Tuesday, August 5, 1958

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis at ten
o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A Statement of Balances in the County Revenue Allowance as of July 31, 1958, received from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, was ordered published with the proceedings of the Board and placed on file.

Monthly reports received from Donald C. Bennyhoff, Register of Deeds and Registrar of Titles, and from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, were ordered placed on file.

A letter from Elmer H. Larson, Land Commissioner, submitting an application from the City of Minneapolis for conveyance of certain tax forfeited lands for street purposes was referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

Letters from the Minneapolis Health Department requesting the commitment of two patients to Glen Lake Sanatorium were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A Police Radio Service Agreement between Hennepin County and the Village of Spring Lake Park in Anoka County was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, as follows:

- 1. Requesting the transfer of funds from the Emergency Fund to the Veterans Service Department temporary salary fund.
- Submitting a list of claims to be paid from the Contributions and Awards Fund.

The above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, as follows:

- Requesting the termination of lease for a gravel pit in Wright County. Referred to the Road and Lake Committee.
- Submitting a payroll for severance and vacation pay for Sander Swanson, a Road and Bridge employee.

Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Eberl that the said payroll be approved and ordered paid.

2. Notifying the Board of the acceptance of the low bid of Moore Business Forms, Inc. for furnishing tax statements for the County Treasurer and requesting that funds be set aside to pay said award.

The above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Plans and specifications for the grading of County State Aid
Highway No. 151 and for the grading of County Highway No. 90 were received and referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

Commissioner Matthews offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, The legislature of this state by Minnesota Statutes 1953, Chapter 12 has enacted legislation to establish the Civil Defense Agency to protect the public peace, health and safety and to provide for the common defense, and

WHEREAS, It is necessary that such Civil Defense Agency be fully operative in the area of local self government, and

WHEREAS, The Sheriff of this county has informed this board of his plan for civil defense operation within the County of Hennepin, and

WHEREAS, This board, at a meeting held on July 31, 1958, attended by the Sheriff of Hennepin County, a representative of the State Civil Defense Agency and the District Director of the local Civil Defense Agency, and at such meeting the needs of Hennepin County with respect to civil defense operation were discussed and determined, and

WHEREAS, The sum of \$25,000.00 was found to be necessary to provide an adequate Civil Defense Agency in Hennepin County, and the said sum of \$25,000.00 was approved as an adequate sum by the State Civil Defense Agency, the District Director of Civil Defense and the Sheriff of Hennepin County for financing civil defense functions within the county and in cooperation with the state agency and other political subdivisions within the state for the year 1959,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That this board hereby approves the appropriation of \$25,000.00 for the year 1959 and recommends that the above amount be placed as an item in the budget of the County Commissioners in the year 1959.

At 10:40 o'clockA.M., the County Board recessed for one minute.

At 10:41 o'clock A.M., Chairman Matthews again called the Board to order.

A letter from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, submitting a list of claims against the Contributions and Awards Fund was referred to the Ways and Means Committee.

Letters were received from the Minneapolis Health Department requesting the commitment of patients to Glen Lake Sanatorium and were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Specifications for barricade mounted electric warning lights for the Highway Department were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter was read from Donald C. Bennyhoff, Register of Deeds, expressing his gratitude for the cooperation he has received from the Board during his term of office. His letter was acknowledged and ordered placed on file.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisements for bids, E.
