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Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, June 23, 1959

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

Applications for license to sell non-intoxicating malt liquor were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Robert F.Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, submitting a list of claims payable from the Contributions and Awards Fund was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters from the Minneapolis Health Department requesting the commitment of three patients to Glen Lake Sanatorium were referred to to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, as follows:

- 1. Relative to the request of the Salvation Army for installation of a culvert at Stinson Boulevard and the west border of the Salvation Army Silver Lake Camp. Ordered placed on file.
 - 2. Submitting an agreement for the division of costs for the

improvement of a portion of County State Aid Highway No. 82 in the Villages of Excelsior and Shorewood. Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from Stanley R. Cowle, Acting Budget and Purchasing Agent, as follows:

- 1. Requesting additional funds to pay the final estimates on the contracts for the improvement of County State Aid Highways No. 10 and No. 61.

A salary increase for the county weed and seed inspector was

discussed.

- 1. Job Assignments. Job assignments shall be made by the Engineer on the basis of skill, qualifications and ability, with seniority considered but not controlling.
- 2. Training. Specifically for change in job classification, shall be accomplished on employee's time and not on County time.
- 3. Seasonal Factors. Occasional changes in job duties shall be recognized and pay authorized in accordance with work actually performed during the off-season.
- 4. Roller Operators. All roller operators shall receive the wage scale scheduled for Operator No. 1.
- 5. Patrol Operators. All patrol operators shall receive the compensation scheduled to Equipment Operator No. 2 and shall not receive extra or additional compensation for any work done in that classification.
- 6. Oiler. The job assignment of oiler shall be in the labor classification and shall receive no additional compensation other than scheduled for laborers in such job assignment.
- 7. Physical Examination. Each applicant for beginning employment in the County Highway forces shall be required to take a physical examination to determine his physical ability to perform the duties of his job classification.

Biennial physical examinations shall be required of all employees at age 55 and over.

In either case, the County shall designate the physician to perform the examination and shall pay the cost of such examination.

8. Physical or Other Disability. When any employee shall in the performance of his duties in his job assignment evidence a failure to qualify physically, mentally or otherwise for such classification, he shall be assigned or transferred to a job classification within his ability or qualifications whenever possible. If such employee is unable to fill any job classification within existing classifications, he shall be retired or discharged.

- 9. Small Tools. Each permanently classified equipment operator No. 1 and No. 2 shall be required to provide at his own expense and to have available while on the job, small tools to make minor repairs and adjustments to his equipment. Such tools shall consist of a hammer, crescent wrench, screw drivers and such other small tools as will be needed in the making of minor repairs or adjustments on the equipment used by such operator.
- 10. Blacksmith. The classification of "Blacksmith" heretofore established shall be discontinued.
- 11. Relief Periods. There is hereby established a relief period at 10:00 o'clock A. M. and at 2:00 o'clock P. M. which shall continue for a period of 15 minutes. Abuse of this relief time by frequent or continued failure to observe the 15 minutes limitation shall be subject to discipline by the County Highway Engineer.
- 12. The County Highway Engineer shall appoint, promote, discipline, and remove, upon the basis of merit and fitness, all employees of the County Highway Department. The County Commissioners will exercise control over personnel through the County Highway Engineer and all orders to subordinate employees by Commissioners will be routed through the County Highway Engineer.
- 13. Any rules, regulations or agreements heretofore passed by this Board inconsistent with this resolution shall be rescinded insofar as they are inconsistent herewith.

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

Members present: Commissioners Ainsworth, Hanson, Scott and Swanson.

The meeting was called to order by S. E. Ainsworth, Vice-Chairman.

A monthly report from Donald C. Bennyhoff, Register of Deeds and Registrar of Titles, was ordered placed on file.

A statement of balances in the County Revenue Allowances as of June 30, 1959, received from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, was ordered published with the proceedings of the County Board and placed on file.

A letter from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, submitting a list of claims payable from the Contributions and Awards Fund was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A notice of hearing, received from the Minnesota State Water
Resources Board, on the petition for the establishment of a Lake
Minnetonka Watershed District, to be held at the Excelsior Junior High

School on Tuesday, July 21, 1959, was presented and ordered placed on file.

Letters from Elmer H. Larson, Land Commissioner, recommending approval of the appraisal, withdrawal from sale, and the division-combination of the Tax Forfeited lands described in the accompanying lists were referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

A letter from Douglas K.Amdahl, Ass't. County Attorney, submitting a drainage easement obtained by the County Highway Department, was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, submitting a contract from the Minneapolis Gas Company for supplying natural gas to the new Highway Administration Building was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Paul W. Keve, Director, Department of Court Services, requesting auto allowance for an employee in the Probation Officers Department, was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

An Information Bulletin from the State Association of County Commissioners in re Chapters 4 and 70 Special Session Laws for 1959, was ordered placed on file.

A letter from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, submitting a list of claims against the Contributions and Awards Fund was referred

to the Committee on Ways and Means.

An application for license to sell non-intoxicating malt liquor was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters from Elmer H. Larson, Land Commissioner, submitting applications from the Villages of Mound and Golden Valley for conveyance to said villages of certain tax forfeited lands for street and drainage purposes were referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.
