Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, July 28, 1959

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis on
Tuesday, July 28, 1959, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

Members present: Commissioners Hanson, Scott, Swanson, and Chairman Matthews.

Member absent: Commissioner Ainsworth.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

Mrs. P. O. Pomeroy and Mrs. Ronald Mayer from the League of Women Voters of Bloomington were also present at the meeting.

Board of Audit Report No. 2 was ordered published with the proceedings of the County Board and placed on file.

An application for license to sell non-intoxicating malt liquor was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, submitting a list of claims payable from the Contributions and Awards Fund was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A copy of a resolution adopted by the Village Council of the Village of Crystal requesting the County Board to consider in its 1960

budget the improvement of County Road No. 9 within the village limits, was referred to L. P. Pederson, County Engineer.

Letters from the Minneapolis Health Department and the Hennepin County Tuberculosis Control Officer requesting the commitment of two patients to Glen Lake Sanatorium were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Jack Whitney, Undersheriff, requesting authorization for Joe Sentyrz, Radio Engineer, to attend the convention of Police Communications Officers to be held in Denver from August 3rd to 6th, 1959, was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

### JOINT-SESSION OF THE COUNTY BOARDS OF HENNEPIN AND CARVER COUNTIES

Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, August 25, 1959

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin and the County of Carver, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at eleven o'clock A.M., pursuant to resolution adopted by the respective county boards.

Members present:

Hennepin County; Commissioners George W. Matthews and Elwood Swanson.

Carver County; Commissioners, Edward Borak, G. H. Haasken, Martin O. Hurtig, Walter Newman and Carl A. Stender.

Members absent: Commissioners S. Earl Ainsworth, Richard O. Hanson and I. G. Scott, Hennepin County.

The meeting was called to order by the Hennepin County Deputy Auditor, P. E. Nelson.

Nominations for chairman of the meeting were called for.

Commissioner Stender moved, seconded by Commissioner Haasken that Commissioner Matthews be appointed to act as chairman of the joint session.

The vote on the motion was as follows: Ainsworth absent, Borak yea, Haasken yea, Hanson absent, Hurtig yea, Matthews not voting, Newman yea, Scott absent, Stender yea and Swanson yea.

Motion carried.

Commissioner Matthews then assumed the chair and proceeded to call for nominations for secretary.

Commissioner Haasken moved, seconded by Commissioner Borak that the Hennepin County Auditor be appointed to act as secretary-clerk of the joint session and to keep the record thereof.

The vote on the motion was as follows: Ainsworth absent,
Borak yea, Haasken yea, Hanson absent, Hurtig yea, Matthews yea,
Newman yea, Scott absent, Stender yea and Swanson yea.

Motion carried.

The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the provisions of Laws 1959, Chapter 592, Sec. 14, (in re rental watercraft) which the commissioners and other persons desiring to be heard discussed at some length.

WHEREAS, Laws 1959, Chapter 592, Section 14, provide:

"Subdivision 1. Where watercraft is for rental the person owning such watercraft shall have available for the use of those renting such safety equipment as life preservers, ring buoys, buoyant vests or buoyant cushions for each person on board which complies with all U.S. Coast Guard regulations, if any. There shall be posted by sign notice the availability of such equipment, for rental.

Subd. 2. The provisions of Subdivision 1 shall apply and become effective only as to waters in each county upon approval by the county board of such county, after first having a public hearing on the question for all those desiring to be heard, the approval to be by resolution duly adopted by the favorable vote of not less than three-fifths of all members of said board. Where the waters are located in more than one county, then the county boards of the several counties affected shall act jointly and as one body, after the public hearing, and a majority of such joint body is sufficient for the approval."; and,

WHEREAS, This joint meeting of the county boards of Hennepin and Carver counties is held pursuant to resolution adopted by the respective county boards to meet jointly and to act as one body for the purpose of determining whether or not to approve the provisions of Laws 1959, Chapter 592, Section 14, Subdivision 1, in relation to rental water-craft used on each lake and body of water located partly within both Hennepin County and Carver County, and to afford all persons desiring to be heard in said matter an opportunity to be heard; and,

WHEREAS, All persons present at this meeting and desiring to be heard, were heard.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the provisions of Laws 1959, Chapter 592, Section 14, Subdivision 1, be, and the same are hereby, approved as to waters located partly within both Hennepin County and Carver County, namely: Lake Minnetonka, Lake Riley, Lake Zumbra, Lake Virginia, Christmas Lake, Rice Lake, Stone Lake, Mud Lake and Silver Lake.
