Minneapolis, Minnesota
Tuesday, December 15, 1959

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis on Tuesday, December 15, 1959, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

Mrs. E. D. Newell and Mrs. Arnold Aslakson from the Orono League of Women Voters were present at the meeting.

A monthly report from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, was presented and ordered placed on file.

Letters were received from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, as follows:

- l. Submitting a list of claims payable from the Contributions and Awards Fund.
- 2. Notifying the Board that funds in the District Court,
  Supervisor of Assessments and Budget and Purchasing Office appropriations
  have become exhausted and requesting that monies be transferred from
  the Emergency Fund to pay claims now due against said appropriations.

The above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Elmer H. Larson, Land Commissioner, submitting a Withdrawal from Sale list of certain tax forfeited lands in the Village of Mound was referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

Letters were received from George M. Scott, County Attorney, as follows:

- 1. Requesting a mileage allowance for Douglas K. Amdahl and John K. Harvey, Assistants in the County Attorney's office. Ordered held.
- 2. Submitting warranty deeds and easements for right-of-way along County State Aid Highways No. 62, No. 18 and No. 3. Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from John K. Harvey, Assistant County Attorney, as follows:

- 1. Relative to appropriations to the County Agricultural Societies. Referred to the Ways and Means Committee.
- 2. Relative to the request from the Commander of Campt #8, Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War, that the county take over the maintenance of an apparently abandoned cemetery in St. Anthony Village, referred to him by the County Board on December 8, 1959. Mr. Harvey stated that the Russian Orthodox Cemetery is the only cemetery in the immediate vicinity of 30th Avenue N.E. and Stinson Boulevard and apparently it is still in operation. The letter was ordered placed on file and a copy forwarded to Ray M. Clark, Commander of said Post.

A letter from J. Frederic Nissen, Attorney for the Village of Morningside in re County Ditch No. 17 was referred to L. P. Pederson, County Engineer.

A letter from W. Harlan Perbix, Mayor of the City of Hopkins, relative to the acquisition by said city of the old county shop property in Hopkins was referred to Vice-Chairman Ainsworth.

Letters were received from Stanley R. Cowle, Budget Director, as follows:

- Recommending that the request of Walter P. Halstead,
   Director of County Civil Defense, for mileage allowance be granted.
   Referred to Chairman Matthews.
- 2. Recommending the cancellation of the Lake Minnetonka Dredging Company contract for buoy maintenance in Lake Minnetonka and restoration of the funds so cancelled to the Lake Improvement fund. Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.
- 3. Submitting a Change Order to the George Madsen Construction Company for work at the Highway Administration Building. Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.
- 4. Requesting that funds be set aside from the Road and Bridge Fund and the Road Construction Fund (Chap. 598) to cover the purchase of right-of-way along County State Aid Highway No. 3. Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Specifications for furnishing sand, calcium chloride and road tar to the Highway Department during 1960 were referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

Plans and specifications for alterations to the plumbing and air

conditioning system at the County Radio Building were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter was read from A. W. Scherven, Jr., N.W. Tonka Lions Club, requesting permission to block off that portion of County Road No. 19 from Kelly Avenue to County Road No. 15 for the purpose of conducting their 10th Annual Safari, June 20th through the 22nd, 1960.

Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott that the request be denied and that the N.W. Tonka Lions Club be so notified.

Motion unanimously carried.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisements for bids, Stanley R. Cowle, Purchasing Agent, proceeded to open bids for the following:

- 1. Rock salt for the Highway Department.
- 2. Milk and dairy products for various county institutions.
- 3. Furniture for the District Court.
- 4. Station wagon for the Coroner.
- 5. Lockers for the Highway Department.
- 6. Moving the Highway Department to its new location in Hopkins.
- 7. Removal of homes and buildings from County right-of-way.

All of the above bids were referred to Mr. Cowle for tabulation and report.
