Tuesday, November 10, 1959

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

Members present: Commissioners Ainsworth, Scott, Swanson, and Chairman Matthews.

Member absent: Commissioner Hanson.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

Mrs. A. V. Lundberg from the Hopkins League of Women Voters was present at the meeting.

A statement of balances in the County Revenue Allowances as of October 31, 1959, received from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, was ordered published with the proceedings of the Board and placed on file.

A monthly report from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, was ordered placed on file.

A letter from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, submitting a list of claims payable from the Contributions and Awards Fund was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from Elmer H. Larson, Land Commissioner, as follows:

- 1. Submitting an application for the repurchase of certain taxforfeited land described therein.
- 2. Recommending approval of the application of the City of Minneapolis for transfer of certain tax forfeited lands described therein for street purposes.

The above letters were referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

A letter from Stanley R. Cowle submitting Change Orders for work to be done at the new County Highway Shop Building and requesting that funds be set aside to cover said changes was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from the Minneapolis Health Department requesting the commitment of a patient to Glen Lake Sanatorium was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters from George M. Scott, County Attorney, submitting a highway easement for land along County Road No. 82 and warranty deeds for land along County State Aid Highways No. 18 and No. 62 were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, relative to funds allocated to Hennepin County under the new Water Safety Act was referred to the Attorney for the County Board.

Specifications for janitorial and maintenance service at the new County Highway Shop Building were referred to the Committee on Roads and Lakes.

Commissioner Ainsworth presented the letter from Walter P. Halstead, Executive Director of County Civil Defense, requesting an increase in salary for Mrs. Ruth Sewell, Secretary, referred to him and Commissioner Swanson on November 3, 1959, and moved, seconded by Commissioner Swanson that the request be denied.

A letter was received from Elliot R. Jackson, Secretary of the U.S. Civil Defense Council, submitting a resolution adopted by said Council October 15, 1959, commending Walter P. Halstead, President, for his untiring efforts in the field of Civil Defense. Ordered acknowledged and placed on file.

Letters from the Women's Army Corps Veterans Association,
Chapter 20, and from Paul Stinson Post #514 A.L.requesting an allocation of \$50.00 each from the Contributions and Awards Fund for Memorial Day purposes were received.

Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott that the requests be granted.

frayment of Memorial Day expenses, setting a dead line for submitting their applications for such allotment.

A letter was received from Maurice Winge, 8100 Zealand Avenue North, Minneapolis, commending the Hennepin County Rescue Squad for the competence, speed and courtesy used in accomplishing their duties at a traffic accident on October 29, 1959, in which one of Mr. Winge's trucks was involved. The letter was ordered acknowledged and placed on file.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisement for bids, Stanley R. Cowle, Purchasing Agent, proceeded to open bids for furnishing tax envelopes for the County Treasurer.

The bids were referred to Mr. Cowle for tabulation and report.

Commissioner Housen offered the following resolution, and moved its 1282 adoption:

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

Mrs. Youngstrom from the Minnetonka League of Women Voters was present at the meeting.

Audit reports on the Mound School District (No. 277) and on revenues, expenditures, and debts of State and local governments in Minnesota, received from the Public Examiner, were ordered placed on file.

A letter from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, submitting a claim payable from the Contributions and Awards Fund, was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from L. P. Zimmerman, State Commissioner of Highways, relative to the proposed Minnehaha Creek control structure at the intersection of T.H. No. 494 and Minnehaha Creek was referred to the

County Engineer and the Road and Lake Committee.

Letters were received from L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, as follows:

- 1. Notifying the Board of the completion of the street improvement by the City of Wayzata under the Municipal County Aid program and recommending that payment of the allotted funds be made to Wayzata at this time. Ordered placed on file.
- 2. Submitting an agreement between the County and Orr Engineering Company for the design of plans for the improvement of a portion of Nicollet Avenue in the Village of Richfield. Referred to the Road and Lake Committee.
- 3. Submitting an agreement between the County and Great Northern Railway Company permitting the County to deposit dirt within the railway company's right-of-way in Hopkins. Referred to the Road and Lake Committee.
- 4. Recommending that certain designated funds be ordered returned to the County due to an error in computing the special assessments levied against property purchased by the County for right-of-way for County State Aid Highway No. 62. Referred to Commissioner Hanson.
- 5. The problem of damage done by certain utility companies to County roads at the intersection of County State Aid Highway No. 10 and No. 50 in Rockford, Village of Greenfield, was discussed and on motion by Commissioner Ainsworth, seconded by Commissioner Hanson and unanimously carried, was referred to the County Engineer and the Attorney for the County Board for study and report.
