Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, May 27, 1958

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

An order from the Industrial Commission of Minnesota determining minimum wages to be paid on certain public works was presented and ordered placed on file.

Letters were received from John K. Harvey, Assistant County Attorney, as follows:

- 1. Submitting a nominating petition relative to the establishment of a Lower Minnesota Watershed District. Referred to Commissioner Ainsworth. Vice Chairman of the Board.
- 2. Relative to special assessments on certain property in the Village of Crystal on which Hennepin County holds a road easement.
 Ordered placed on file.

A letter from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, submitting

a list of claims against the Contributions and Awards Fund was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Paul W. Keve, Director, Department of Court Services, requesting approval of the release of funds from the Caleb Doerr Trust ing
Fund to aid in initiat/ a chaplaincy service at the Home School for
Boys was referred to the Attorney for the County Board.

A letter from George M. Scott, County Attorney, stating that the petition for the dissolution and attachment of Common School District No. 568 meets the requirements of the law was read and referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

Letters were received from L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, as follows:

- 1. Submitting an agreement for the division of costs for the improvement of County State Aid Highway No. 10.
- 2. Recommending the granting of Village Aid allotment to the Village of Mound for the improvement of sections of Old County Highways No. 7 and No. 125 in said village.

The above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, notifying the Board of the acceptance of the low bid of Anderson & Sons, Inc. for the improvement of a portion of County State Aid Street No. 53 and requesting that funds be set aside to pay said award was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A contract and contract bond from Alexco Aggregates, Inc. for furnishing the season's requirements of gravel for the Highway Department were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Milton G. Ouimette, Attorney, stating that he is the Secretary-Treasurer of the J. E. Meyers Memorial Park Association which owns and operates the DeMolay Camp on Enchanted Island, Lake Minnetonka, and requesting that the road on said island be maintained in a respectable and passable condition was referred to the County Engineer and the Road and Lake Committee.

A letter was read from B. O. Sivertsen, Assistant County Bookbinder, submitting his resignation as of June 15, 1958.

Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Eberl that Mr. Sivertsen's resignation be accepted.

Motion carried.

A letter from Edwin S. Stranberg, County Bookbinder, was read, suggesting the name of Franz O. Erickson, 6410 Glenwood Avenue, as Mr. Sivertsen's replacement.

Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Eberl that Franz O. Erickson, 6410 Glenwood Avenue, be appointed assistant County Bookbinder, effective June 16, 1958, at the established rate of pay for Journeymen Bookbinders of \$3.17 per hour or \$480.78 per month, said salary to be paid semi-monthly from the Bookbinder Appropriation on payrolls certified to the County Auditor.

Specifications for a monument for the Hennepin County Home
Cemetery were presented and referred to John K. Harvey, Attorney for
the County Board.

Mr. Weisman, a resident on Manitou Channel, Lake Minnetonka, spoke in regard to the erosion of his land along the channel due to the heavy boat traffic through said channel. He requested that the channel be cribbed to prevent further erosion. The matter was referred to the County Engineer.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisements for bids, E. S. Vevea, Assistant District Engineer, Minnesota State Highway Department, proceeded to open bids as follows for the improvement of a portion of County State Aid Highway No. 19 in Loretto:

Black Top Service Company . . . \$117,104.25

Barton Construction Company . . . 114,795.14

Twin City Dirt Movers, Inc. . . . 119,603.63

After tabulation of the bids by Mr. Vevea and L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, Commissioner Scott moved, seconded by Commissioner Hanson that the County Board recommend to the State Highway Department acceptance of the low bid of Barton Construction Company in the amount of \$114,795.14 for the improvement of a portion of County State Aid Highway No. 19 in Loretto, State Project No. 27-607-01.

O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, then proceeded to open bids for rental of equipment at Lake Minnetonka and for drafting furniture for the County Highway Department.

Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Eberl that the sole bid of Lake Minnetonka Dredging Company for furnishing certain specified equipment on a rental basis for work at Lake Minnetonka, being Project No. 580, be accepted in the amount of \$64,282.00

That Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, be directed to set aside from the Lake Improvement Appropriation the sum of \$64,282.00 to pay said award; and

That the Chairman of the County Board be directed to sign the contract when bond is approved.

Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, June 17, 1958

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,

An application for license to sell non-intoxicating malt liquor was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from the Minneapolis Health Department requesting the commitment of a patient to Glen Lake Sanatorium was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, submitting a form of resolution requiring all house movers using County roads to furnish a bond or other security against damage to such roads, was referred to the Chairman of the County Board.

Letters were received from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, as follows:

- 1. Requesting that additional funds be set aside to the Republic Creosoting Company contract to pay for road tar in excess of the estimated quantity needed, and to the Naugle-Leck, Inc. contract for canopy and target construction at the Hennepin County Pistol Range.
- 2. Requesting the cancellation of balances remaining in certain completed road construction contracts and the restoration of said balances to the Road Construction Fund (Chap. 598).
- 3. Notifying the Board of the cancellation of the award made to Concrete Service Company for furnishing special aggregate "Buckshot" for seal coat because of the company's refusal to negotiate a bond and of the acceptance of the bid of Mapco Sand & Gravel Company, and requesting that funds be set aside to pay said award.
- 4. Requesting the transfer of fund encumbrances from the Road Construction Fund (Chap. 598) to Item 61 of the Road and Bridge Fund to conform with the new state aid allotment system.

All of the above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Plans and specifications for the grading, gravel base and road mixed bituminous base on a portion of County State Aid Highway No. 151 were referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

A letter from the Brotherhood of Painters, Paperhangers and Decorators Local Union No. 386 notifying the Board of minimum hourly wage increases for journeymen painters and for premium work, was read. The Board directed that the letter be acknowledged, informing the Union that the prevailing union rates are paid the various crafts working for the County.

An Order from the Railroad and Warehouse Commission in the matter of the overhead bridge carrying Minnetonka Boulevard (County State Aid Highway No. 5) over the right-of-way and tracks of the Great Northern Railway Company in the City of St. Louis Park was ordered placed on file.

L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, addressed the Board recommending that an overhead traffic signal be installed at the intersection of 63rd and Lyndale Avenue South to relieve the congested traffic at that point due to the 66th Street detour.

Commissioner Hanson suggested that instead of installing a traffic signal there, a policeman be stationed at that point during the day.

S. A. Frellsen, Director, Division of Waters, State of Minnesota, spoke in regard to federal aid for a watershed district.

Mr. W. D. Schoell from the Greater Minnetonka Council, mentioned the proposed establishment of a Minnetonka Watershed District.

Virgil C. Herrick, Executive Secretary of the Minnesota Water Resources Board, explained the law on the establishment of such districts and their function after establishment.

Chairman Matthews asked that opinions be voiced from others present at the meeting.

Mr. Edward Braddock, Park Engineer, City of Minneapolis, and Mr. D. J. Shama, Assistant City Attorney, Minneapolis, stated that the City of Minneapolis is interested in the establishment of watershed districts.

A. J. Lee, Village Engineer, Village of Brooklyn Center, directed a question to Mr. Herrick, asking if villages could proceed to solve their own water problems if watershed districts are established. Mr. Herrick stated that villages could cooperate with the watershed districts in solving their problems through the Joint Powers Act.

Mr. R.L. Krienke, Assessor for Brooklyn Park, spoke about the drainage problems in Brooklyn Park.

On a showing of hands called for by Chairman Matthews, a preference was shown for the establishment of a district for each watershed, rather than one district for Hennepin County.

The matter was referred to L. P. Pederson, County Engineer.
