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Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, October 1, 1957

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten
o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

Members present: Commissioners Ainsworth, Christensen, Scott, and Chairman Matthews.

Member absent: Commissioner Hanson. .

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A monthly report received from Donald C. Bennyhoff, Register of Deeds and Registrar of Titles, was ordered placed on file.

Letters from Paul W. Keve, Director, Department of Court Services, and from Geo. A. Totten, Jr., County Treasurer, requesting an automobile allowance for various employees was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, as follows:

1. Submitting severance payrolls for Raymond Weegman, Joel Olson, and George Julsen, former Road and Bridge employees.

Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott that the payrolls be approved and ordered paid.

2. Informing the Board of the cost per foot of the property purchased for right of way for County Road No. 18. Ordered held.

Letters were received from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, as follows:

- Requesting that funds be set aside to the Jerome E. Begin contract for the grading and road mixed bituminous surfacing of State Aid Road No. 74. Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.
- 2. Requesting the cancellation of various completed road and bridge contracts. Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.
- 3. Requesting the setting aside of funds for the purchase of right of way for County Road No. 18 and State Aid Road No. 62. Ordered held until the cost per foot of such right of way is finally determined.

An order of the District Court making appointments and fixing salaries for personnel in the Probation Department, the Juvenile Center, and the Home School for Boys was ordered held pending a comparison of salaries with those in the County Welfare Department. The matter was referred to Edward R. Kienitz, Executive Secretary of the Welfare Department.

Specifications for furnishing real estate and personal property tax envelopes were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Geo. A. Totten, Jr., County Treasurer, requesting approval of the exchange of collateral securities by First National Bank of Minneapolis, was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from John K. Harvey, Assistant County Attorney, relative to the payment of claims in excess of a thousand dollars for the recapping of tires was read. Submitted with said letter was one from Raymond B. Vecellio, Public Examiner, notifying the Board that payment of the claim should be authorized. Both letters were ordered placed on file.

Certification from the Public Employee's Retirement Association of the amount to be levied for the Public Employee's Retirement Fund was read and referred to Commissioner Christensen.

A letter from George M. Scott, County Attorney, requesting transportation allowance was read and referred to the next County Board meeting.

A report on the bacteriological examination of the sample of water collected from the well at the County Highway maintenance garage at Osseo was read and referred to the County Engineer and the Committee of the Whole.

Letters from the Minneapolis Gas Company notifying the Board of the installation of gas mains affecting streets and avenues in the Villages of Golden Valley, St. Anthony, and Edina were received and referred to the County Engineer.

A letter from Howard W. Perkins, County Surveyor, notifying the

Board that his office has prepared a map of the park districts in Hennepin County for the Citizens League was read and ordered placed on file.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisements for bids, O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, proceeded to open bids for the grading of State Aid Road No. 51.

The bids were referred to the Purchasing Agent for tabulation and report to the Board.

The Board of County Commissioners offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 806, Laws of Minnesota 1955 as amended by Laws of Minnesota 1957 Chapter 588, a majority of the governing bodies of the cities and villages of Hennepin County have by authorized resolution made application to this board for activation of a park district of all of Hennepin County except the City of Minneapolis and accompanied said application by an accurate map of the territory to be included in the proposed park district; and

WHEREAS, this board on June 11, 1957 by resolution set a time for hearing the application for activation of a single county park district at an adjourned meeting to be held Monday, July 1, 1957 at 10 o'clock A.M. in Room 130 at the Court House City of Minneapolis, its regular meeting place; and

WHEREAS, on the date of said hearing, July 1, 1957, this board met at its regular meeting place, Room 130 Court House at 10 o'clock A.M. and heard all interested parties on said matter and thereafter adjourned to reconvene for the convenience of the public at Maple Hill Farm at Lake Independence where further hearings were held and interested parties heard and then reconvened at Room 130 Court House and adjourned; and

WHEREAS, at such hearing, this board found the application for activation of a single county park district to be sufficient

and that such activation will be conducive to the general welfare.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That this board find it be conducive to the general welfare to activate a single county park district in Hennepin County and the said park district to be designated as all the area of Hennepin County exclusive of the City of Minneapolis.

WHEREAS, This board has divided the area into four election districts of similar shape no one of which contains more than 5% more area than any other, which division appears on the map outlined in red color and numbered one through four, attached hereto and made a part hereof;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the election districts as they appear on the map attached hereto and numbered one through four be adopted by this board as the election districts of the single county park district pursuant to Chapter 806 Laws of Minnesota 1955 Section 3.
