The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,

A Statement of Balances in the County Revenue Allowances as of October 31, 1955, received from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, was ordered published with the proceedings of the Board and placed on file.

A monthly report received from Donald C. Bennyhoff, Register of Deeds and Registrar of Titles, was ordered placed on file.

An application for license to sell non-intoxicating malt liquor was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Reports were received from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, as follows:
