Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, September 1, 1959

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A petition for the incorporation of the Town of Dayton as the Village of Dayton Park was presented and referred to the Attorney for the $^{\text{C}}$ ounty Board.

A letter from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, submitting a list of claims payable from the Contributions and Awards Fund was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from Senators Hubert Humphrey and Eugene McCarthy and Congressmen John Blatnik, Joseph Karth and Albert Quie acknowledging receipt of the Boards resolution in refederal aid to the highway program and ordered placed on file.

A letter from the Minnesota Railroad and Warehouse Commission concerning the overhead bridge carrying County Road No. 1 and Carver County Road No. 14 over right-of-way of the Minneapolis and St. Louis Railroad was referred to the County Engineer.

Letters were received from L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, as follows:

- 1. Notifying the Board of his final inspection and approval of the street work performed in the Villages of Tonka Bay and Minnetonka Beach under the village aid program and recommends that they be paid their allotments. Ordered placed on file.
- 2. Submitting a severance payroll for Alphonse J. Seline, a former Road and Bridge employee, referred to the Ways and Means Committee.

A letter from the State Highway Department notifying the Board of a public hearing on State Project No. 2783 (FAI 35W) 394, located from the Mississippi River to the East County line in the vicinity of 9th Avenue Southeast, Marshall High Field and Broadway Road, on September 4, 1959, Room 317, City Hall at 10:00 o'clock A.M., was referred to the County Engineer.

Letters from George M. Scott, County Attorney, submitting warranty deeds and claims for property along County State Aid Highway No. 62 (Crosstown), were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from Stanley R. Cowle, Budget and Purchasing Agent, as follows:

- 1. Requesting that funds be set aside for replacing certain antennas on the radio tower at the County Radio Station.
- b. Requesting that funds be set aside to Alexco Aggregates, Incorporated, to cover additional requirements of gravel.

The above matters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Specifications were received for furnishing steel storage shelving and truck and plow hitches to the Highway Department and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A contract and contract bond from the Barton Contracting Company for the improvement of County State Aid Highway No. 18 and No. 109, was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters from William H. DeParcq and Eugene A. Rerat, Attorneys, concerning the County's new telephone service were read and referred to the Chairman of the Board.

Letters were received from the Minnesota Department of Agriculture requesting that the County Weed Inspector attend the Biennial Conference of the Association of American Seed Control Officials to be held at the Leamington Hotel, Minneapolis, November 16 through the 20th, 1959.

Commissioner Scott moved, seconded by Commissioner Ainsworth that Ira McKown, County Weed and Seed Inspector, be authorized to attend said conference, all necessary expenses to be paid from the Noxious Weeds Appropriation upon presentation of a properly verified claim.

Motion unanimously carried.

A letter from Gary Stevenson, Hopkins Junior Chamber of Commerce, requesting permission to use the county gravel pit for a turkey shoot on September 27, 1959, was referred to the County Attorney.

A letter from Charles L. Horn concerning the new Lake Minnetonka Watershed District was referred to the Vice-chairman of the Board and the County Engineer.

The Hennepin County Sanatorium budget was presented and discussed after which Commissioner Hanson moved, seconded by Commissioner

Ainsworth that the budget be approved for the year 1960 in the amount of \$2,429,813.

The vote on the motion was as follows: Ainsworth yea, Hanson yea, Scott yea, Swanson yea, Chairman Matthews yea.

Motion carried.

The Civil Defense budget was presented and discussed with Stanley R. Cowle, Budget and Purchasing Agent, Walter P. Halstead, Executive Director, Minneapolis Civil Defense and Colonel Schon, State Director of Civil Defense.

Commissioner Hanson moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott that the budget for 1960 be approved as recommended by the Budget and Purchasing Agent in the amount of \$12,795. Commissioner Ainsworth then moved to amend the motion "that the budget for 1960 be approved as requested in the amount of \$27,772." There was no second to the motion to amend.

The roll call was on the original motion as follows: Ainsworth nay, Hanson yea, Scott yea, Swanson yea, Chairman Matthews nay.

Motion carried.

The budget for the Central Mobile Equipment Division was presented. Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Hanson that the budget for 1960 be approved as recommended by the Budget and Purchasing Agent in the amount of \$25,000., and that there be levied on all taxable property in the County of Hennepin for the year 1959 the sum of \$25,000. to cover the costs and expenses of said equipment division for the year 1960, pursuant to Chapter 671, Laws 1957.

The vote on the motion was as follows: Ainsworth yea, Hanson yea, Scott yea, Swanson yea, Chairman Matthews yea.

Motion carried.

A request for a \$50,000. increase in the State Institutions and County Hospital Appropriation for 1960 was presented by Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor.

Commissioner Swanson moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott that the appropriation of \$615,000. for State Institutions and County Hospital as recommended by the Budget and Purchasing Agent be increased \$50,000. making the total request \$665,000. for 1960.

The vote on the motion was as follows: Ainsworth yea, Hanson yea, Scott yea, Swanson yea, Chairman Matthews yea.

Motion carried.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisements for bids, Stanley R.Cowle, Budget and Purchasing Agent, proceeded to open bids for the improvement of Crystal Lake and the proposed park in the Crystal Lake area (Robbinsdale), and for furnishing 100 binders with canvas jackets to the Register of Deeds.

The bids were referred to Mr. Cowle for tabulation and report.

Commissioner Matthews offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, The Legislature of the State of Minnesota by Chapter 488, Laws of Minnesota 1959 authorized the establishment of a Metropolitan Mosquito Control District which previously operated under Minnesota Statutes 1947, Chapter 18, and

WHEREAS, Such chapter authorizes the counties of Anoka, Dakota, Hennepin, Ramsey, Scott and Washington to enter into a joint agreement to control mosquitoes, and

WHEREAS, Hennepin County desires to continue to control mosquitoes by joint agreement with the counties above mentioned under the provisions of said Chapter 488,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the County of Hennepin engage in a mosquito control program jointly and cooperatively with those of the aforementioned counties who likewise so resolve and form with them a mosquito control district under said Chapter 488.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That there is hereby levied upon all taxable property in this county a special tax in order to defray the share of the County of Hennepin of the cost of activities of the Metropolitan Mosquito Control District in an amount equal to two (2) mills but in no event to exceed fifty cents (\$.50) per capita on a base of the last official Federal census.
