Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, March 18, 1958

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten
o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

The Sixth Grade pupils from the Earle Brown School, accompanied by their teacher, were in attendance at the meeting.

A letter from Paul W. Keve, Director, Department of Court Services, requesting authorization for the disbursement of funds from the Caleb Doerr Trust Fund to pay the cost for establishing a new dental clinic at the Home School for Boys was read and referred to the Attorney for the Board.

A letter from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, submitting a list of claims chargeable to the Contributions and Awards Fund was ordered held.

A telegram from Senator Edward J. Thye acknowledging receipt of the County Board resolution relative to federal work projects in Hennepin County was read, ordered acknowledged, and placed on file.

A letter from L. P. Zimmerman, Commissioner of State Highways,

relative to the documentary stamp tax on deeds of conveyance running to the state or to political subdivisions was referred to the County Engineer, the Attorney for the Board, and the Committee of the Whole.

A letter from L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, recommending the allocation of funds to the Village of Minnetonka Beach for placing a bituminous seal coat mat on Westwood, Woodbridge, Lafayette, and Huntington Point roads in said village was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, as follows:

- l. Requesting the setting aside of funds from the County
  Reserve Building and Maintenance Fund to the Pioneer Power Sales, Inc.
  contract for the steam line rehabilitation at the Home School for Boys.
- 2. Notifying the Board of the acceptance of the low bid of Park Construction Company for the erection of a structural plate arch culvert and channel change at Bridge No. 480 and requesting that funds be set aside to pay said award.

The above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A notice of public hearing from the Industrial Commission on minimum wages on projects in excess of \$2500.00 was read and referred to the County Engineer.

An application for waiver of costs, penalties and interest on property owned by the Northwestern Bible College, College of Liberal Arts, Theological Seminary College, was presented.

Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Hanson that the above application for waiver of costs, penalties, and interest

in the amount of \$1,422.10 be approved and forwarded to the Commissioner of Taxation for consideration.

Mr. Kuluvar of the Safety Firearms Program appeared before the Board requesting a county levy for the maintenance of the firearms program. The matter was tabled for further discussion by the Board.

Attention was called to the County Welfare Day meeting to be held at the Leamington Hotel on Tuesday, March 25th and the Board members were requested to take note of the time and place of the meeting.

Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, March 25, 1958

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten
o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

The Board members spoke of the sudden death of Mr. Roy
Brumfield, Assistant County Attorney, and of their own personal
sorrow in his passing, and requested George W. Matthews, Chairman of
the Board, to write to Mrs. Brumfield expressing their sympathy in the
loss of her husband.

Letters acknowledging receipt of copies of the County Board resolution urging immediate action to combat unemployment in this area were received from Congressmen Walter H. Judd, Roy W. Wier, Joseph P. O'Hara, Fred Marshall, and Eugene J. McCarthy, and ordered placed on file.

Letters were received from L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, as follows:

1. Recommending the adoption of the resolution exempting the

state and its political subdivisions from placing federal documentary stamps on deeds of conveyance to them. Referred to the Chairman of the Board.

- 2. Submitting seven (7) agreements for the division of costs for proposed construction of County State Aid Highways in the City of Minneapolis. Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.
- 3. Submitting an agreement for the division of costs between the County of Hennepin and the Villages of Loretto and Medina for the improvment of C.S.A.H. No. 19. Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Specifications for furnishing laundry equipment at the Home School for Boys and target ammunition for the Sheriff's department were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from John K. Harvey, Assistant County Attorney, relative to the request of Paul W. Keve, Director, Court Services, for a new dental clinic at the Home School for Boys to be paid for from the Caleb Doerr Trust Fund was read and referred to Commissioner Hanson.

A letter from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, submitting a list of claims to be charged against the Contributions and Awards Fund was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A contract and contract bond from Barton Contracting Company for furnishing hot plant mix bituminous materials to the County were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from the Hopkins Raspberry Festival Association requesting the use of the Fairgrounds during the Festival was referred to the County Engineer, the Budget and Purchasing Agent, and the Road and Lake Committee.

A letter from Ernst & Ernst addressed to O. A. Pearson, Purchasing Agent, submitting a statement in the amount of \$4,700.00 for services for the period from December 1, 1957 to March 15, 1958 and requesting additional time to assist County personnel in report preparation and monthly closing was read.

Commissioner Eberl moved, seconded by Commissioner Hanson that Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, be directed to set aside the sum of \$4,700.00 from the Road and Bridge Fund to the Ernst & Ernst contract to pay the statement submitted, and that the request for additional time be granted.

L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, reported on the alignment of the Crosstown Highway (62nd Street) and called the Board's attention to the necessity of having the alignment approved by the federal government.

Pederson, County Engineer, be directed to make the trip to Washington, D.C. for the purpose of securing approval of said alignment by the federal government, and that all necessary expenses incurred thereby be paid from the Road and Bridge fund upon presentation of a properly verified claim.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisements for bids, O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, proceeded to open bids for furnishing to Hennepin County for the County Highway Department one (1) 1-1/2 cubic yard front end loader and two (2) 2-1/4 front end loaders.

The bids were referred to the Budget and Purchasing Agent for tabulation and report to the Board.

Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, April 15, 1958

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A group of pupils from the Earle Brown School under the supervision of Mr. Rossin and Mrs. Clear were present at the meeting.

Chairman Matthews welcomed them and outlined the Board procedure to them.

Letters from Douglas K. Amdahl, Assistant County Attorney, submitting deeds for right of way on County State Aid Highway No. 62 (Crosstown) were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Elmer H. Larson, Land Commissioner, submitting an application from Leon V. Lorette to repurchase certain Tax Forfeited property was referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

A letter from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, submitting a radio service agreement for a fire truck at Wayzata was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A contract between the Library Board of the City of Minneapolis and Hennepin County providing for library extension service in Hennepin County outside the cities of Minneapolis and Hopkins was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, submitting a list of claims to be paid from the Contributions and Awards Fund was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Petitions from School Districts No. 567, No. 575, No. 576, No. 577, No. 589 and No. 590 requesting the dissolution and attachment of said districts to School District No. 883 (Rockford) were presented and referred to the Attorney for the County Board and the Superintendent of Schools.

A letter from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, notifying the Board of the acceptance of the low bid of Anderson & Sons, Inc. for concrete paving on 66th Street (MCSA Street No. 53) was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Specifications for furnishing tractors and scrapers on an hourly rental basis and for the gravel base and road mixed bituminous surfacing of County State Aid Highway No. 92 were referred to the Committee on Roads and Lakes.

Contract and contract bond from Lake Minnetonka Dredging Company for maintenance of buoys and bay name signs at Lake Minnetonka were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, submitting a supplemental agreement between the County and the Soo Line Railway Company for permission to enter upon the railway company's right of way to construct an outlet ditch necessary in the improvement of County State Aid Highway No. 19 was referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

A letter from Joseph Wortman, St. Bonifacius, Minnesota, objecting to the removal of bounties on foxes and requesting payment of the bounty on foxes he shot prior to such removal was read and referred to the Attorney for the Board.

A letter from the West Gate Realty Company requesting the installation of a sign on the County highway right of way across the road from their office at Spring Park was read and referred to the County Engineer and the Chairman of the Road and Lake Committee.

L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, reported that the Village of Bloomington had reconsidered their refusal to pay their proportionate share of the cost of installing automatic signals on County Highway No. 1 at the Minneapolis, Northfield and Southern Railway crossing in Bloomington.
