Tuesday, February 11, 1958

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis on Tuesday, February 11, 1958, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A statement of balances in the County Revenue Allowances as of January 31, 1958, received from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, was ordered published with the proceedings of the Board and placed on file.

A monthly report from George G. Roadfeldt, County Extension Agent, was ordered placed on file.

A letter from Avis P. Nelson, County Superintendent of Schools, thanking the Board for the authorization to attend the annual meeting of the American Association of School Administrators was read and ordered placed on file.

Letters from the Minneapolis Health Department requesting the commitment of three patients to Glen Lake Sanatorium were referred to

the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Roy Haeg, Supervisor of Assessments, requesting the hiring of a temporary employee in his office was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, submitting a list of claims to be charged against the Contributions and Awards Fund was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, as follows:

- 1. Submitting a resolution appointing the Commissioner of Highways the agent of Hennepin County and the Agency Contract for the improvement of County State Aid Highway No. 19. Referred to the Road and Lake Committee.
- 2. Recommending the setting aside of funds to the Village of Shorewood for the improvement of St. Albans Bay road. Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Bergmann Richards, Attorney for George W. Harsh, requesting the vacation of a county road easement over his client's property in the Village of Edina, was read and referred to the County Engineer and the Attorney for the County Board.

Specifications were received for the following:

- 1. Tire recapping.
- Erection of a steel plate pipe arch culvert and channel change.
 - 3. Two (2) 2-1/4 cu. yd. front end loaders.
 - 4. One (1) 1-1/2 cu. yd. front end loader.
 - 5. Roller.

The above specifications were referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

Contracts and contract bonds were received from the following:

- Post Publishing Company for publishing the proceedings of the County Board and the Financial Statement of Hennepin County outside the County Seat.
- 2. Red W. Hedberg & Sons and Woodrich Construction Company for furnishing sand to the County Highway Department during the year 1958.
- 3. Republic Creosoting Company for furnishing road tar to the Highway Department.

The above contracts and bonds were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from the Village of Loretto requesting the County Board to petition the Railroad and Warehouse Commission for the installation of automatic signals at the railroad crossing in the Village on County Road No. 19.

Referred to the County Engineer and the Chairman of the Road and Lake Committee.

A letter from the Town Board of Eden Prairie requesting financial assistance for repairing some of the hard surfaced roads which were turned back to the town was read and referred to the County Engineer and the Chairman of the Road and Lake Committee for recommendation.

Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott that Germaine Boll, Minnetrista, and Everett Thies, Hamel, be appointed to the Hennepin County Extension Committee, each to serve for a term of three (3) years from January 1, 1958; and

That Russell Johnson, Maple Plain, be appointed to serve on said

committee for a term of one (1) year from January 1, 1958.

Motion unanimously carried.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisement for bids, O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, proceeded to open bids for a compressor for the County Surveyor's department.

The bids were referred to Mr. Pearson and the County Surveyor for tabulation and recommendation.

Only one bid was received for furnishing Scotchlite materials to the County. Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott that the bid be rejected and returned unopened to the bidder, and that O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent be directed to readvertise for bids for furnishing Scotchlite materials, bids to be opened on Tuesday, February 25, 1958, at 10:15 o'clock A.M.

At 10:20 o'clock A.M., hearing was called for on the petition of R. V. and Marian L. Ramstack asking that their land described in said petition be set off from School District No. 109 in Carver County to School District No. 276 in Hennepin County.

The Clerk to the Board presented the publisher's affidavit of publishing the notices of hearing, the Sheriff's return of posting said notices and the County Auditor's certificate of mailing the notices of hearing.

A letter from Avis P. Nelson, County Superintendent of Schools, recommending that the petition be granted, was read.

There was no appearance against the granting of the petition.

The matter was referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

Commissioner Eberl from the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings presented the following report:

ORDER SETTING OFF FREEHOLDERS FROM ONE SCHOOL DISTRICT TO ANOTHER

STATE OF MINNESOTA)
(COUNTY OF HENNEPIN)

At a regular meeting of the County Board of Hennepin County, State of Minnesota, held on the 11th day of February, 1958, the petition of R. V.Ramstack and Marian L. Ramstack asking that their land described in said petition be set off from School District No. 109 in Carver County to School District No. 276 in Hennepin County, came on to be heard by said Board; and it having been made to appear to its satisfaction that notice of said hearing had been published, posted, and served as required by law and its order, said Board, having heard all persons interested in said matter, both for and against, finds as follows:

That said petitioners are residents and freeholders of said county; and that they own land now in School District No. 109 in Carver County described as follows, to-wit:

1.3 acres of Lots One (1) and Two (2) Section 6, Township 116, Range 23, Carver County, State of Minnesota

and that saidland adjoins School District No. 276 in Hennepin County.

That the reasons for setting off said land of petitioners, as stated in said petition, are as follows:

The Excelsior community and the school maintained by District No. 276 are located only 1.5 miles from petitioner's home, whereas the school of District 109 is 5.5 miles from petitioner's home. Petitioner's children have always attended School District 276, and the bus from District 276 comes right up to the petitioner's home, whereas the

school bus from District 109 does not come near petitioner's home.
All social and economic activities of petitioners are centered around the Excelsior community, and the school of District 276 of Hennepin County.

That there is attached hereto and made a part hereof a copy of the Order of the County Board of Carver County, Minnesota, authorizing the transfer from District No. 109 Carver County to District 276 Hennepin

County.

IT IS THEREFORE DETERMINED AND ORDERED: That the said land of said petitioners as above described be, and the same hereby is set off from School District No. 109 in Carver County to said School District No. 276 in Hennepin County, and that hereafter said land be and constitute a part of said School District No. 276 Hennepin County.
