Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, August 7, 1956

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten
o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A monthly report received from Donald C. Bennyhoff, Register of Deeds and Registrar of Titles, was ordered placed on file.

An application for license to sell non-intoxicating malt liquor was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters from the Department of Health, City of Minneapolis, requesting the commitment of two patients to Glen Lake Sanatorium, were read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, as follows:

- 1. Requesting the transfer of funds from the Road Construction Fund to the Road and Bridge Fund for reimbursement for engineering services on Road Construction Fund projects for the month of June, 1956.
- 2. Requesting the transfer of funds from the Home School for Boys appropriation to the to the Ford Deep Rock Oil Company contract

for fuel oil to cover an overrun in said contract.

3. Requesting the setting aside of funds from the Reserve
Building and Maintenance Fund for repairs to the steam line from the
Glen Lake Sanatorium to the Home School for Boys.

The above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A contract and contract bond from Mark Hurd Aerial Surveys, Inc. for furnishing aerial photographs were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A copy of the original Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Order of the Minnesota Water Resources Board received from Melvin J. Peterson, Assistant Attorney General, was ordered placed on file.

A letter from L. P. Zimmerman, Chief Engineer, State Highway Department, acknowledging receipt of a resolution relative to the locating of the north and south Inter-state route through Hennepin County, was ordered placed on file.

A letter from the Standing Committee on Ways and Means of the City Council relative to securing the cooperation of the County Welfare Board in the matter of referrals of patients to the Minneapolis General Hospital, was read and referred to Commissioner Hanson for reply.

A letter from the Gopher State Cat Club requesting the use of a County-owned building for their annual Cat Show was read and referred to Commissioner Ainsworth with authority to act.

A letter from the Minneapolis-Richfield American Legion Post
No. 435, requesting that the name of the lake located East of Portland

Avenue and North of 66th Street be changed from Mud Lake to Legion

Lake was read and referred to the Chairman of the Board, the Attorney

for the Board, and the County Engineer.

At 10:30 o'clock A.M., the continued hearing was called for on the petition for the establishment of County Ditch No. 13 (Shingle Creek).

It was moved, seconded, and unanimously carried that the hearing be continued to Tuesday, August 21, 1956, at 10:30 O'clock A.M., in Committee Room 130 Court House, Minneapolis.

Beginning at the intersection of Trunk Highway No. 55 in Section 20, Township 28 North, Range 23 West, with the extension Easterly of East 58th Street in the City of Minneapolis; thence Westerly along said Easterly extension and said East 58th Street to the intersection with 28th Avenue South in Section 24, Township 28 North, Range 24 West; thence Westerly and Southwesterly through said Section 24 and Section 23, Township 28 North, Range 24 West to the intersection with 12th Avenue South and East 62nd Street; thence Westerly along East 62nd Street and extensions thereof to the intersection with said 62nd Street and Xerxes Avenue South at the ½ corner between Sections 20 and 29, Township 28 North, Range 24 West; thence Westerly on the extension of West 62nd Street a distance of 179.14 feet; thence deflecting to the left along a 4 degree curve (delta angle 41 degrees 45 minutes and tangent distance 546.26 feet) a distance of 1043.75 feet; thence along tangent to last mentioned curve a distance of 1049.0 feet; thence deflecting to the right along a 4 degree curve (delta angle 41 degrees 13 minutes and tangent distance 538.6 feet) a distance of 1030.3 feet; thence along tangent to last mentioned curve a distance of 3000.65 feet; thence deflecting to the right along a 4 degree 30 minute curve (delta angle 29 degrees 55 minutes and tangent distance 340.24 feet) a distance of 1463.46 feet; thence along tangent to last mentioned curve a distance of 770 feet; thence deflecting to the left along a 4 degree curve (delta angle 30 degrees 48 minutes and tangent distance 394.63 feet) a distance of 770 feet; thence along tangent to last mentioned curve to the intersection with County Road No. 39 in the North ½ of Section 4, Township 116 North, Range 21 West.

Thence continuing in a Westerly direction across the North of Sections 4, 5, and 6, Township 116 North, Range 21 West, to the intersection with County Road No. 62 on the line between Minnetonka and Eden Prairie Townships; thence continuing Westerly along the line between Minnetonka and Eden Prairie Townships to the intersection with the proposed U.S. outer Belt Line Highway and there terminating.
