Tuesday, January 7, 1958

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

The meeting was called to order by Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, and there were present:

Commissioner Richard O. Hanson First District
Commissioner George W. Matthews . . . Second District
Commissioner A. P. Eberl Third District
Commissioner I. G. Scott Fourth District
Commissioner S. E. Ainsworth Fifth District

Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, called for nominations for chairman of the County Board of Hennepin County, Minnesota, for the ensuing year. Commissioner Scott moved, seconded by Commissioner Hanson and unanimously carried, to proceed to ballot for a chairman. Mr. Fitzsimmons designated Commissioners Scott and Eberl to act as tellers. The tellers announced five ballots for Commissioner Matthews for chairman. Mr. Fitzsimmons declared Commissioner Matthews elected chairman of the County Board for the year 1958.

Chairman Matthews took the chair and called for nominations for vice-chairman of the County Board of Hennepin County, Minnesota,

for the ensuing year. The tellers announced four ballots for Commissioner Ainsworth for vice-chairman of the County Board, one ballot being blank. Chairman Matthews declared Commissioner Ainsworth elected vice-chairman of the County Board for the year 1958.

Chairman Matthews made a report on the accomplishments of the Board and its various committees during the year 1957.

A statement of balances in the County Revenue Allowances as of December 31, 1957, received from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, was ordered published with the proceedings of the County Board and placed on file.

Monthly and annual reports received from Donald C. Bennyhoff, Register of Deeds and Registrar of Titles, were ordered placed on file.

A contract and contract bond from Ford Deep Rock Oil Company for furnishing gasoline to the Highway Department and the Home School for Boys, were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A contract from Avenue Garage for housing and storage of the Sheriff's automobiles was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from the Minneapolis Health Department requesting the commitment of a patient to Glen Lake Sanatorium was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from the State Association of County Commissioners relative to the submission of any matters which should be presented to the resolutions committee in order that recommendations of the committee can be sent to the Commissioners prior to the annual convention was referred to the Chairman of the County Board.

Letters from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, requesting

that funds be set aside to various contracts were received as follows:

- Eddy's Baking Company for furnishing bakery goods to the County Jail and the Hennepin County Juvenile Center.
- 2. Jay Kline Chevrolet Company for furnishing six (6) station wagons and four (4) 2-door sedans for the Sheriff's office.
- 3. Drive-Ur-Self Systems, Inc. for rental of trucks for the survey crews.
- 4. Western Oil & Fuel Company, Dickey & Shaver, Inc., and Minneapolis Standard Garage for furnishing gasoline and oil for the Sheriff's cars.
 - 5. Avenue Garage for storage of the Sheriff's vehicles.
- 6. Board of Park Commissioners, City of Minneapolis, for the planting of evergreens and shrubbery and for general landscape work at the Juvenile Center.
- 7. Remington Rand Division for furnishing visible record equipment for the Supervisor of Assessments.
- 8. Osseo Motor Company for furnishing one (1) Chevrolet truck with platform body for the Highway Department.
- 9. International Harvester Company for furnishing two (2) 3-ton trucks with snow plows and fifth wheels for the Highway Department.
- 10. Ford Deep Rock Oil Company for furnishing gasoline to the Highway Department and the Home School for Boys.
- 11. Skelly Oil Company for furnishing diesel fuel and heating oil for various County departments.

A letter from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, notifying the Board of the acceptance of the Anderson Agency bid for furnishing Workmen's Compensation Insurance for Hennepin County employees was ordered placed on file.

Letters from Roy Haeg, Supervisor of Assessments, requesting the hiring of a temporary employee and requesting also an increase in salary for Herbert Johnson, Jr. were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from L. P. Zimmerman, State Commissioner of Highways, expressing appreciation for the continued cooperation and vision of the County Board in their support of the 13th Annual Institute for County Highway Engineers, was read and ordered placed on file.

A severance payroll for Martin Larkin, deceased, former Weed and Seed Inspector for Hennepin County, was presented. Commissioner Ainswortl moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott that the payroll as presented, be approved and paid from the Noxious Weeds Fund.

The vote on the motion was as follows: Ainsworth yea, Eberl yea, Hanson yea, Scott yea, Chairman Matthews yea.

A letter from Hugo G. Erickson, City Engineer, submitting a correction of his informative letter of October 8th, 1957, relative to County Ditch No. 40, was read and referred to the County Highway Engineer.

A letter from Frank E. Adams, Veterans Service Officer, thanking the County Board for past favors, was read and ordered placed on file.

A letter from William G. Guthrie, M.D., County Coroner, notifying the Board of the employment of Ernest G. Schmidt as principal assistant, was ordered acknowledged and placed on file.

A letter from the Hennepin County Committee, Minnesota Statehood Centennial, notifying the Board of the appointment of George W. Matthews, Chairman of the County Board, to membership on the Centennial Committee, was read, ordered acknowledged, and placed on file.

A letter from Leonard Kendall, President, Lutheran Minnesota Conference of the Augustana Church, expressing appreciation for the moments of silent prayer honoring the memory of Jens Christensen, former County Commissioner, was read and ordered placed on file.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisements for bids, O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, proceeded to open bids for the following:
