The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,

A contract and contract bond from Century Fence Company for installing a fence at the Juvenile Center were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, as follows:

- 1. Submitting a contract change order to Ring Construction Corporation for work at the Juvenile Center.
- 2. Requesting the setting aside of funds from the County
 Reserve Building and Maintenance Fund for improvements at the County
 Morgue.
- 3. Requesting the setting aside of funds to cover an overrun in the Arnell Business Forms, Inc. contract for furnishing tax statements.

The above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

4. Reporting on claims for work and for furnishing gravel materials for County Road No. 136. Ordered placed on file.
