Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, May 14, 1957

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten
o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

Monthly reports from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, and from George G. Roadfeldt, County Agricultural Agent, were ordered placed on file.

A report on the County Highway Department budget received from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, was ordered placed on file.

Resolutions from the Villages of Champlin, Plymouth, Medina, and Long Lake requesting the activation of a County Park District were ordered acknowledged and placed on file.

A notice of hearing before the Railroad and Warehouse Commission on the application of Minnesota-Wisconsin Truck Lines for a certificate for the transportation of freight was presented and referred to the County Engineer.

A notice of hearing before the Federal Power Commission on the requests of St. Anthony Falls Water Power Company, Minneapolis Mill

Company and Northern States Power Company for an order approving the trasnfer in license was referred to the County Attorney and the County Engineer.

Letters from Elmer H. Larson, Land Commissioner, submitting applications from the Trustees of the Northwest Conference of African M.E. Church and from Duane W. Foss and Irving L. Hork for the repurchase of certain tax forfeited property were referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

Letters were received from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, as follows:

- 1. Requesting the transfer of funds to cover an overrun in the Miller-Davis Company contract for furnishing certificates of title and memorial sheets to the Registrar of Titles.
- 2. Submitting an agreement between Hennepin County and Ernst & Ernst, Accountants, for development of an accounting system for the Hennepin County Highway Department.
- 3. Reporting on an adjustment of funds within the Road and Bridge appropriation.

The above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Specifications for grader blades and cutting edges for the Highway

Juvenile Center were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, requesting approval of an agreement between Hennepin County and the Village of Shorewood for police radio service was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from George X. Connor, Attorney, relative to the claim of

Mrs. Anna Bridget Larkin for accumulated sick leave and vacation pay for her deceased husband, Martin Larkin, was read and referred to the Attorney for the Board.

A letter from Paul W. Keve, Director, Department of Court Services, requesting mileage allowance for a staff member, was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, requesting authorization for himself and Edward C. Carlson, Chief Accountant, to attend the Municipal Finance Officers Convention in St. Paul was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Ralph A. Hutchinson requesting permission to erect a dock on County-owned property was referred to the Committee of the Whole.

A letter from the Board of Directors of the Minneapolis Society of Residential Appraisers urging the appointment of Russell B. Connery as Supervisor of Assessments was ordered placed on file.

A notice from the Twin City Carpenters District Council of a wage scale increase was read, ordered acknowledged and referred to the Building Commission.

A notice from the Citizens League that hereafter Elmer L. Jacobson rather than Albert J. Richter will attend the County Board meetings was ordered acknowledged and placed on file.

A claim from the Minnesota Good Roads Association for the 1957 subscription for highway information and consultant service was referred to the Committee of the Whole.

A letter from the Minnesota State Highway Department relative to the 1957 allotment of State Road and Bridge Funds was ordered acknowledge and placed on file.

A letter from Liebenberg & Kaplan, Architects, notifying the Board that the Hennepin County Juvenile Center is substantially completed and ready for acceptance was read and referred to the Chairman of the County Board.

A letter from Eugene A. Gelle, Town of Dayton, requesting financial assistance for the improvement of roads within the township was read and referred to the Chairman of the Road and Lake Committee.

Commissioner Scott moved, seconded by Commissioner Christensen that the Attorney for the County Board be requested for an opinion as to the application of Chapter 945 Laws of Minnesota 1957 to severance pay for County employees under the jurisdiction of the County Board.

Motion uanimously carried.

Commissioner Hanson moved, seconded by Commissioner Ainsworth that the Supervisor of Assessments be authorized to employ a photographer at a salary of \$376.58 per month plus mileage.

Commissioner Scott moved, seconded by Commissioner Ainsworth that the matter be referred to the Committee on Taxes.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisements for bids, O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, proceeded to open bids for furnishing bodily injury or death and property

damage insurance to the County.
