Tuesday, August 16, 1955

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A monthly report from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, was presented and ordered placed on file.

The Board of Audit report was presented, ordered published with the proceedings of the Board and ordered placed on file.

Applications for license to sell non-intoxicating malt liquor were presented and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

The order of the District Court, clarifying positions and salaries of employees at the Home School for Boys, was presented and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A petition signed by Robert N. Odden and eight others, protesting the proposed transfer of their property from the Hopkins School District to the Edina School District, was read and referred to the Board meeting of September 12th when the petition of W. R. Stevens, Jr. comes for hearing before the Board. 13th

A letter from the Department of State Conservation, inquiring about the status of County Ditch No. 40, was read and referred to the Engineer and the Attorney.

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A letter from E. H. Larson, Land Commissioner, submitting application from the City of St. Louis Park for transfer of tax forfeited property to be used for drainage purposes, was read and referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

A letter from the Hennepin Council of the League of Women Voters, relative to adequate housing of county operations, was read and referred to the Chairman of the Board.

Letters were received from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, as follows:

1. Requesting the transfer of funds from the Emergency Fund to the Budget and Purchasing Agents Appropriation to pay for temporary help, ordered placed on file.

2. Notifying the Board of the acceptance of the low bid of Arnell Business Forms for tax statements for the County Treasurer and requesting that the County Auditor be directed to set aside funds to pay for said award, referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

3. Requesting the transfer of funds from the County Reserve Building and Maintenance Fund to the S. E. Smiley contract for architectural service at the Home School for Boys, referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from L. P. Pedersen, Acting County Engineer, as follows:

1. Submitting agency contract for improving State Aid Road No. 15, referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

2. Submitting plans and specifications for improving State Aid Road No. 9 and agreement for division of cost between the Village of Medina and the County, referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

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3. Relative to the transfer of county property to the Hopkins Area Little League, Inc.; Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Christensen, that the Attorney for the Board be directed to draw up the necessary papers so that the property can be used by the League.

Motion unanimously carried.

A letter from the Town of Independence, requesting financial assistance for improving township roads, was read and referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

Judge Tom Tallakson, Paul Keve, Director of Court Services, and W. W. Douglas, Superintendent of the Home School for Boys, appeared before the Board urging the reinstatement of various employees at the Home School for Boys that had been deleted from the budget for the year 1956.

Mr. Keve recommended the reinstatement of three boys supervisors at \$3,840.00 per annum each, two matrons at \$2,760.00 per annum each, and recommended the deletion of the psychiatrist at \$2,600.00 per annum.

Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott, to reconsider the Home School for Boys Budget.

Voting on the motion: Ainsworth yea, Christensen yea, Hanson yea, Scott yea, Chairman Matthews yea.

Motion carried.

The Board proceeded to consider the Home School for Boys Budget. Parker Nolan and Ted Gardner addressed the Board urging the reinstatement of the positions deleted and asked for an increase in the pay scale of employees at the home.

Commissioner Hanson moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott, that

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the sum of \$14,440.00 be added to the salary appropriation of the Home School for Boys Budget for the year 1956 and that Judge Tallakson, Mr. Keve and Mr. Douglas support the Chairman of the County Board before the Tax Levy Board for approval of the additional amount in the the County tax rate.

Voting on the motion: Ainsworth yea, Christensen yea, Hanson yea, Scott yea, Chairman Matthews yea.

Motion carried.

Letters were received from the following subdivisions relative to claims for refund of aid to the poor paid in excess of one mill:

1. Village of Richfield submitting statement of valuations and amount of relief expenditures.
2. Village of Deephaven urging the Board to resist payment of any and all claims.
3. Village of Edina notifying the Board that their relief expenditures are under the one mill rate and consequently have no basis for making a claim.
4. City of Hopkins notifying the Board that their relief expenditures would not exceed one mill of assessed valuation.
5. Village of Crystal, dated June 22nd, 1955, submitting certified copy of village poor relief expenditures for the years 1952, 1953 and 1954 in the amount of \$6,614.79, and a second letter dated August 15th, 1955, withdrawing its claim for poor relief.
6. City of Minneapolis submitting statement of the expenditures for the years 1952, 1953 and 1954 for poor relief in the amount of \$10,002,231.94, and also a statement of the amount to be reimbursed on the basis of 75 per cent, excess expense over the one mill.

It was ordered that the above letters be acknowledged and placed on file.

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A letter from Theodore R. Rix, Assistant County Attorney, notifying the Board that a small building has been erected on county property, was read and Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Christensen, that Howard W. Perkins, County Surveyor, be requested to make a survey of the property.

Motion unanimously carried.

A copy of a letter from the Northern States Power Company to L.P. Pederson, relative to the use of fly ash-lime stabilization on County Highway No. 28 for experimental purposes was read and ordered placed on file.

A copy of a letter from Tom Chenoweth, City Manager, City of St. Louis Park, approving the awarding of the bid for paving a portion of Excelsior Boulevard to the Woodrich Construction Company was read and ordered placed on file.

A letter from Erik Arnold Norman requesting information as to what procedure to follow for reimbursement of damages caused by the falling of a tree on his property, was read and referred to the Engineer and the Attorney.

Joseph Preisen appeared before the Board relative to drainage problems in Hanson's Belt Line Addition on Xenia Avenue North, between 36th and 38th Streets. The matter was referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

Bert Bourgeois, Bernard Lenz, George Amazi, Leo Dischinger and James McCann appeared before the Board opposing the return of County Road No. 144 to the local subdivision. The matter was referred to the Road and Lake Committee and the Engineer.

Commissioner Scott brought up the matter of paying employees for their vacation while also collecting regular pay for the same period. The matter was referred to the Attorney for the Board.

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A monthly report from George G. Roadfeldt, County Extension Agent, was ordered placed on file.

A petition asking for the deepening and widening of County Ditch No. 13 (Shingle Creek) signed by the Village of Brooklyn Center and four other individuals and corporations was presented and referred to the Attorney for the Board and the County Engineer.

A petition signed by Burton J. Lindahl and 25 others requesting the incorporation of an area to be known as the Village of Holdridge was presented and referred to the Attorney for the Board.

A letter from Kenneth Turnham applying for the position of Hennepin County Weed and Seed Inspector was read and ordered acknowledged and placed on file.

A letter from Lee Kuluvar of the State Coordinating Office for Firearms Safety was read, requesting assistance from the County Board in the selection of deputy directors for each county to handle the work

of setting up training programs for adult instructors who in turn will train youths between the ages of 10 and 16 in safe gun handling practices.

Commissioner Christensen moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott, that the County Board concur in the request to cooperate in this work and that the letter be referred to Chairman Matthews for reply.

A copy of a City Council Ways and Means Committee report was read recommending approval of a 1956 tax levy program for the 18 funds under City Council jurisdiction, the aggregate rate of which shall not exceed 61.95 mills, which is the same as the 1955 rate and 5.9 mills lower than the rate in 1949.

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

Russell Connery, Assessor for the City of St. Louis Park, presented applications for abatement of assessments which had been returned to his office by the Supervisor of Assessments with a request that the properties in question be photographed and reappraised. After some discussion of the problems involved,

Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Christensen that the applications for abatement returned to Mr. Connery's office be referred to Roy Haeg, Supervisor of Assessments,

for his approval or denial.

The vote on the motion was as follows: Ainsworth yea, Christensen yea, Hanson yea, Scott yea, Chairman Matthews yea.

Motion carried.

A letter from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, submitting a contract between Hennepin County and the Village of Excelsior for radio communication service to the village fire department at Excelsior, and requesting its approval, was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from O.A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, notifying the Board of the acceptance of the low bid of H. J. Minar Company for furnishing a two-ton Ford truck to Hennepin County for the Home School for Boys, was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Chairman Matthews presented the matter of the revision of the 1956 County Budget for consideration. After some discussion,

Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Christensen that in order to fix the rate for County expenditures for 1956 at 10.94 mills, certain items in the Hennepin County Budget approved by this Board August 9, 1955, be reduced in the following amounts:

Detention Home - Salaries	\$ 8,000.00
Detention Home - Operation Expenses	5,000.00
Sheriff's Fund - Clothin	3,500.00
Lake Improvement Fund	17,500.00

Motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Ainsworth, seconded by Commissioner Christensen and unanimously carried that Mr. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, and Mr. Matthews, Chairman of the County Board, be publicly thanked and commended for the excellent job they have done in holding the line and working out the necessary revisions in the Hennepin County Budget.
