Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, July 1, 1958

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten
o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

Members present: Commissioners Ainsworth, Hanson, Scott, and Chairman Matthews.

Member absent: Commissioner Eberl.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

Applications for license to sell non-intoxicating malt liquor were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, submitting a list of claims to be paid from the Contributions and Awards Fund was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from the Minneapolis Health Department requesting the commitment of a patient to Glen Lake Sanatorium was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from George M. Scott, County Attorney, as follows:

1. Relative to the petition for dissolution of School District

No. 568 (Corcoran) and the proper procedure for appeal from the order of dissolution.

The Board directed that the letter be placed on file and a copy sent to Mr. Dease, a freeholder in said school district who had protested the legality of the petition at the last Board meeting.

2. Submitting a bid from Gerald R. Olstad for purchase of certain real property foreclosed under an Old Age AssistanceLien. Referred to Commissioner Hanson.

A letter from Paul W. Keve, Director of Court Services, requesting mileage allowance for certain persons in his department and the removal of one name from the list of those persons eligible for mileage allowance was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, submitting an agreement for the division of costs between the County of Hennepin and the Village of Minnetonka for the improvement of a section of County State Aid Highway No. 61 was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, as follows:

- 1. Requesting the setting aside of funds from Item 61 "Construction Contracts" of the Road and Bridge appropriation to the Craig J. Alexander contract for the improvement of a portion of County State Aid Highway No. 92.
- 2. Requesting that funds be set aside to Park Construction
  Company for the improvement of County State Aid Highway No. 156 from
  Item 61 "Construction Contracts" of the Road and Bridge appropriation
  and that funds heretofore set aside from the Road Construction Fund

(Chapter 598) be restored to said fund.

3. Requesting the setting aside of additional funds from the County Reserve Building and Maintenance Fund to the Liebenberg & Kaplan contract for architectural services at the Hennepin County Pistol Range.

All of the above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Specifications for furnishing copy machine paper for the Auditor's office were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Contracts and contract bonds were received from the following:

- 1. William J. Corah Excavating Company for improvement of a section of County State Aid Highway No. 10.
- 2. Myron P. Nelson Company for cleaning and painting the Narrows Bridge at Lake Minnetonka.

Said contracts and bonds were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

T. Wesley McMahon, Attorney for John Lambert of Corcoran, appeared before the Board explaining that Mr.Lambert's application for license to sell non-intoxicating malt liquor had been refused by the Sheriff, and requesting that the County Board grant such license to Mr.Lambert. Deputy Sheriff J. W. Whitney cited the reasons given in the law for the Sheriff's refusal to sign said application.

After consideration of the matter by the Board, Commissioner Scott moved, seconded by Commissioner Ainsworth that a license expiring on June 30, 1959, to sell non-intoxicating malt liquor be granted to John Lambert of the Town of Corcoran.

The vote on the motion was as follows: Ainsworth yea, Eberl absent, Hanson nay, Scott yea, Chairman Matthews nay.

Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, July 15, 1958

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

A letter from L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, submitting an agency agreement with the State of Minnesota and form of resolution for the improvement of County State Aid Highway No. 19 at the intersection of C.S.A.H. No. 24 was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A contract and contract bond from Mapco Sand and Gravel Company for furnishing special aggregate "Buckshot" to the County during the 1958 season were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.
