Tuesday, December 20, 1955

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten
o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A monthly report from George G. Roadfeldt, County Extension Agent, was ordered placed on file.

Letters were received from Elmer H.Larson, Land Commissioner, as follows:

1. Submitting an application from the City of Minneapolis for conveyance of certain tax forfeited land.

Commissioner Christensen moved, seconded by Commissioner Hanson that the application be held for further study; and that the following described property:

Block 3, D. L. Peck's Rearrangement of D. L. Peck's Addition to Minneapolis, including vacated alley in said block and adjoining half of 37th avenue north, and that part of 1-1/2 street north adjoining the same, now vacated and except West 7 feet of said Block 3, taken for widening 2nd street north. Also, Block 4, D. L. Peck's Rearrangement of D. L. Peck's Addition to Minneapolis, including vacated alley in said block and adjoining half of 37th avenue north, and that part of 1-1/2 street north adjoining the same, now vacated, and except West 7 feet of said Block 4, taken for widening 2nd street north,

be withheld from sale.

Motion unanimously carried.

2. Recommending the cancellation of sale of certain tax forfeited properties. Referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

A plat of Estherhills 1st Addition, located in the Town of Eden Prairie was presented and referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

Specifications were received from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, as follows: For publishing the official proceedings of the County Board for 1956, the financial statement for theyear 1955, the delinquent tax list for the year 1954, the official proceedings of the Board for the year 1956 outside the county seat, the financial statement for the year 1955 outside the county seat, and for furnishing to the office of the Registrar of Titles six (6) electric typewriters and two (2) automatic typing mechanisms. Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from the Minnesota State Highway Department as follows:

- 1. Requiring that requests for special allotments be filed not later than March 1st of each year. Referred to the County Engineer and the Road and Lake Committee.
- 2. Expressing appreciation for the County Board's cooperation in representation at the Institute sessions. Ordered placed on file.

Letters were received from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, as follows:

1. Submitting a list of bills which will not be paid in 1955 because of lack of funds. Referred to the Attorney for the Board.

2. Submitting a list of warrants that have been outstanding for six years and asking that they be cancelled. Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter was read from L. P. Zimmerman, Chief Engineer, State of Minnesota, extending an invitation to the Hennepin County Highway Engineer to attend the Mississippi Valley Conference of State Highway Departments to be held in Chicago.

Commissioner Scott moved, seconded by Commissioner Christensen that L. P.Pederson, County Engineer, and one member of the County Board be authorized to attend the conference, and that their expenses incurred by such attendance be paid from the Road and Bridge Fund upon presentation of properly verified claims.

The vote on the motion was as follows: Ainsworth yea, Christensen yea, Hanson yea, Scott yea, Chairman Matthews yea.

Motion carried.

A contract and contract bond from Naugle-Leck, Inc. for the general construction of the Hennepin County Pistol Range, were received and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters from B. W. Schwab, Asst. Secretary, Hennepin County Farm Bureau Association and from F. Wilson Pond, Secretary, Hennepin County Soil Conservation District, endorsing Ira McKown for the position of Hennepin County Weed and Seed Inspector, were ordered placed on file.

A letter from the Minneapolis Health Department requesting the commitment of a patient to Glen Lake Sanatorium was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Orders made by the District Court, Fourth Judicial District, adjusting salaries in the probation and investigation department of the District Court and at the Home School for Boys were received and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, as follows:

- 1. Requesting the transfer of funds to cover overruns in various contracts. Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.
- Requesting the cancellation of balances in various contracts.
   Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Charles A. Aling, M.D., Chairman, Hennepin County Medical Society, submitting the names of four persons recommended by the society to fill the vacancy occasioned by the resignation of Dr. S. Marx White as a member of the Glen Lake Sanatorium Commission, was read and referred to the Committee of the Whole.

Viola S. Thompson, County Superintendent of Schools, introduced the following high school students from Osseo who are studying County government: Irving Koehler, Lawrence Cardinel, Denard Ahrenson, Kenneth Ebert, and Richard Barthel.

O.A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, informed the Board that there is no way of limiting the purchase of supplies for the County Jail.

Commissioner Scott moved, seconded by Commissioner Christensen that the Attorney for the Board be requested to check into the possibility of removing the purchase of supplies from the Sheriff's Jail Fund to the District Court Fund.

Motion unanimously carried.

Commissioner Matthews brought up the matter of an increase for

the employees in the County Commissioners'Office, and it was moved, seconded, and unanimously carried that the Attorney for the Board be requested to check into the possibility of giving the employees in the County Commissioners' office the same increase as that granted the employees under the jurisdiction of the County Board.

Commissioner Scott moved, seconded by Commissioner Christensen that the matter of allowing severance pay for George Guider, retired Blueprinter, be referred to the Attorney for the County Board for preparation of a proper resolution.

Motion unanimously carried.

Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner
Christensen that the payroll checks for the Road and Bridge and Lake
Improvement Departments for the last one-half of December, 1955, be
turned over to L. P. Pederson, County Highway Engineer, for distribution instead of their being mailed out.

Motion unanimously carried.

Larkin McLellan, Assistant Business Representative for International Union of Operating Engineers, extended the Season's Greetings to the Board of County Commissioners from the members of his organization.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisements for bids, O.A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, proceeded to open bids for the following:

- 1. Four one-half ton Pickup Trucks for the Highway Department.
- 2. Rock Salt
- 3. Sand
- 4 Files for the Probate Court.

The above bids were referred to the Budget and Purchasing Agent for tabulation and award.

Only one bid was received for furnishing Road Tar to the County, and it was moved, seconded and unanimously carried that the sole bid be returned unopened to the sender and that O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, be directed to readvertise for bids for furnishing Road Tar, bids to be opened on Tuesday, January 3, 1956, at 10:15 o'clock A.M.

At 10:20 o'clock A.M., continued hearing was called for on the petition of W. R. Stephens, Jr., asking that his land described in said petition be set off from School District No. 225 to School District No. 17 in Hennepin County.

Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Christensen that the matter be continued to Tuesday, March 6, 1956, at 10:20 o'clock A.M.

Commissioner Christensen offered the following resolution, and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, each parcel of tax-forfeited land described in Cancellation

presented to this board by the Land Commissioner of Hennepin County; and

WHEREAS, the said purchaser or purchasers of each such parcel of land received from the County Auditor of said county an Auditor's Certificate of Purchase of Tax Forfeited Lands describing the parcel of land so sold to said purchaser of purchasers and setting forth the terms of the sale of same, all as provided by law; and

WHEREAS, a duplicate of each such certificate is now on file in the office of said County Auditor; and

WHEREAS, the said purchaser or purchasers of each parcel of land described in said statement, or any person or persons claiming under said purchaser or purchasers, failed to pay a deferred installment of the purchase price thereof with interest, required to be paid under the terms and conditions of the sale of same: and

WHEREAS, such failure of payment constitutes default in the terms and conditions of the sale of each such parcel of land, which said default still continues:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by this Board that it hereby orders and declares each such certificate of purchase cancelled and terminated; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that each such certificate together with the contract of purchase which is evidenced thereby and the sale therein referred to, be and the same are hereby cancelled and terminated; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the said Cancellation Statement No. 25 be and the same is hereby ordered filed with the said County Auditor.

That the Chairman of the County Board be authorized to sign the amended agreement between the County Board and the Operating Engineers Local Union No. 49.

BE IT RESOLVED: In addition to the hourly, daily, weekly and monthly annual salary schedules under the jurisdiction of the County Board, the following terms and conditions of employment for employees of the Road and Bridge and Lake Improvement Departments are hereby adopted effective January 1, 1956, superseding all regulations on the subject matter covered herein including those which have been heretofore adopted by this Board:

#### I. HOURS

- 1. The regular work day for employees shall be eight hours.
- 2. The regular work week for employees shall be forty hours.
- 3. The average work month for employees for purposes of computing vacations, sick leave, and fractions of a month's work shall be 173 hours.

#### II. OVERTIME

- 1. Overtime shall be allowed and paid as earned to any employee except the County Highway Engineer, the Assistant County Highway Engineer, the Construction Engineer, the Engineer of Survey and Design, the Maintenance Superintendent and the Right of Way Negotiator on the basis of one and one-half times the regular rate of pay computed on an hourly basis.
- 2. Overtime for an employee, except watchmen, is defined as work beyond eight hours in any one day, forty hours in any one week, and for work done on Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays.
- 3. Overtime work shall be confined to emergency necessary work and will normally be on work such as snow plowing, sanding, placing flares and danger signs, bituminous treatment, emergency repairs and work which will require only a short time to complete at the end of the day which if not completed would require the return of men and equipment to a job which is a considerable distance from head-quarters, or when such overtime shall be ordered by the County Highway Engineer or by a supervisor or foreman authorized by said County Highway Engineer to order such overtime.

# III. VACATIONS WITH PAY

- 1. All employees will be granted one day of vacation with pay for each month of employment except that no employee may take a vacation during his first six months of employment, but after having accumulated six months employment in consecutive years an employee is automatically credited with six days of vacation.
- 2. After five continuous years of employment, each employee shall be granted one and one-quarter days of vacation for each month of work.
- J. Vacations are to be used during the year they are earned, but it is possible to save up vacation time to a maximum total of twenty-four days if it cannot be taken during the calendar year either because the department is unable to schedule an employee's vacation or due to personal reasons.
- 4. If an employee has twenty-four vacation days to his credit, he may take a day off to avoid losing any other vacation earned.
- 5. All vacations must be arranged for at least forty-eight hours in advance and are subject to the approval of the County Highway Engineer, or by such personnel authorized by the County Highway Engineer. Employees will be given an opportunity to select vacation periods insofar as it is possible or practical.
- 6. When a vacation is taken, only working days are subtracted from the vacation time to the employee's credit. For example, if an employee takes two weeks off, he will be charged as using ten days of vacation time.

### IV. SICK LEAVE

All employees shall be granted one day of sick leave with pay for each month of employment and will be allowed to accumulate credit for earned sick leave up to one hundred days subject to the following provisions:

- 1. We sick leave will be paid or credited for the first six months of employment, but after having accumulated six months employment in consecutive years an employee will be given credit for days earned during the first six months.
- Sick leave will be granted for actual sickness, temporary physical disability, serious illness in the immediate family, or quarantine.

- 3. Payment of sick leave may be withheld until proof of one of the foregoing conditions is presented to, and accepted by, the County Highway Engineer or persons authorized by him to act on his behalf.
  - 4. Accumulated sick leave shall be retroactive to January 1, 1942.
- 5. For every day of sick leave an employee earns after he has accumulated one hundred days, he will be given credit for one-half day additional vacation and one-half day of "banked" sick leave which may be used only in case of a long illness lasting over the accumulated one hundred days, and shall not be used in the computation of severance pay either as accrued vacation or accrued sick leave.
- 6. Sick leave is charged off on a working day basis, for example, if an employee is absent because of illness for one week, only five days will be charged against his accumulated sick leave.
- 7. Sick leave shall be granted only for an injury or sickness which occurs while the person claiming such sick leave is employed by Hennepin County. Such sick leave shall not be granted to any person during the time he is permanently or temporarily severed from county employment for a period of longer than 30 days by layoff, stoppage of work, abandonment of work projects or completion of contract work.
- 8. Employees shall be allowed a reasonable leave as approved by the County Highway Engineer, or by persons authorized by him, chargeable against accumulated vacation or sick leave for death in the immediate family.

#### V. HOLIDAYS

 All employees shall be granted leave of absence with regular pay on all legal holidays. These are:

- 2. New Year's Day, Nemorial Day, Independence Day, and Christmas Day will be considered "major" holidays. When any such major holiday falls upon a Sunday, the following Monday shall be considered a holiday for all employees. When a major holiday falls upon a Saturday, the preceding Friday shall be considered a holiday for all employees.
- 3. Every employee entitled to vote at an election shall be permitted to absent himself from his work for that purpose during the forenoon of each general election day without a penalty or deduction from salary or wages on account of such absence.

## VI. SEVERANCE PAY

- Severance pay shall be granted to employees in an amount measured by but not based on accumulated vacation not to exceed 24 days and accumulated sick leave of the employees upon termination of their employment with Hennepin County.
- 2. Such severance pay shall be paid to employees who have completely severed their employment with the county, including those whose severance is occasioned by death. Any employee who shall have received the maximum severance pay upon termination of his employment shall not again be eligible to accrue any severance pay benefits upon reemployment by the County. Any employee who has once received severance pay, may, upon reemployment, be eligible to receive severance pay for any days accumulated over and above the number for which he was formerly compensated, the combined total number of days, however, not to exceed the maximum.
- 3. Severance pay in an amount not exceeding \$500.00 may be paid to the widow of a deceased employee. All other severance pay of a deceased employee shall be paid to his estate or his legal representative.
- 4. Application for severance pay shall be made to the head of the department whose duty it shall be to compute and recommend the amount of severance pay due the employee and to submit to this Board in writing the amount of severance pay

due the employee, together with the facts and figures upon which the computation of such severance pay is based. In no event shall any severance pay be paid to an employee unless approved by this Board by resolution fixing the amount of such severance pay.

5. Severance pay shall be computed on the basis of the average rate of pay of the employee during the last year of employment prior to the payment of severance pay.

VII. REGULATIONS

- 1. For crews working out of the County Shops, their time shall start from the time of leaving the shop until time of returning to the shop.
- 2. All employees reporting for work who are sent home through no fault of their own shall be allowed two hours time.
- All County employees operating County equipment must have chauffeur's licenses when required.
- 4. Authorization to work for Hennepin County shall be made by an "Order for Employment" approved by the Chairman and Vice-Chairman of the Committee under whose supervision a department functions and by the department head or the assistant department head or by resolution of the County Board. The County Auditor shall pay only those employees having such an authorization on file in the Accounting Department of the County Auditor's office.
- 5. All employees shall be given an accounting of their accumulated vacation and sick leave on the first day of each year and at any other time upon their written request.
- 6. Employees subposed as witnesses or called and selected for jury duty shall receive their regular compensation and other benefits for their employment less the amount received by them as juror or witness fees.

- 7. Independent truck operators hired subsequent to the adoption of this resolution and who were not employed by the county prior to January 1, 1954, and casual employees shall not be considered employees entitled to the benefits under this resolution.
- 8. For purposes of this resolution "immediate family" shall be determined to mean the spouse, parent or child of an employee.
- The time of lunch periods, rest periods and to commence work shall be set by the County Highway Engineer.
- 10. Overtime hours shall not be used for the computation of vacation, sick leave or severance benefits.
- ll. For purposes of this resolution, the word "employee" shall include all persons who have successfully served a six-month probationary period and continue in the employ of the county. Upon completion of such six-month probationary period, the effective date of employment for all purposes shall revert back to the initial employment date.
- 12. Any employee who takes vacation or sick leave for sickness or injury and who, by reason of such sickness or injury, receives Workmen's Compensation benefits may transfer to the county the benefits so received. In such case his accumulated vacation and sick leave shall be credited to the extent that the value of such Workmen's Compensation benefits compensate the county for the cost of such vacation or sick leave.
