Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, May 22, 1956

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten
o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

Members present: Commissioners Ainsworth, Christensen, Scott, and Chairman Matthews.

Member absent: Commissioner Hanson.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A monthly report received from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, was ordered placed on file.

A statement of the Road and Bridge, Road Construction, and Lake Improvement Funds as of April 30, 1956, received from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, was ordered placed on file.

An application for license to sell non-intoxicating malt liquor was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, as follows:

1. Requesting the setting aside of additional funds for the relocation of gas mains on France Avenue. Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Relative to transportation allowances for deputy coroners.Ordered held.

A letter from the State Department of Highways submitting maximum safe speed limits for various roads was read and referred to the County Engineer and the Road and Lake Committee.

A notice from the Commissioner of Conservation of a hearing on the matter of the application of the County Board for a permit to dredge a bar off the bathing beach at Excelsior, was read and it was moved, seconded, and unanimously carried that L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, request a continuation of the hearing for 30 days.

A letter from L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, requesting the release of an easement to construct and maintain temporary snow fences on certain property was read and referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

Commissioner Scott moved, seconded by Commissioner Ainsworth that O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, be directed to advertise for bids for rental of equipment for cleaning up certain tax forfeited lands.

Motion unanimously carried.

A land title summons in the matter of the application of Robert S. and Thelma E. Graving to register title to certain lands was presented and referred to the Attorney for the Board.

A copy of a resolution from the Suburban Police and Peace
Officers Assocation protesting against the discrimination shown by the
Commissioners of Hennepin County in requiring a fee payment for
shooting on the Hennepin County Pistol Range by all officers except
the Minneapolis Police Officers and the Hennepin County Sheriff's

officers was read and referred to the Chairman of the Board.

A letter from Levi M. Hall, Presiding Judge of the District Court, relative to eating arrangements for jurors was read and referred to the Attorney for the Board.

A letter from the Bricklayers, Cement Blocklayers, Stone and Marble Masons, Caulkers, Cleaners, and Pointers Union No. 2 of Minnesota, calling the Board's attention to a raise of 10 cents per hour was read and it was ordered that the letter be acknowledged informing the union that the prevailing union rates are paid the various crafts working for the County.

Commissioner Ainsworth reported on the request of the Village of Maple Grove for assistance in improving former County Road No. 101 and moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott, that that part of County Road No. 137 in Maple Grove and Plymouth Villages described as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of said County Road No. 137 and County Road No. 10 in Section 2, Township 118, Range 22, thence northerly along said County Road No. 137 to its intersection with County Road No. 101 in the south 1/2 of the South 1/2 of the Northwest 1/4 of Section 22, Township 119, Range 22, and there terminating,

be rescinded; and

WHEREAS, The Commissioners of Hennepin County passed a resolution dated March 8, 1955, rescinding certain roads in the Village of Maple Grove; and

WHEREAS, The supplement in connection therewith describing said changes was in error as it applies to County Road No. 101 in the said Village of Maple Grove;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the reference to County

Road No. 101 in Maple Grove Village be amended to read as follows:

All that part of County Road No. 101 in the Village of Maple Grove lying westerly of the intersection with County Road No. 137 in the Northeast 1/4 of Government Lot 2 in Section 22, Township 119, Range 22,

be and hereby is rescinded as a County road.

The vote on the motion was as follows: Ainsworth yea,
Christensen yea, Hanson absent, Scott yea, Chairman Matthews yea.
Motion carried.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisements for bids, O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, proceeded to open bids as follows:

- 1. For the grading and plant mixed bituminous surfacing of State Aid Road No. 29.
- For reconditioning, painting, and redecorating the County Morgue.
- 3. For furnishing bodily injury or death and property damage insurance.

All of the above bids were referred to the Budget and Purchasing Agent for tabulation and a report to be made at the next Board meeting.

At 10:20 o'clock A.M., Hearing was called for on the matter of the dissolution and attachment of School Districts No. 104, No. 47, No. 127, No. 120, and No. 63.

The Clerk to the Board presented the publisher's affidavit of publishing, the County Auditor's certificate of mailing, and the Sheriff's return of posting the notices of said hearing.

A letter from Viola S. Thompson, County Superintendent of Schools, recommending that all five districts be dissolved and annexed to Wayzata School District No. 144 was read.

A letter from Mrs.Walter Faue urging the attachment of School District No. 63 to Wayzata School District was read.

A letter from Agnes and Elmer Schaber requesting that their names be withdrawn from the petition for the consolidation of School District No. 63 with Rockford was read and the request was granted.

An extract of Minutes of the meeting of the School Board of Orono Consolidated School District No. 11 containing a copy of a resolution requesting that in the event School District No. 63 or any other school district is to be dissolved and attached to School District No. 11, such district should vote to become liable for its proportionate share of the bonded indebtedness of said School District No. 11.

A petition signed by Lloyd Bergin and 37 others requesting that the resolution adopted at a school meeting of District No. 63 for dissolution of said district be denied, was presented.

A petition signed by Amos J. Dayon and 33 others was presented, stating that they desire their School District No. 63 to be consolidated

with Wayzata School District No. 144.

Ralph J. Coursolle, Attorney representing residents of District No. 63, urged that for the best interests of all of the district the County Board attach said School District No. 63 to the Wayzata School District.

Mr. Dayon addressed the Board stating that he would like tohave his district, School District No. 63, attached to the Wayzata School District.

Mrs. Harry Sorenson, Treasurer of School District No. 47, urged that District No. 47 be attached to the Wayzata School District.

Rose Talbot, a resident of School District No. 104, urged the attachment of School District No. 104 to the Wayzata School District.

Lee Williams, Attorney representing residents of School District No. 63, addressed the Board stating that the districts voted to dissolve without consulting the Wayzata District, that there would be an increase in taxes for the district, and that 40 of the 63 voters are now opposed to the attachment of School District No. 63 to the Wayzata School District.

Eugene R. Sheridan, Treasurer of School District No. 127, urged that District No. 127 be attached to Wayzata School District No. 144.

Arthur J. Bauer, Chairman of the School Board of District No. 120 stated that a majority of the residents of School District No. 120 wished to be attached to Wayzata School District No. 144.

Jan. P. Boswinkel, Chairman of the Wayzata School Board, stated that the Wayzata School Board was unanimous in favor of accepting

School Districts No. 104, No. 47, and No. 127, but was divided three against, two for, and one abstaining in accepting all five districts.

J. J. Kardong, Clerk of the Wayzata School Board, stated that he had never heard any of the Board members state that they were opposed to the attachment of the five districts to the Wayzata School District and that the tax base for the district would be increased by annexing all five districts.

William N. Driscoll, Board member of the Wayzata School Board, stated that that Board was in favor of accepting Districts No. 104, No. 127, and No. 47 but was divided on accepting all five districts.

John Pillsbury, Chairman of School District No. 11, stated that if School District No. 63 is to be attached to the Orono School District, said district should assume its proportionate share of the bonded indebtedness of the Orono District, and that the transportation problem would be very burdensome to Orono District No. 11.

Charles Root, Attorney, stated that should any of the districts be attached to Robbinsdale School District, before the County Board takes final action the districts should vote to accept their proportionate share of the bonded indebtedness of the Robbinsdale School District.

Newell P. Weed, Member of the Wayzata School Board, stated that it would be an educational handicap to the Wayzata School District to accept all five districts; that the vote was overwhelmingly in favor of accepting School Districts No. 104, No. 47, and No. 127 and overwhelmingly opposed to accepting School Districts No. 120 and No. 63.

Mr. Dorweiler of Hamel stated that the vote would have been different if the districts were to have been attached to some district other than Wayzata.

Mrs. Ruth Raymond, member of the Wayzata School Board, stated that she was in favor of consolidating all five districts with the Wayzata School District.

Commissioner Scott moved, seconded by Commissioner Christensen to accept the recommendation of the County Superintendent of Schools, Viola S. Thompson, and that proper resolutions and orders be prepared and presented to the County Board for action at their next meeting.



Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, June 19, 1956

Specifications for furnishing aerial photographs for the Supervisor of Assessments were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, re-

questing the transfer of funds from the Register of Deeds fund to the Johnson Printing Company contract for furnishing Certificates of Title and Memorial Sheets was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from the Minneapolis Health Department requesting the commitment of a patient to Glen Lake Sanatorium was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Paul W. Keve, Director, Court Services, requesting the allowance of mileage for a probation officer was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, reported on the mechanical typing units in the office of the Register of Deeds and notified the Board that Mr. Hoof had serviced the machines but that they were again out of order and stated that it was doubtful if the machines could be operated.
