Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, March 5, 1957

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

Members present: Commissioners Christensen, Hanson, Scott, and Chairman Matthews.

Member absent: Commissioner Ainsworth.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A statement of balances in the County Revenue Allowances as of February 28, 1957, received from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, was ordered published with the proceedings of the Board and placed on file.

A monthly report from Donald C. Bennyhoff, Register of Deeds and Registrar of Titles, was ordered placed on file.

A letter from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, submitting an agreement between the Village of Orono and the County for Police Radio Service was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Paul W. Keve, Director, Court Services, requesting mileage allowance for a new staff member in his department was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A contract and contract bond from Post Publishing Company for publishing the proceedings of the County Board outside the County seat were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A notice of hearing before the Railroad and Warehouse Commission on the application of Ferdie Skaurud for a certificate of public convenience and necessity as an auto transportation company for the transportation of freight was referred to the County Engineer.

A letter from George M. Scott, County Attorney, relative to the proposed contract for keeping federal prisoners in the County Jail was read.

Commissioner Christensen moved, seconded by Commissioner Hanson that the Chairman of the County Board be authorized to sign the agreement.

- 2. Submitting an agreement between the City of Hopkins and the County providing for the division of costs for the grading, concrete surfacing and other improvements to State Aid Road No. 3. Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, as follows:

1. Notifying the Board of the acceptance of the low bids of

Bryan Rock Products, Inc. for furnishing crushed rock to the Highway Department and of Dictating Machine Sales Company for furnishing three (3) typing mechanisms for the office of the Register of Deeds, and requesting that funds be set aside to pay said awards.

2. Requesting the setting aside of funds from the County
Reserve Building and Maintenance Appropriation to the MinneapolisHoneywell Regulator Company for replacing a pressure reducing valve and
for servicing controls damaged by escaping water at the Juvenile
Center.

The above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Specifications were received for the road mixed bituminous surfacing of State Aid Road No. 94 and for maintenance of spar buoys and bay name signs at Lake Minnetonka. Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Jack B. Young, Secretary of the Richfield-Bloomington Sportsman's Club requesting the oiling of a portion of France Avenue South that borders the Sportsman's Club was read and referred to the County Engineer.

A certificate for the meretorious support provided in the development of the Minnesota Youth Firearms training program was received from Don Wendling, County Director, ordered acknowledged, and placed on file.

At 10:20 o'clock A.M., continued hearing was called for on the petition for theimprovement of County Ditch No. 13 (Shingle Creek).

A letter from the Board of Park Commissioners, City of Minneapolis, was read, requesting that the said petition be dismissed and recommending that the proper officers of the Board be authorized to join with the City Council and others in filing a new petition for the reconstruction and improvement of said County Ditch No. 13.

Commissioner Scott moved, seconded by Commissioner Christensen that the hearing be continued to April 9, 1957, at 10:20 o'clock A.M., in Committee Room 130 Court House, Minneapolis.

A letter from the Minneapolis, Northfield and Southern Railway serving notice upon the County of Hennepin of the termination of the lease and contract dated February 5, 1940, three years from this date (April 8, 1957) which leases to Hennepin County the vehicular portion of the bridge for highway travel across the Minnesota River in the vicinity of Savage, was read and referred to L. A letter from F. Wilson Pond, Secretary of the Hennepin County Soil Conservation District, submitting additional information relative to their request for additional funds was read and referred to Commissioner Ainsworth.

A letter from Arthur A. Frank requesting that adequate drainage ditches be dug leading to the culvert passing under Wilshire Drive and also requesting the lowering of the culvert to allow the water to drain completely, was read and referred to the committee appointed by the County Board April 2nd to make an investigation of surface water conditions.
