Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, October 7, 1958

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten
o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

Members present: Commissioners Ainsworth, Eberl, Scott, and Chairman Matthews.

Member absent: Commissioner Hanson.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A statement of balances in the County Revenue Allowances as of September 30, 1958, received from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, was ordered published with the proceedings of the Board and placed on file.

Monthly reports received from Donald C. Bennyhoff, Register of Deeds and Registrar of Titles, and from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, were ordered placed on file.

A letter from Paul W. Keve, Director, Department of Court Services, requesting auto allowance for an employee in his department and the removal of two names from the list of those eligible to receive such allowance was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means. A letter from Kenneth F. McNulty, Assistant Land Commissioner, submitting a special assessment list for the City of Minneapolis for improvements on tax forfeited land was referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

Letters were received from John K. Harvey, Assistant County
Attorney, submitting a warranty deed for right-of-way along County
State Aid Highway No. 62 (Crosstown) and an easement for right-of-way
along County State Aid Highway No. 61. Referred to the Committee on
Ways and Means.

A letter from Henry A. Johnson, Attorney, protesting on behalf of his client the delay in the improvement of County State Aid Highway No. 10 (Bass Lake Road) in Crystal, was referred to the Road and Lake Committee, the County Engineer, and the County Attorney.

Plans and specifications for the general construction, heating, electrical, ventilating and air-conditioning, automatic temperature control, and plumbing construction at the Hennepin County Highway Department Administration Building were referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

Letters were received from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, as follows:

- 1. Requesting the allowance of registration expenses for persons attending the Federal Management Conference held at the Curtis Hotel October 2nd and 3rd, 1958.
- 2. Notifying the Board of the acceptance of the low bid of Heinrich Envelope Company for furnishing tax envelopes for the County Treasurer and requesting that funds be set aside to pay said award.

3. Notifying the Board of the acceptance of the low bid of C. S. McCrossan, Inc. for the grading, gravel base, and plant mixed bituminous surfacing of a section of County State Aid Highway No. 102.

All of the above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Contracts and contract bonds from Barton Contracting Company for the bituminous surfacing of a section of County State Aid Highways No. 5 and No. 18 (Projects No. 5835 and No. 5834) were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

An application for an adjustment of taxes on property owned by Economy Refrigerated Lockers was presented.

Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott that the application be denied and that the matter be referred to the County Board, F. Gordon Wright, Attorney for the applicant, R. L. Brubacher, City Manager for Hopkins, and Clifford Peterson, Hopkins Assessor.

Motion unanimously carried.

The budget for Glen Lake Sanatorium for the year 1959 was presented. After discussion by the County Board with representatives from the Sanatorium, the Nurses Association, and the Union Committee, Commissioner Eberl moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott that the budget as presented be held for one week.

The vote on the motion was as follows: Ainsworth nay, Eberl yea, Hanson absent, Scott yea, Chairman Matthews nay.

Motion lost.

NOW, THEREFORE, This Board does hereby determine that the value of each such parcel of tax-forfeited land described in said resolution and certificate and also described in the listshereinafter referred to was enhanced by such improvement to the extent of the amount set opposite each parcel in said resolution, certificate, and lists, and that such amount should be added as a separate item to the existing appraised value of each such parcel; and

BE IT RESOLVED, By this Board that the appraised value for the purpose of sale of each such parcel of land which is described in the lists designated as List Nos. 91-A, 91-B, 91-C, and 91-D, Special Assessment Lists for the City of Minneapolis, is the existing appraised value of each such parcel plus the amount set opposite each such parcel in said lists and therein listed under the heading "Amt. of Assmt.", which said amount set opposite each such parcel is hereby included as a separate item in fixing said total appraised value of each of said parcels of land for the purpose of sale; and
