Tuesday, December 16, 1958

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten
o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

Mrs. Harold Hagen from the Wayzata League of Women Voters was present at the meeting.

A monthly report from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, was ordered placed on file.

A letter from Elmer H.Larson, Land Commissioners, requesting approval of the cancellation of sale of certain tax forfeited lands because of default by the purchaser was referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

Letters were received from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, as follows:

- Submitting a list of claims payable from the Contributions and Awards Fund. Ordered held.
- 2. Requesting the transfer of funds from the Emergency Fund to the budgets of the Supervisor of Assessments, County Commissioners, Official Publications, Probation Officers Department, Sheriff, and Treasurer to pay claims now due against said funds. Referred to the

Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Park Construction Company relative to the completion of their contract with the County for the improvement of a section of County State Aid Highway No. 156 was referred to the County Engineer.

A letter from the Village of Bloomington relative to the flooding conditions along Nine Mile Creek was referred to the Committee of the Whole.

Letters were received from L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, as follows:

l. Notifying the Board of his approval of the road improvement made by the Village of Champlin and recommending reimbursement to the village therefor from the Town and Village Aid Fund.

Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Eberl that reimbursement in the amount of \$310.16 be made to the Village of Champlin from the Town and Village Aid Fund for the road improvement made within their village.

Motion unanimously carried.

2. Requesting reimbursement of expenses incurred by attendance at the County Highway Engineers' Institute held at the University of Minnesota from December 8th through the 11th. Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, as follows:

1. Requesting the transfer of funds from the Road Construction Fund (Chap. 598) to pay for additional purchases of right-of-way needed for the construction of County State Aid Highway No. 24.

- Requesting cancellation of funds in the Farnsworth Construction
 Company contract for concrete piers for oil tanks at the Highway Shop
 Building.
- 3. Requesting the cancellation of the balance remaining in the Agricultural Service, Inc. contract for weed chemicals and restoration of the amount so cancelled to the Noxious Weeds Fund.
- 4. Requesting the setting aside of funds to pay additional claims against the contracts with Paper Calmenson Company for furnishing steel sign posts, Minnesota Mining & Manufacturing Company for furnishing Scotchlite materials, and Dow Chemical Company for furnishing calcium chloride.
- 5. Notifying the Board of the acceptance of the low bid of International Harvester Company for furnishing a tandem axle truck for the Highway Department and requesting that funds be set aside to pay said award.

All of the above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Specifications for furnishing coffee to the County Jail, the Home School for Boys and the Juvenile Center were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Douglas K. Amdahl, Assistant County Attorney, submitting a warranty deed for property necessary for right-of-way along County State Aid Highway No. 62 was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A plat of Elbert Lee Addition located in the Town of Minnetrista was presented and referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

Letters were read from Liebenberg & Kaplan, Architects and Engineers for the Hennepin County Highway Department Administration Building, as follows:

1. Submitting a list furnished by George Madsen Construction Company of sub-contractors on the above named building and requesting the Board's approval of the list.

Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott, that the list of sub-contractors for work on the Hennepin County Highway Department Administration Building, as furnished by George Madsen Construction Company be approved, providing they meet the specifications for the building.

The vote on the motion was as follows: Ainsworth yea, Eberl yea, Hanson yea, Scott yea, Chairman Matthews yea.

Motion carried.

2. Recommending that no changes, additions, or corrections of any kind shall be made by Robert Nelson, Clerk of the Works for the construction of the Highway Department Administration Building without channeling the same through the Chairman of the County Board, L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, or Liebenberg & Kaplan, Architects, for approval.

Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott that the County Board concur in the above recommendation.

The vote on the motion was as follows: Ainsworth yea, Eberl yea, Hanson yea, Scott yea, Chairman Matthews yea.

Motion carried.

3. Stating that Liebenberg & Kaplan, Architects and Engineer,

had authorized thepurchase of reinforcing steel, Lehigh cement, and Miracle Lime for the Hennepin County Administration Building.

Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott that the Board concur in and approve the action of the architects in authorizing the purchase of reinforcing steel, Lehigh Cement and Miracle Lime for the Highway Department Administration Building.

The vote on the motion was as follows: Ainsworth yea, Eberl yea, Hanson yea, Scott yea, Chairman Matthews yea.

Motion carried.

Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott that the Board members' expenses incurred by attendance at the Annual Convention of the State Association of County Commissioners held at the Radisson Hotel from December 11th through the 13th be approved and ordered paid from the Road and Bridge Fund upon presentation of properly verified claims.

The vote on the motion was as follows: Ainsworth yea, Eberl yea, Hanson yea, Scott yea, Chairman Matthews yea.

An application from Thelma L. Dresselhuis for abatement of delinquent taxes, penalties, interest and costs and a refundment of taxes upon real estate pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 270.07 was presented and on motion by Commissioner Hanson, seconded by Commissioner Eberl, was referred to Leonard Johnson, Clerk, City of Minneapolis and to the Minneapolis City Council.

Motion unanimously carried.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisements for bids, O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, proceeded to open bids for the following:

- 1. Workmen's Compenstation Insurance for the County.
- 2. Bakery goods for the County Jail and the Juvenile Center.
- 3. Visible record equipment for the Supervisor of Assessments.

The above bids were referred to Mr. Pearson for tabulation and report to the County Board.

Only one bid was received for furnishing a tickometer for the County Treasurer's office.

Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Hanson that the bid be returned unopened to the bidder and that O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, be directed to readvertise for bids for furnishing a tickometer for the Treasurer's office, bids to be opened on Tuesday, December 30, 1958, at 10:15 o'clock A.M.

Commissioner Eberl offered the following resolution, and moved its adoption:
