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Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, June 26, 1956

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

Applications for license to sell non-intoxicating malt liquor were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Elmer H. Larson, Land Commissioner, submitting an application from the Village of Edina for conveyance of tax forfeited property for public park and playground purposes was referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

An order of the District Court making appointments, promotions, and salary adjustments in the Department of Court Services and at the Home School for Boys was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A contract and contract bond from Adolphson & Peterson, Inc. for reconditioning, painting, and decorating at the Hennepin County Morgue was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A notice of hearing before the Minnesota Water Resources Board in the matter of the establishment of a water shed district and appointing managers therefor was referred to the County Engineer and the

Road and Lake Committee.

A copy of a petition for the dissolution of School District
No. 49 in Wright County and of a resolution of the Wright County
Board dissolving said district and attaching it to School District
No. 122 joint in Hennepin and Wright Counties and School District
No. 20 Wright County were referred to the Attorney for the Board and the Superintendent of Schools.

Letters were received from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, as follows:

- 1. Recommending concurrence by the Board in the action of the Village of Edina in awarding the contract for improving S,A.R. No. 62 to Craig J. Alexander, the low bidder.
- 2. Requesting approval of an overrun in the Chas. A. Weingart Company contract for installation of autopsy tables at the County Morgue.
- 3. Requesting that the County Board authorize the County Auditor to issue a check in the sum of \$7000.00 to Arthur Hanson, State Treasurer, to fulfill application requirements for matching federal funds for base station and mobile radio equipment for the Hennepin County Highway Department.

All of the above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

The official bond of L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, was received and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Plans and specifications for grading, gravel base, concrete curb and gutter, road mixed bituminous base and plant mixed bituminous surface on S.A.R. No. 156 were referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

Letters were received from L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, as follows:

- 1. Submitting a division of costs agreement between the County of Hennepin and the Village of Golden Valey for improving S.A.R. No. 156.
- 2. Submitting a division of costs agreement between the County of Hennepin and the Village of Richfield for improving S.A.R. No. 53.

The above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from the Washington County Commissioners, St. George, Utah, notifying the County Board of the convention of the National Association of County Officials to be held at Salt Lake City, Utah, was read and referred to the Budget and Purchasing Agent.

A letter from M. J. Schanfeld relative to removing the bar dividing Excelsion and Gideon's Bay, Lake Minnetonka, was read and referred to the Chairman of the County Board for reply.

A report of the Road and Bridge, the Road Construction, and the Lake improvements funds received from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, was ordered placed on file.

Arthur Rand and Mr. Dunsheaths appeared before the Board requesting financial assistance from the County for the Animal Rescue League.

Commissioner Hanson moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott that the matter be taken under advisement for consideration when the 1957 Budget requests are presented.

Motion unanimously carried.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisements for bids, O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, proceeded to open bids for the road mixed bituminous surfacing of State Aid Road No. 10.

The bids were referred to the Budget and Purchasing Agent and the County Engineer for tabulation and a report to be made to the Board.

At 10:20 o'clock A.M., hearing was called for on the petition of Irvine and Vira McQuarrie asking that their land described in said petition be set off from School District No. 45 to School District No. 43.

The Clerk to the Board presented the publisher's affidavit of publication, the Sheriff's return of posting, and the County Auditor's certificate of mailing the notices of said hearing.

There was no appearance either in support of or against the granting of said petition.

The matter was referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, July 10, 1956

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten
o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A letter from O'Neil J. Grathwol, Attorney, submitting a petition signed by Frank Larkin and others requesting the incorporation of the Village of Burwell was read.

A petition signed by Carl F. Dever and others requesting the incorporation of the Village of Minnetonka was presented.

Mr. Grathwol, Attorney representing the Burwell group, spoke in behalf of the Burwell petition, claiming that it complied with the statutes and that it was filed ahead of the Minnetonka petition.

N. A. Holmer, Gray's Bay, Lake Minnetonka, claimed that they knew nothing of the Burwell petition and stated that they could not discuss it pro or con.

Mr. Haglund, City Attorney for Wayzata, requested that the area adjacent to the City of Wayzata, which is holding an election on the 17th of July be given an opportunity to vote whether or not it wishes to be annexed to the City of Wayzata, and added that because of the

recent annexations the villages to be incorporated should be specifically described in the petitions.

Wm. T. Frommes, Attorney, and one of the petitioners for the incorporation of the Village of Minnetonka, held that the two petitions were filed simultaneously and spoke against splitting the township into two villages.

Ray S. Porter, Chairman of the Minnetonka Town Board, opposed cutting the township into two narrow strips, stating that the cost of operating two villages would be greater. He also stated that a number of the surrounding villages have been endeavoring to acquire additional territory and that the new village should start big by incorporating the entire area and holding the township together.

Richard Johnson opposed the incorporation of the Village of Minnetonka, claiming that his area has a community interest in the City of Hopkins and should be given a chance to be annexed to the City of Hopkins.

Don Hagen of Hopkins claimed that land annexed to surrounding villages has been so annexed by petition of the residents living in the area and stated that the area bordering the City of Hopkins should be annexed to Hopkins.

Waldo Lopez spoke on behalf of the Burwell petition.

S. S. Frissell, City Manager for Hopkins, stated that Hopkins does not wish to become a larger city but that the area bordering Hopkins should be given a chance to become a part of the City of Hopkins.

Atherton Bean claimed that by incorporating the entire township

the village would be too large and that because the township had been well run in the past it would not mean that as a village it would continue to be well run.

Both petitions were referred to the Attorney for the Board and Chairman Matthews requested that the attorneys for the petitoners file their briefs in the matter with the Attorney's office.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisements for bids, O. A.Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, proceeded to open bids for the improvement of State Aid Road No. 11, State Project No. SP 27-534-03 (County Project No. 5527). The bids were referred to O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, and to L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, for tabulation and recommendation.

At 10:30 o'clock A.M., Continued hearing on the petition for the establishment of County Ditch No. 13 (Shingle Creek) was called for.

A letter from W. B. Rohan of Winston Bros. Company, requesting a continuation of the hearing to the first week in August was read.

A resolution adopted by the Village of Brooklyn Park objecting to the partial and inadequate solution to the drainage of Shingle Creek as outlined in the Engineer's report and urging that the County Commissioners recommend the Palmer Lake area as a part of the future County Park System was read.

The hearing on the petition for the establishment of County
Ditch No. 13 was continued to August 7, 1956, at 10:30 o'clock A.M.,
in Committee Room 130 Court House, Minneapolis.

Applications for license to sell non-intoxicating malt liquor were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

The Hennepin County Library Budget for 1957 was presented and referred to the Budget and Purchasing Agent and the Chairman of the County Board.

A letter from Howard W. Perkins, County Surveyor, submitting the 1957 Budget for the remonumentation program was read. The Budget was approved and the matter was referred to the Budget and Purchasing Agent.

A letter from R. E. Lonsdale requesting permission to erect a boathouse on Hennepin County property located at 39th and Beard Avenues North was read and referred to the County Engineer and the Chairman of the Road and Lake Committee.

A letter from L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, relative to the employment of Nate Allen was read and a copy of the letter was ordered forwarded to Mr. Allen.

A letter from the Village of Tonka Bay relative to the Snyder-Johnson application for abatement of valuations on real estate was read and referred to Commissioner Ainsworth to be filed with the Mary-Stuart Johnson application for abatement.

A letter from Dick Musenbrock submitting copy of a letter addressed to Alderman Egan relative to the improvement of Penn Avenue from Wayzata Boulevard to West Broadway and special assessments on the benefited property was read and referred to the Committee on Taxes.

A letter from the Mound Chamber of Commerce requesting the restoration and improvement of Lost Lake was read and referred to the County Engineer and the Road and Lake Committee.

A letter from the Village of New Hope addressed to Sheriff Ed Ryan requesting police radio service for New Hope was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, July 24, 1956

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten
o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

The Municipal Building Commission budget for 1957 received from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, Secretary of said commission, was presented and referred to the Chairman of the County Board.

A letter from the Municipal Building Commission requesting the Board to find new space for the Hennepin County Welfare Department was read and referred to the Committee of the Whole, Commissioner Ainsworth to call a meeting of the committee.

Letters were received from Paul W. Keve, Director of Court Services, as follows:

- Requesting automobile allowance for various Probation
   Officers.
- 2. Requesting the transfer of funds from the regular salary budget to the temporary salary budget in the Home School for Boys appropriation.

The above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisements for bids, O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, called for bids for the grading, gravel base, concrete curb and gutter, road mixed bituminous base, and plant mixed bituminous surface of State Aid Road No. 156, being Project No. 5509.

Only one bid was received and on motion duly seconded and carried, O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, was directed to return the unopened bid to the bidder and to readvertise for bids for the grading, gravel base, concrete curb and gutter, road mixed bituminous base, and plant mixed bituminous surface of State Aid Road No. 156, bids on the second advertising to be opened on Tuesday, August 21, 1956, at 10:15 o'clock A.M.

D. F. Mattson, Assistant District Engineer, State Highway Department, proceeded to open bids for the construction of the approach and embankment at Coffee Bridge, State Aid Road No. 19, being Project No. Sp. 27-520-04. The bids were referred to Mr. Mattson and to L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, for tabulation and report back to the Board.

Letters were received from George M. Scott, County Attorney, as follows:

- Submitting easements for right of way for County Road
   No. 92. Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.
- 2. Reporting on the petitions for the incorporation of the Village of Burwell and for the incorporation of the Village of Minnetonka.

Letters were read from Martin J. Bennis, P. J. Platzer, Hartley Forrest, Atherton and Winnifred W. Bean, Mr. and Mrs. R. G. Freeman,

Helen S. Opstad, and Mr. and Mrs. P. W. Brockway urging approval of the petition for the incorporation of the Village of Burwell.

Letters from Willard S. and Kathleen Hultgren, Helen Anderson
Harris and Ralph D. Harris, and a petition signed by 414 persons,
all residents of Minnetonka Township residing within the proposed
Burwell Village limits, urging the Board to consider first the petition to form Minnetonka Village, were presented.

A. D. Hyde addressed the Board urging approval of the petition for the incorporation of the Village of Burwell, claiming that the census submitted with the Burwell petition is 99 per cent accurate and questioning the accuracy of the census submitted with the Minnetonka petition.

Roy S. Porter, Chairman of the Town of Minnetonka, stated that possibly the census of the Township would be between16,000 and 18,000 but that he had nothing on which to base his estimate.

William Frommes, Attorney, stated that it would be impossible to determine the accuracy of the Minnetonka census.

Mrs. Charlotte Chope claimed that the population of the Township of Minnetonka would be between 18,000 and 19,000.

A statement from Commissioner Ainsworth relative to the petitions for the incorporation of the Village of Burwell and the Village of Minnetonka and moving that the petition calling for an election for the incorporation of the entire Town of Minnetonka as a village be accepted, was read.

The matter was continued to Tuesday, July 31, 1956.

A letter from the Railroad and Warehouse Commission relative to switching operations of the Soo Line Railroad in North Minneapolis was referred to the County Engineer and the Chairman of the Road and Lake Committee.

A letter from G. Aaron Youngquist calling the Board's attention to an item in the Citizens League News Bulletin criticising payment by the County on severance for accumulated sick leave and payment of a deputy at department head rates while the latter is on vacation, and stating that in his opinion both practices are wrong, was read and ordered placed on file.

Letters were received from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, as follows:

- 1. Requesting that the County Auditor be directed to set aside funds to the Fischer Construction Company contract for improving State Aid Road No. 11.
- 2. Requesting that the County Auditor be directed to set aside funds to the Craig J. Alexander contract for improving State Aid Road No. 53.
- 3. Requesting that the County endorse the check of the City of Minneapolis making it payable to the Crowley Fence Company for erecting the fence around the Hennepin County Pistol Range.
- 4. Requesting the transfer of funds from the Road Construction Fund to the Road and Bridge Fund for reimbursement for engineering services on Road Construction Fund projects.
  - 5. Road and Bridge Fund budget adjustment.
- 6. Recommending acceptance by the Board of the bid of Mark Hurd Aerial Surveys, Inc. for furnishing aerial photographs for the Supervisor of Assessments. Attached to said letter was a letter of ex-

planation from Roy Haeg, Supervisor of Assessments.

All of the above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

- 7. Notifying the Board of the rejection of all bids for improving State Aid Road No. 5. Ordered placed on file.
- 8. Notifying the Board that budget requests for 1957 for various departments will be available for budget meetings as of Monday, July 30th.

Chairman Matthews announced that budget meetings will commence on Monday, July 30th, at 10:00 o'clock A.M.

Letters were received from L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, as follows:

1. Recommending that the County accept the determination of speed limits as established by the State Highway Department.

Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott, that the Board concur in the recommendation of the County Engineer to accept the speed limits as established by the State Highway Department.

Motion unanimously carried.

- 2. Recommending that the County Attorney be directed to proceed with the registration of title to Frog Island. Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.
- 3. Reporting on the request of R. E. Lonsdale to erect a boat house on County-owned property at Crystal Lake. Referred back to the Engineer for checking with property owners in the area.
- 4. Recommending the institution of condemnation proceedings for the acquisition of certain land necessary for the improvement of

State Aid Road No. 19. Ordered held for further negotiations.

Mr.Pederson and Mr. Mattson reported on the bids received for construction of the approach and embankment at Coffee Bridge, State Aid Road No. 19, and recommended acceptance of the low bid of Pfeiffer Construction Company in the amount of \$56,428.29.

Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Hanson that the County Board recommend to the State Highway Department acceptance of the low bid of Pfeiffer Construction Company in the amount of \$56, 428.29 for the construction of the approach and embankment at Coffee Bridge, State Aid Road No. 19.

The vote on the motion was as follows: Ainsworth yea, Christensen yea, Hanson yea, Scott yea, Chairman Matthews yea.
