Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, March 10, 1959

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten
o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

Members present: Commissioners Hanson, Scott, Swanson and Chairman Matthews.

Member absent: Commissioner Ainsworth.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

Mrs. Norma Chanfield and Mrs. Eddie Bielke from the Excelsior League of Women Voters were in attendance at the meeting.

Monthly reports from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, and George G. Roadfeldt, County Extension Agent, were ordered placed on file.

A notice from the State Department of Agriculture, Dairy and Food of the annual plant conference to be held on Thursday, March 12th at the CoOperative Seed Exchange in Golden Valley was presented.

Commissioner Scott moved, seconded by Commissioner Swanson that Ira McKown, Hennepin County Weed and Seed Inspector, be authorized to attend the conference, and that any necessary expenses incurred thereby be paid from the Noxious Weeds Fund upon presentation of a properly verified claim.

The vote on the motion was as follows: Ainsworth absent,

Motion carried.

A letter from Senator Donald Fraser submitting plans for supplementing our tax revenue if the personal property tax is repealed was read and ordered placed on file.

A letter from Howard W. Perkins, County Surveyor, notifying the Board of the completion of the topographical survey of the Home School for Boys was ordered placed on file.

Letters were received from Elmer H. Larson, Land Commissioner, as follows:

- 1. Submitting an application from the City of St. Louis Park for conveyance to it of the tax forfeited lands described in Transfer List "462-T".
- 2. Submitting an application from Howard W. Anderson and wife for repurchase of the tax forfeited land described in said application.

The above letters were referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

Letters from Douglas K. Amdahl, Assistant County Attorney, submitting warranty deeds for right of way necessary for the improvement of C. S.A. H. No. 62 and an easement for right of way necessary for the improvement of County Road No. 82 were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, submitting a severance payroll for Norris L. Ogard, a former Road and Bridge employee, was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Specifications for furnishing aluminum sign blanks and steel

signs were referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

Letters were received from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, as follows:

- 1. Notifying the Board of the acceptance of the low bid of Paper Calmenson Company for furnishing steel sign posts and requesting that funds be set aside to pay said award.
- 2. Notifying the Board of the acceptance of the low bid of The Zeco Company for furnishing an asphalt heater pumping unit and requesting that funds be set aside to pay said award.

The above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Frend Wadsworth, Clerk of the Village of Maple Grove, addressed the Board, requesting information as to the County's plans for the improvement of County Road No. 101 from County State Aid Highway No. 18 to County Road No. 137. The matter was referred to L. P. Pederson, County Engineer.

The use of County Road No. 109 in the Village of Maple Grove by Barton Contracting Company and Anderson Aggregates was also discussed.

Commissioner Hanson moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott that

L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, be directed to send a letter to

Anderson Aggregates setting forth the necessity for the upkeep of that
portion of County Road No. 109 used by them to reach their gravel pits.

The Daylight Saving Time Bill, now before the 1959 Legislative session, was discussed.

Commissioner Swanson moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott that the Board of County Commissioners go on record in support of Daylight Saving Time on a statewide basis.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisements for bids, O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, proceeded to open bids for furnishing (a) 2 Diesel motor graders for the Highway Department, (b) 4 sedans, (c) 2 station wagons, and (d) 5 patrol wagons, all for the Sheriff's office.

The bids were referred to Mr. Pearson for tabulation and report.

At 10:20 o'clock A.M., hearing was called for on the petition of Richard S. Davis and 24 others asking that the name of Mud Lake in the Village of Orono be changed to Tanager Lake.

The Clerk to the Board presented the publisher's affidavit of publishing the notices of hearing, the Sheriff's return of serving said notice on the village officials, and the County Auditor's certificate of mailing the notice of hearing.

A letter from Sidney A. Frellsen, Director, Division of Waters, State Conservation Department, recommending the name change, was read.

There was no appearance in opposition to the granting of the petition.

The matter was referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

Commissioner Hanson from the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings presented the following report:

TO THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS:

Your Committee, to whom was referred the matter of petition to change the name of Mud Lake in the Village of Orono to Tanager Lake recommends as follows:

Commissioner Hanson offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, The County Board of this county as required by law has furnished space for the use and occupation of the Hennepin County Welfare Board, and

WHEREAS, The space heretofore furnished by the County of Hennepin to the Hennepin County Welfare Board has become totally inadequate, and

WHEREAS, The Hennepin County Welfare Board because of increased duties needs additional space, which space is presently unavailable in its present quarters, and

WHEREAS, Other county departments have requested this board and the building commission for allocation of additional space in the Court House which is necessary for the operation of their departments, and

WHEREAS, The shortage of space and existing facilities have become critical for county purposes in the Court House, and

WHEREAS, Lot 1, Block 76, Town of Minneapolis and the building thereon has been made available for purchase to the County of Hennepin, and

WHEREAS, Said land is located on the corner of Fourth Avenue
South and Fifth Street in the City of Minneapolis, which location is
adjacent to the Court House, and admirably suited for occupancy by
the Hennepin County Welfare Board, and

WHEREAS, The acceptance of the offer to purchase and the purchase of said building will relieve the crowded condition of the present quarters of the Hennepin County Welfare Board and in addition provide additional space as now needed by such agency and will further provide for use and occupation of the former quarters of the Hennepin County Welfare Board by county officers and departments who critically need additional space, and

WHEREAS, This board finds that the offered purchase price of said building in the sum of \$1,041,000 is a fair and reasonable price

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That this board finds a critical emergency to exist and that the acquisition of additional space for the Hennepin County Welfare Board and for county officers and departments is for the best interests of the county and that Lot 1, Block 76, Town of Minneapolis and the building thereon if purchased by the County of Hennepin will relieve such emergency and be for the best interest of the county and the public generally, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the offered price of Lot 1, Block 76, Town of Minneapolis and the building thereon in the sum of \$1,041,000 be accepted and that this board accept the Purchase Option executed by Frank W. Griswold and Lisabeth E. Griswold, the terms of which authorize the County of Hennepin for a consideration of \$400,000 to use and occupy the above described premises for County Welfare purposes from and after the completion of the remodeling and alterations now being completed until the 20th day of January, 1960 at which time, pursuant to said Purchase Option, the County of Hennepin

may exercise the option to purchase said building upon the payment of the further sum of \$641,000 according to the terms and conditions of said Purchase Option.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the County Auditor is hereby directed to set aside the sum of \$255,350 from the Building and Equipment Fund and the sum of \$144,650 from the Reserve Building and Maintenance Fund and to pay such sums as consideration for the Purchase Option.

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis at ten
o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

Members present: Commissioners Hanson, Scott, and Swanson.

Members absent: Vice-Chairman Ainsworth and Chairman Matthews.

Commissioner Swanson moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott that Commissioner Hanson act as chairman of the meeting.

Motion carried.

Commissioner Hanson then took the Chair and called the meeting to order.

Mrs. M. J. Schanfield from the Excelsior League of Women Voters was in attendance at the meeting.

Letters were received from Elmer H. Larson, Land Commissioner, as follows:

- l. Submitting an application from the Village of Minnetonka requesting the conveyance of certain tax forfeited land described in Transfer List "463-T".
- 2. Submitting an application from Clarence R. Swanson for repurchase of the tax forfeited land described in said application.

The above letters were referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

A copy of a letter from R. L. Helland, Chairman of the Tax Subcommittee, Minnesota Young Republican League, relative to proposals of the Minneapolis Chamber of Commerce for raising tax revenue in lieu of thepersonal property tax was ordered placed on file.

A letter from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, submitting a list of claims payable from the Contributions and Awards Fund was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

An order of the District Court, Fourth Judicial District, appointing a cook at the Home School for Boys and fixing the salary therefor was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, as follows:

- 1. Notifying the Board of the acceptance of the low bid meeting specifications of Wm. H. Ziegler Co. Inc. for furnishing two (2) Caterpillar Diesel motor graders and requesting that funds be set aside to pay said award.
- 2. Notifying the Board of the acceptance of the low bids of Suburban Chevrolet Company and of The Minar Company for furnishing sedans and station wagons for the Sheriff's office and the office of Civil Defense, and requesting that funds be set aside to pay said awards.
- 3. Requesting the setting aside of funds from the Road Construction Fund (Chap. 598) to pay for necessary right of way for the improvement of County State Aid Highway No. 82.

The above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, submitting an agreement between the City of Minneapolis and the County for the improvement of Glenwood Avenue from Dupont Avenue North to Knox Avenue North was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, presented a map showing the proposed rerouting of County State Aid Highway No. 66 (Golden Valley Road) and the interchange with Trunk Highway No. 100 (Belt Line) in the Village of Golden Valley and recommended that the proposed plan be approved.

Commissioner Scott moved, seconded by Commissioner Swanson that L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, be directed to proceed with negotiations for construction of the proposed new County State Aid Highway No. 66 with the provision that the Village of Golden Valley acquire all the right of way necessary for said road improvement.

The vote on the motion was as follows: Ainsworth absent, Hanson yea, Scott yea, Swanson yea, Chairman Matthews absent.

Motion carried.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisements for bids, O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, proceeded to open bids for furnishing the following materials to Hennepin County for the Highway Department:

- 1. Hot plant mixed bituminous materials.
- 2. Grader blades and cutting edges.
- 3. Scotchlite materials.

The bids were referred to Mr. Pearson for tabulation and report to the Board.
