Tuesday, March 13, 1956

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten
o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A summary of contracts awarded and purchase orders issued for Hennepin County during the year 1955, received from O. A. Pearson, Budget Director, was ordered placed on file.

A Hennepin County Highway Department budget report received from O. A. Pearson, Budget Director, was ordered placed on file.

A letter from the Village Council of the Village of Plymouth endorsing Jacob Oswald for the position of County Weed and Seed Inspector was presented and ordered placed on file.

A copy of a letter from Sen. Hubert H. Humphrey to Major General Chas. G. Holle, Chairman, Board of Engineers for Rivers and Harbors, relative to the upper harbor project was presented and ordered acknowledged.

Letters were received from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, as follows:

- 1. Recommending acceptance of the bid of Midway Tractor and Equipment Company for an industrial type tractor.
- 2. Notifying the Board of the acceptance of the low bid of
 L. N. Sickels Company for furnishing asphalt emulsion to the Highway
 Department and requesting that funds be set aside to pay said award.

The above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Plans and specifications for furnishing and installing a heating system at the Hennepin County Highway Shops were presented and referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

Contracts and contract bonds were received as follows:

- From Driv-Ur-Self System, Inc. for leasing trucks to the County Surveyor.
- 2. From Minneapolis Standard Garage for furnishing gasoline and oil for the Sheriff's cars.
- 3. From Lake Minnetonka Dredging Co. for maintenance of buoys and bay name signs at Lake Minnetonka.

The above contracts and bonds were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Commissioner Scott reported on the hearing relative to the Upper Harbor project which he attended in Washington, D.C. and stated that he will submit a written report at a later date.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisements for bids, O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, proceeded to open bids for furnishing a tandem roller for the Highway Department and a cash register for the Clerk of Probate Court.

The bids were referred to Mr. Pearson for tabulation and a report back to the County Board.

WHEREAS, The actual facts concerning the yield from this tax as compared to its cost of collection are known only in very general terms, lacking exact figures to afford a conclusive determination,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, By the Board of County Commissioners of Hennepin County that the County Supervisor of Assessments is hereby authorized and directed to proceed forthwith to collect all pertinent data, factual and statistical, concerning the administration and collection of this tax throughout Hennepin County, such as:
