Wallace T.Bruce, Inc. vs. Egan, Field & Novak, the Village of St. Louis Park, and the County of Hennepin, relative to the platting of land into an addition called Westdale, were presented and referred to the Attorney for the Board.

The Hennepin County Historical Society, represented by Lew Church, Attorney, Mr. Haynes, President, Mr. Myers, Vice-President, and Joseph W. Zalusky, Executive Secretary, submitted an amended bill for transferring the premises now occupied by it to the Historical Society for a nominal consideration.

Commissioner Scott moved, seconded by Commissioner Hanson that the bill, as amended, be approved in principle.

After further discussion, Commissioner Scott moved, seconded by Commissioner Christensen, to refer the matter to the Attorney for the Board.

Motion unanimously carried.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published notices, O. A. Pearson, Budget and  $P_{\rm u}$ rchasing Agent, proceeded to open bids for the following:

- 1. Four 2-door sedans for the Sheriff.
- 2. Portable culvert material corrugated metal.
- 3. Portable culvert material secXtional concrete.

  All of the above bids were referred to Mr. Pearson for a report to be made at the next Board meeting.

MHEREAS, The County of Hennepin by warranty deed dated May 13, 1953, conveyed to the Minneapolis-Honeywell Regulator Company certain real property described therein, recorded in Book 1959 of Deeds, page 380, together with Water Main easement described as:

"WATER MAIN -- Beginning at the Northwest corner of Block 2, PARK VALLEY, according to the recorded plat thereof, thence North along the East line of 6th Avenue as laid out in the recorded plat of WEST MIN-NEAPOLIS, a distance of 853.8 feet to the actual point of beginning of the water line to be described, thence deflecting to the right 131 degrees 30 minutes a distance of 88.4 feet; thence deflecting to the right 20 degrees 39 minutes a distance of 253.2 feet, thence deflecting to the left 8 degrees 54 minutes a distance of 372.0 feet, thence deflecting to the right 1 degree 25 minutes a distance of 179.1 feet, thence deflecting to the right 13 degrees 11 minutes a distance of 66.4 feet, thence deflecting to theleft 15 degrees 29 minutes a distance of 47.0 feet, thence deflecting to the right 9 degrees 58 minutes a distance of 92.1 feet, thence deflecting to the left 4 degrees 51 minutes a distance of 68.5 feet, thence deflecting to the left 14 degrees 17 minutes a distance of 130.7 feet, thence deflecting to the left 4 degrees 37 minutes a distance of 65.7 feet, thence deflecting to the right 3 degrees 19 minutes a distance of 157.1 feet, thence deflecting to the left O degrees 47 minutes to the West boundary line of the tract of land herein conveyed to the party of the second part."

which Water Main served the property conveyed in said deed; and in addition thereto, reserved to the County of Hennepin, its successors and assigns, the right to relocate mid Water Main, or any portion thereof, at the County's expense, and to repair the same and pany portion thereof without interference with the easement granted in said deed to Minneapolis-Honeywell Regulator Company to the extent that said Water Main was owned by the County of Mennepin; and

WHEREAS, the Minneapolis-Honeywell Regulator Company, by release dated March 7, 1955, recorded March 12, 1955, in the office of the Register of Deeds in and for Hennepin County, being Document No. 2930659, has discharged, abandoned and disclaimed any right, title or interest in and to that certain easement for Water Main and for the relocation and repair of such Water Main as described above.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED That this Board disclaims any right, easement or reservation to or in any lands now owned by or formerly conveyed by the County of Hennepin to which the above described Water Main easement applied.
