Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, April 14, 1959

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis on
Tuesday, April 14, 1959, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A monthly report from George G. Roadfeldt, County Extension Agent, was ordered placed on file.

A letter from Elmer H. Larson, Land Commissioner, submitting an application from the City of Minneapolis for transfer of certain tax forfeited lands for public street purposes was referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

A certified copy of resolution adopted by the Ramsey County Board of Commissioners April 6, 1959, approving daylight saving time for Ramsey County was ordered acknowledged and placed on file.

A letter from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, submitting a list of claims against the Contributions and Awards Fund was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, requesting approval of police radio service between Hennepin County and the Village of Island Park was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters from  $S_t$ anley R. Cowle, Assistant Budget and Purchasing Agent, notifying the Board of the acceptance of various low bids and requesting that funds be set aside to pay said awards were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Contracts and contract bonds from Eibert Coffee Company for furnishing coffee to the Jail and the Juvenile Center during the year 1959 and from Black Top Service Company for furnishing bituminous materials to the Highway Department during the year 1959 were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Specifications for the plant mixed bituminous surfacing of a section of County State Aid Highway No. 8 in Robbinsdale and Crystal and for the plant mixed bituminous surfacing of a portion of County State Aid Highway No. 130 were referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

A letter was read from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, submitting a severance payroll in the amount of \$3,093.41 for vacation and sick leave accumulated by O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent.

Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott that said severance payroll in the amount of \$3,093.41 be approved and ordered paid from the Budget and Purchasing Agent appropriation.

The vote on the motion was as follows: Ainsworth yea, Hanson yea, Scott yea, Swanson yea, Chairman Matthews yea.

A letter from Forrest L. Willey, Superintendent of Schools,

Wayzata, Minnesota, thanking the board for their resolution congratulating the Wayzata High School on winning the 1959 State High School Basketball championship was read and ordered placed on file.

A letter from Walter P. Quist, Chairman, Board of Governors, Big Island Veterans Camp, submitting their request for their 1960 appropriation was referred to the County Auditor to be held for the Budget meetings.

A letter from Rodney S. Wallace, Chief, Hennepin County Rescue Squad, concerning the proposed formation of the Hennepin County Sheriff's Internal Security Division was read and referred to Chairman Matthews.

An application from Earl R. McCabe and Gilberta F. McCabe, husband and wife, for homestead classification for the years 1937 to 1957 inclusive, was presented. Ralph L. Berman, Attorney for the applicants, spoke in support of the granting of said application.

Commissioner Swanson moved, seconded by Commissioner Ainsworth that the application be referred to Robert F.Fitzsimmons, County Auditor.

WHEREAS, A large percentage of such patients are old age assistance recipients whose health and safety is the direct concern of this County Board;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That this Board be recorded as favoring the repeal of the "Mayhood Act" and restoring enforcement of health measures and elimination of hazards to the Minneapolis Health Department.

Commissioner Hanson moved, seconded by Commissioner Ainsworth that Commissioner Scott's resolution in re the repeal of the "Mayhood Act" be referred back to him and that a copy of the proposed Bill repealing the "Mayhood Act" be presented at the next Board meeting for study and discussion.
