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Minneapolis, Minnesota
Tuesday, February 5, 1957

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten
o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A monthly report from Donald C. Bennyhoff, Register of Deeds and Registrar of Titles was ordered placed on file.

A letter from Desmond F. Pratt, Attorney for Minneapolis Terminal Warehouse Company, offering to purchase all of the Hennepin County Farm property not scheduled for County purposes was read.

Commissioner Christensen moved, seconded by Commissioner Ainsworth that the Board go on record favoring the sale of the balance of the County Home property and that the Attorney for the Board and the County Engineer be requested to prepare a proper resolution setting up the procedure for the sale of the property.

Motion unanimously carried.

A letter from Howard W. Perkins, County Surveyor, requesting authorization for his chief deputy to attend the American Congress of Mapping and Surveying to be held in Washington, D.C. was read and

referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, submitting a revised agreement from Northern States Power Company for furnishing electric energy for lake level pumping was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, requesting authority to enter into a Police Radio Agreement with the Village of St. Anthony was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, as follows:

- l. Requesting that funds be set aside for payment of the award made to Miller-Davis Company for furnishing certificates of title and memorial sheets to the Registrar of Titles.
- 2. Requesting that funds be set aside for payment of the Eddy's Baking Company contract for furnishing bread and rolls to the County Jail and the County Juvenile Center.

The above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from George M. Scott, County Attorney, as follows:

- l. Relative to the conveyance of certain tax forfeited land to the City of Robbinsdale for public purposes. Referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.
- 2. Recommending that the County Surveyor be authorized to file a revised plat correcting certain descriptions of lots in Auditor's Subdivision No. 141 in the Village of Deephaven. Referred to the Chairman of the Board.

c. Reporting on the request of the Hennepin Soil Conservation

District for an appropriation to supply a part-time office filing clerk.

It was moved, seconded, and unanimously carried that the Commission be requested to present a chart of the area served by said Commission and also a budget of their expenditures.

Specifications for furnishing binders with canvas jackets for the Register of Deeds were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Contracts and contract bonds were received from the following:

- l. Asconite Asphalt Company for the improvement of a portion of State Aid Road No. 5 by grading, concrete curb and gutter and plant mixed bituminous surfacing.
- 2. Post Publishing Company for publishing the Financial Statement of Hennepin County.

The above contracts and bonds were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters from Wm. G. Guthrie, M.D., Coroner, notifying the Board of the appointment of a deputy coroner and requesting that he be granted the transportation allowance in addition to the regular per mile reimbursement were read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A proposed resolution from Local No. 34 reaffirming its request for the acquisition of parking facilities near the Court House for County employees and requesting the County Board to endorse its request for parking facilities was presented.

Commissioner Scott moved, seconded by Commissioner Hanson that the Chairman of the County Board be directed to take up the matter with the Municipal Building Commission and that the proposed resolution be referred to the Legislative Committee. Motion unanimously carried.

A proposed resolution from Local No. 34 reaffirming its position supporting severance pay for accrued leave time credited to public employees and officials, and requesting the County Board to concur in the resolution, was presented and referred to the Attorney forthe County Board and Edward R. Kienitz, Executive Secretary of the County Welfare Board.

John J. Schaefer appeared before the Board urging that the use of the Pistol Range be enlarged so as to cooperate with the Commissioner of Conservation by including instruction in the safe use of firearms by minors, and that the Board authorize the adoption of an amendment to Laws of Minnesota 1953, Chapter 367 authorizing the public generally to use the facilities of the Range for marksmanship training.

The matter was referred to the Legislative Committee.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisements for bids, O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, proceeded to open bids for the following:

- 1. For the grading, gravel base and plant mixed bituminous surfacing of State Aid Road No. 10.
- 2. For the grading and plant mixed bituminous surfacing of State Aid Road No. 8.
 - 3. For furnishing Calcium Chloride.
 - 4. For furnishing Road Tar.
