Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, May 19, 1959

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis at ten
o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A monthly report from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, was ordered placed on file.

A report from the Public Examiner on the financial affairs of the Village of Island Park for the years ended December 31, 1956 and December 31, 1957, was ordered placed on file.

A letter from the Mississippi River Parkway Commission requesting the County Board to withhold from sale certain lands under its control which might be needed by the parkway was read and referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

A letter from Larkin McLellan, Area Business Representative,
Operating Engineers, requesting a wage increase and additional severance
pay benefits for Road and Lake employees was referred to Chairman
Matthews.

A letter from Cyrus O. Hansen, M.D. submitting his resignation

as a member of the Hennepin County Sanatorium Commission was read.

Commissioner Hanson moved, seconded by Commissioner Swanson that Dr. Hansen's resignation be accepted and that a letter be sent to him expressing the Board's regret.

Motion unanimously carried.

Commissioner Hanson moved, seconded by CommissionerScott that Dr. John Edward Twomey, 6469 Westchester Circle, Minneapolis 27, Minnesota, be appointed a member of the Hennepin County Sanatorium Commission for the period from May 19, 1959 to May 1, 1962, pursuant to Laws of Minnesota 1959, Chapter 297.

The vote on the motion was as follows: Ainsworth yea, Hanson yea, Scott yea, Swanson yea, Chairman Matthews yea.

Motion carried.

A letter from L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, submitting agreements between the County and the Village of Minnetonka for division of costs and for Federal-Aid Highway improvement of a portion of County State Aid Highway No. 3 was referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

An agreement between the County and Northern States Power Company providing for electric service at the new Highway Administration Building was referred to the Committee on Roads and Lakes.

A letter from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, requesting approval of police radio service for the Town of Minnetrista was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Contracts and contract bonds were received from the following:

1. C. S. McCrossan, Inc. for furnishing hot plant mixed bituminous material.

- 2. Earl A. Sewall Co. Inc. for furnishing gravel; and
- 3. Barton Contracting Company and Woodrich Construction Company for furnishing sand.

The above contracts and bonds were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Specifications for rental of equipment for work in Lake Minnetonka, and for furnishing barricade mounted electric warning signals were referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

Letters were received from Stanley R. Cowle, Acting Budget and Purchasing Agent, notifying the Board of the acceptance of the following low bids and requesting that funds be set aside to pay said awards were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means:

- 1. Anderson Agency for furnishing liability damage insurance on the County fleet;
- Gordon Jensen, Inc. for furnishing and installing a dishwasher at the Home School for Boys;
- 3. Barton Contracting Company for the plant mixed bituminous surfacing of County State Aid Highway No. 8 in Robbinsdale and Crystal; and
- 4. C. S. McCrossan, Inc. for the plant mixed bituminous surfacing of County State Aid Highway No. 130.

Letters were received from the Village Manager of Mound and the Mound Chamber of Commerce requesting permission to close Highway No. 15 from Highway No. 110 to Highway No. 125 on May 23rd and 24th, 1959, from 8:00 o'clock A.M., to 8:00 o'clock P.M. to allow the Chamber of Commerce to fill the shoulders and adjacent property with dirt for the subsequent tree planting and beautification of the area.

Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott that the above request be granted.

Motion unanimously carried.

A letter from Fox, Inc., Realtors, relative to County-owned land at the intersection of Highways No. 110 and No. 44 was read.

Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Swanson that Fox, Inc. and the Village Council of Mound be notified that the above described property is not for sale.

The vote on the motion was as follows: Ainsworth yea, Hanson yea, Scott yea, Swanson yea, Chairman Matthews yea.

A letter from George G. Roadfeldt, County Extension Agent, requesting hospitalization insurance coverage for the Agricultural E_{X} -tension Service Agents and Secretary was read and referred to the Attorney for the County Board.

Herbert T. Thompson, Wayzata, Minnesota, addressed the Board requesting the vacation of a portion of Lee Avenue in the plat of Intpa Nini, Village of Minnetonka. The matter was referred to Commissioner Ainsworth and L. P. Pederson, County Engineer.

Commissioner Ainsworth stated that he had received a request from J. R. Clark, Spring Park, to have the County-owned property on Spring Park Bay cleaned and sprayed for dandelions.

Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Hanson that the County clean up said property, but that further maintenance be performed by the Village of Spring Park, and that the cost of said cleaning by the County be paid from the Lake Improvement appropriation.

The vote on the motion was as follows: Ainsworth yea, Hanson yea, Scott yea, Swanson yea, Chairman Matthews yea.

Motion carried.

A letter from Rodney S. Wallace, Chief, Hennepin County Rescue Squad, requesting authorization to purchase 52 Emergency Rescue Squad Manuals was read.

Commissioner Hanson moved, seconded by Commissioner Ainsworth that the purchase of 52 Emergency Rescue Squad Manuals be authorized for use by the Hennepin County Rescue Squad in their training program, and that said purchase be paid for from the Sheriff's appropriation.

The vote on the motion was as follows: Ainsworth yea, Hanson yea, Scott yea, Swanson yea, Chairman Matthews yea.

Motion carried.

Stanley R. Cowle, Acting Budget and Purchasing Agent, presented addenda to the specifications for maintenance service at the Hennepin County Welfare Board Building.

Commissioner Hanson moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott that the said addenda be approved and made a part of the general specifications heretofore approved by this Board on May 12, 1959.

Edwin P. Chapman, Commissioner, Hennepin County Park Reserve

398 relating to Park Districts by providing that the City of Minneapolis upon approval by its City Council, its Park Board, the County Park
Reserve District and this body may become a part of the Hennepin County
Park Reserve District, and

WHEREAS, The effectiveness of such law was made dependent upon the approval of the governing body of the County of Hennepin, and

WHEREAS, This board is the governing body of the County of Hennepin,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That this board hereby approves Chapter 16 Extra Session Laws Minnesota 1959 insofar as this board's approval is needed.
