Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, January 6, 1959

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis at ten
o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

The meeting was called to order by Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, and there were present:

Commissioner Richard O. Hanson . . . . First District
Commissioner Elwood B. Swanson . . . . Third District
Commissioner I. G. Scott . . . . . . Fourth District
Commissioner S. E. Ainsworth . . . . Fifth District
George W. Matthews, commissioner from the second district, was absent.

Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, called for nominations for chairman of the County Board of Hennepin County, Minnesota, for the ensuing year.

Commissioner Scott moved that the selection of a chairman be held over until the full Board was present. There was no second to the motion.

Commissioner Hanson moved, seconded by Commissioner Swanson that Commissioner Ainsworth be elected chairman of the County Board for the year 1959.

The vote on the motion was as follows: Ainsworth yea, Hanson yea,

Matthews absent, Scott nay, Swanson yea.

Motion carried.

Mr. Fitzsimmons then declared Commissioner Ainsworth elected chairman of the County Board for the year 1959.

Chairman Ainsworth then took the chair.

A statement of balances in the County Revenue Allowances as of December 31, 1958, received from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, was ordered published with the proceedings of the Board and placed on file.

The annual report for the year 1958 and a monthly report for December 1958, received from Donald C. Bennyhoff, Register of Deeds and Registrar of Titles, were ordered placed on file.

A letter from Joseph M. Robertson, Commissioner of Taxation, relative to the Board's request for a recheck of the 1958 valuations in the Cities of Wayzata and St. Louis Park, and in the Villages of Shorewood, Edina, Long Lake, and Minnetonka, was read and ordered placed on file.

Letters from the Minneapolis Health Department requesting the commitment of four patients to Glen Lake Sanatorium were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A report from the Minnesota Health Department showing the per diem cost per patient in three Minnesota sanatoriums for the years 1955 through 1957, was presented and ordered placed on file.

A letter from Douglas K. Amdahl, Assistant County Attorney, submitting an easement for right-of-way needed for the improvement of County State Aid Highway No. 10 was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, as follows:

- 1. Notifying the Board of the acceptance of the following low bids and requesting that funds be set aside to pay said awards:
- a. Marsh & McLennan for furnishing corporate surety bonds covering officials and employees of Hennepin County.
- b. Anderson Agency for furnishing Workmen's Compensation Insurance covering employees of Hennepin County.
- c. Eddy Bakeries Company for furnishing bakery goods for the County Jail and the Juvenile Center.
- d. Driv-Ur-Self Systems for rental of vehicles for the Surveyor's office.
- e. 5th Avenue Parking Ramp for storing cars for the Sheriff's office.
- f. Dickey & Shaver and Western Oil & Fuel Company for furnishing gasoline and oil for the Sheriff's cars.
- g. Remington Rand Division of Sperry Rand Corporation for furnishing visible record equipment for the office of the Supervisor of Assessments.
- h. Pitney-Bowes, Inc. for furnishing a tickometer for the Treasurer's office.
- i. International Salt Company for furnishing rock salt for the Highway Department.
- j. Continental Oil Company for furnishing Diesel motor and heating oil for various County departments and gasoline and oil for the Highway Department and the Home School for Boys.

- 2. Requesting that funds be set aside from the County Reserve Building and Maintenance Fund for the following purposes:
- a. Extension of the gas line and installation of service to the new Highway Shop Building.
- b. Installation of a formica counter top and wall in the Superintendent's cottage at the Home School for Boys.

All of the above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisements for bids, O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, proceeded to open bids for the following:

- 1. Publishing the proceedings of the County Board for the year 1959.
- 2. Publishing the financial statement for the County of Hennepin for the year 1958.
  - 3. Publishing the delinquent tax list for the year 1957.
- 4. Publishing the proceedings of the County Board for the year 1959 outside the County Seat.
- 5. Publishing the financial statement of the County of Hennepin for the year 1958 outside the County Seat.

The bids were referred to Mr. Pearson for tabulation and report to the Board.

That Finance and Commerce be and is hereby designated by the County Board of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, as the official newspaper in which the proceedings of the Board of County Commissioners of said County of Hennepin, and all other legal and official notices required by law or authorized by the Board of County Commissioners during the year 1959 shall be published.

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten
o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by S. E. Ainsworth, Chairman.

Chairman Ainsworth submitted his resignation as chairman of the County Board for the year 1959.

Commissioner Matthews moved, seconded by Commissioner Swanson that Chairman Ainsworth's resignation be accepted but that the Board first elect a new chairman for the year 1959.

Motion unanimously carried.

Chairman Ainsworth announced that the Board would proceed to ballot for the selection of a chairman and appointed Commissioners

Hanson and Swanson to act as tellers. The tellers reported that

After some discussion, the matter was referred to the Committee of the Whole for study.

Annual reports of fees, emoluments and gratuities for theyear 1958 received from County officials were ordered placed on file.

A monthly report from George G. Roadfeldt, County Extension Agent, and monthly and annual reports from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, were ordered placed on file.

A notice from the Commissioner of Conservation of a public hearing on the application of Alvin B. Sheehan for a permit to dredge certain lagoons in Lake Minnetonka was referred to the County Engineer.

A notice of the annual meeting of the Minnesota Safety Council to beheld at Hotel St. Paul on January 13th was ordered placed on file. Letters were received from Robert F.Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, as follows:

- Requesting approval for the destruction of certain County records for 1948 and prior years. Referred to the Committee of the Whole.
- 2. Submitting a list of claims to be paid from the Contributions and Awards Fund. Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

An order of the District Court, Fourth Judicial District, making appointments and fixing salaries therefor at the Home School for Boys was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

- 1. Submitting a cooperative agreement between the County and the U.S.Geological Survey for theinvestigation of water resources and requesting approval thereof. Referred to the Road and Lake Committee.
- 2. Submitting a petition for installation of a sanitary sewer in Lakeview Heights Addition and 1st Addition to Lakeview Heights in the Village of Golden Valley. Referred to the Committee of the Whole.
- 3. Requesting the Board's approval for a traffic survey and recommendation for speed zoning on certain County highways to be made by the

Commissioner of Highways. Referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

A letter from the Minnesota Department of Highways submitting a right of way map of the Mother Lake area showing the additional right of way necessary for the construction of the interchange at County State Aid Highway No. 62 and Trunk Highway No. 36 was referred to the Chairman of the Board.

A letter from the Village of Bloomington submitting a resolution adopted by the Bloomington Village Council opposing the proposed County Welfare System was ordered acknowledged and placed on file.

A letter from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, requesting authorization to send an employee from his office to Northwestern University for a five-day course on the Drunkometer was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from the Hennepin County Historical Society acknowledging receipt of an advance payment on their 1959 appropriation was ordered placed on file.

A letter from Elmer H. Larson, Land Commission, submitting an application for the repurchase of certain tax forfeited land described in said application was referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

A letter from L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, submitting an agreement between the County and the Village of St. Anthony for winter maintenance of county state aid highways within the village limits was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A contract and contract bond from George Madsen Construction Co.,
Inc. for general construction work at the Hennepin County Shop Building
were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, notifying the Board of acceptance of the low equal bid of Boutell's for furnishing double bunk beds for the Home School for Boys and requesting that funds be set aside to pay said award, was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Specifications for wrecking Smith Cottage at the Home School for Boys were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from John K. Harvey, Assistant County Attorney, submitting a petition signed by Richard S. Davis and 24 others, together with a bond in the amount of \$100.00, to change the name of Mud Lake in the Village of Orono to Tanager Lake was referred to the Committee on

Public Grounds and Buildings.

A letter was read from Sen. Hubert H. Humphrey relative to the Upper Harbor construction at St. Anthony Falls. He stated that the President has requested \$2,400,000.00 for saidproject but according to the U.S. Corps of Engineers, \$3,200,000.00 can be economically used, which amount Senator Humphrey will support before the Senate Appropriations Committee.

Commissioner Matthews moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott that the Board of County Commissioners of Hennepin County, Minnesota, go on record in support of the expenditure of the sum of \$3,200,000.00, the figure to be recommended by Senator Humphrey before the Senate Appropriations Committee, for construction on the Upper Harbor at St. Anthony Falls, Minneapolis.
