Tuesday, September 27, 1955

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten
o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

Members present: Commissioners Ainsworth, Christensen, Hanson and Scott.

Member absent: Chairman Matthews.

The meeting was called to order by S.E. Ainsworth, Vice-Chairman.

A monthly report received from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, was ordered placed on file.

Plans and specifications for autopsy tables for the Coroner's office and for the Sheriff's Pistol Range, received from O. A. Pearson, County Purchasing Agent, were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from the Township of Minnetonka requesting the installation of 40-mile speed limit signs on County Road No. 73 between County Road No. 16 and State Highway No. 12 was read and referred to the Road and Lake Committee and County Engineer.

A letter from Elmer H. Larson, Land Commissioner, requesting the transfer of certain tax forfeited land to the City of Minneapolis for alley purposes was read and referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

Letters from Douglas K. Amdahl, Assistant County Attorney, submitting highway easements for the improvement of County Road No. 15 were read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from John K. Harvey, Assistant County Attorney, notifying the Board that the petition for the incorporation of the Village of Holdridge should be returned to the persons interested because of defects was read, and it was moved, seconded and unanimously carried that the petition be returned as recommended.

Letters were received from L. P. Pederson, Acting County Engineer, as follows:

- 1. Notifying the Board of the opening of bids on October 25th for the grading of State Aid Road No. 15 West of Mound. Ordered placed on file.
- 2. Requesting approval for payment of one-quarter of the cost for installing two additional automatic signals on State Aid Road No. 3. Referred to the Attorney for the Board and the Engineer.
- 3. Submitting a new contract for electric energy for lake level pumping at Lake Minnetonka.

Commissioner Hanson moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott that the Engineer be authorized to hire necessary technical services to determine the condition of the wells before the contract is approved.

Motion unanimously carried.

A letter from the Health Department, City of Minneapolis, requesting the commitment of a patient to Glen Lake Sanatorium was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Mr. and Mrs. William Schmidt of Long Lake requesting a reviewal of the assessment of their property was read and referred to Roy Haeg, Supervisor of Assessments.

A letter from Eric G. Hoyer, Mayor, City of Minneapolis, inquiring about the payment of the claim submitted by the City of Minneapolis for expenditures made by the City for care of poor during the years 1952, 1953, and 1954 was read and referred to the Attorney for the Board and Edward R. Kienitz, Executive Secretary of the Welfare Board.

Letters received from Lawrence Jacobs, Kenneth Bollum, and
Phil Hamilton endorsing the appointment of Ira McKown for Hennepin
County Weed and Seed Inspector were read and ordered placed on file.

A letter from the Hopkins Chamber of Commerce requesting the construction of a bicycle path between Excelsior Boulevard and Shady Oak Beach at the time of the rebuilding of County Road No. 61 was read and referred to the County Engineer.

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten
o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

An agreement between the City of Minneapolis and the County of Hennepin for widening and resurfacing Portland Avenue from 3rd Street to East 31st Street was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from George M. Scott, County Attorney, as follows:

- 1. Reporting on the letter from Nick Seim relative to the use of his private road by Hennepin County for gravel hauling. The letter was ordered placed on file and a copy sent to Mr. Seim.
- 2. Submitting the petition of Winston Bros, Company for the improvement of a portion of County Ditch No. 13. Referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

Letters were received from L. P. Pederson, Acting County Engineer, as follows:

1. Submitting a report and recommendation on the proposed improvement of County roads within the Villages of Edina and Richfield at Southdale.

Commissioner Christensen moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott to concur in the recommendation of the Acting Engineer. Motion unanimously carried.

2. Reporting on the wells at Lake Minnetonka and recommending approval of the contract with Northern States Power Company for furnishing electrical energy for five pumps. Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from O. A. Pearson, Budget and $P_{\rm u}$ rchasing Agent, requesting the transfer of funds to cover an overrun in the M. G. Astleford Company contract for special aggregate buckshot, was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Independent School District No. 225 requesting flasher signals at the Chicago, Milwaukee and St. Paul and Minneapolis and St. Louis Railroad crossings at Monk Avenue was read and referred to the Engineer and the Road and Lake Committee.

A letter from the Village of New Hope relative to payment by the County of fifty per cent of the cost of installing street laterals, manholes, and catch basins on the Bass Lake Road was read and referred to the Engineer and the Road and Lake Committee.

Commissioner Christensen reported on the tax forfeited property in the City of Robbinsdale located on Highway No. 52 between 41st and 42nd Avenus North. Representatives from the City of Robbinsdale and Douglas Rees appeared before the Board explaining the developments that led up to the investigation concerning the use of the property. A resolution adopted by the City Council of the City of Robbinsdale

declaring its intention to use the property for public park purposes was read. The whole matter was referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

Commissioner Christensen offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, pursuant to Laws 1941, Chapter 511, as amended, the City of Robbinsdale, a governmental subdivison in Hennepin County, Minnesota, by application bearing the date September 5, 1945, applied to the Commissioner of Taxation for the conveyance of the following described tax-forfeited lands, to-wit:

Parcel No. 33283 - 1937: Commencing at the intersection of the South line of Lot nineteen (19) with the Southwesterly line of Lakeroad Avenue as deeded to the Village of Robbinsdale, August 11th, 1936, thence Northwesterly along said Street line to the Southeasterly line of 41st Avenue N. as deeded to the Village of Robbinsdale December 31st, 1936, thence Southwesterly along said Street line to the South line of Lot nineteen (19), thence East to beginning, Lot nineteen (19), Auditor's Subdivision Number 179, Hennepin County, Minnesota, City of Robbinsdale,

for use by it for park purposes; and

WHEREAS, this Board, by resolution adopted September 17, 1945, recommended that conveyance for such use be made; and

WHEREAS, on September 28, 1945, the Commissioner of Taxation executed and issued State Deed No. 54522 conveying the above described lands to said City of Robbinsdale, "to be used by it exclusively for public park purposes"; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said Chapter 511, as amended, the said City of Robbinsdale by applications bearing the date May 17, 1946 and May 22, 1946, applied to the Commissioner of Taxation for the conveyance of the following described tax-forfeited land, to-wit:

Commencing on the Southwesterly line of Lot 19 at a point 128 5/10 feet Southeasterly at right angles from the Northwesterly line thereof, thence Northeasterly parallel with the Northwesterly line thereof to the Southwesterly line of Lakeroad Avenue as deeded to the Village of Robbinsdale August 11, 1936, thence Southeasterly along said Street line to the Northwesterly line of 41st Avenue North as deeded to the Village of Robbinsdale December 31st, 1936, thence Southwesterly along said Street line to the Southwesterly along said Street line to the South line of Lot 19, thence West to the Southwest corner thereof, thence Northwesterly to beginning, Lot 19, Auditor's Subdivision Number 179, Hennepin County, Minnesota, City of Robbinsdale, and,

for use by it "to beautify said lakes and for park purposes": and

WHEREAS, this Board by resolution adopted May 27, 1946. recommended that said conveyance for such use be made; and

WHEREAS, on August 13, 1946, the Commissioner of Taxation executed and issued State Deed No. 66277 conveying the next above described real estate to said City of Robbinsdale, "to be used by it exclusively for park purposes and to beautify adjoining lakes"; and

WHEREAS, the lands described in said deeds contain approximately six (6) acres and that no part thereof has been devoted to the public use set out in said deeds, but on the contrary, approximately four (4) acres thereof have been constructed and blacktopped for a parking lot for the purpose of parking privately owned automobiles of the patrons of the adjoining privately owned and operated shopping center: and

WHEREAS, it has been made to appear to this Board that the governing body of said City of Robbinsdale will refuse to authorize a reconveyance of said lands.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED That the Commissioner of Taxation be, and he is hereby, requested to make his written declaration that the lands described in said deeds have reverted to the State of Minnesota and to serve a notice thereof upon the clerk of said City of Robbinsdale, and to otherwise proceed to perfect said reverter as provided by M.S. 1953, § 282.01. WHEREAS, A resolution was adopted on September 9, 1954, by the electors of Common School District No. 138 of Hennepin County, Minnesota, (commonly known as the Westview School District) petitioning this Board to take the necessary and appropriate action under the provisions of Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 122.28 to dissolve said school district; and

WHEREAS, This Board, pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 122.28 by resolution adopted at its meeting held on the 3rd day of May, 1955, dissolved said Common School District No. 138; and

WHEREAS, By resolution adopted at its meeting held on the 3rd day of May, 1955, this Board attached part of the territory comprising said dissolved district to Independent Consolidated School District No. 225 of Hennepin County (commonly known as the Hopkins School District) and the remainder to Independent School District No. 205 of Hennepin County (commonly known as the St. Louis Park School District; and

WHEREAS, After considering the nature and amount of the assets and obligations of said Common School District No. 138, and this Board being fully advised;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

- l. That the assessed valuation of the taxable real property within the territory which comprised Common School District No. 138 is \$628,195.00; that the assessed valuation of the taxable real property within that part of the territory of said School District No. 138 attached to said School District No. 225 is \$605,046.00; and that the assessed valuation of the taxable real property within that part of the territory of said Common School District No. 138 attached to said School District No. 205 is \$23,149.00.
- 2. That the assets of said dissolved School District No. 138 consist of school equipment and school supplies, including books, maps, desks, seats, tables, and chairs valued at \$7,250.00; real property and the school building and playgrounds and fixtures situated thereon, the same being reasonably worth and valued at \$252,700.00; funds in the hands of the school treasurer of said School District No. 138 totaling the sum of \$22.76; and in addition thereto, funds in the hands of the County Treasurer belonging to said dissolved school district totalling \$41,224.52.
- 3. That said dissolved school district has outstanding obligations, other than bonded indebtedness, totaling the sum of \$3,470.28,

which obligations include salaries for services rendered by employees.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT IT BE AND IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

1. That all the lands owned by Common School District No. 138, including the school buildings and the playground fixtures situated thereon, lying and being in the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, and described as follows, to-wit:
