Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, January 5, 1960

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

The meeting was called to order by Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, and there were present:

Commissioner Richard O. Hanson . . . First District
Commissioner George W. Matthews . . . Second District
Commissioner I. G. Scott Fourth District
Commissioner S. E. Ainsworth Fifth District

Elwood B. Swanson, Commissioner from the Third District, was absent.

Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, called for nominations for chairman of the County Board of Hennepin County for the year 1960.

Commissioner Hanson moved, seconded by Commissioner Matthews that the voting for chairman and vice-chairman of the County Board be done by secret ballot.

Motion carried.

Mr. Fitzsimmons designated Commissioners Ainsworth and Scott

to act as tellers. After tallying the ballots, the tellers announced four votes for Commissioner Matthews. Mr. Fitzsimmons declared Commissioner Matthews elected chairman of the County Board for the year 1960, and Mr. Matthews then took the chair.

Chairman Matthews called for nominations for vice-chairman of the County Board for the ensuing year and designated Commissioners

Hanson and Scott to act as tellers. After tallying the ballots, the tellers announced four votes for Commissioner Ainsworth for vice-chairman. Chairman Matthews then declared Commissioner Ainsworth elected vice-chairman of the County Board for the year 1960.

A monthly report from Donald C. Bennyhoff, Register of Deeds and Registrar of Titles, was ordered placed on file.

A letter from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, requesting authorization to attend a meeting of the National Association of County Officials to be held in San Diego, California, February 14th to 16th, 1960, was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A notice of the annual meeting of the Minnesota Safety Council to be held on Tuesday, January 12, 1960, at 12:15 o'clock P.M. in Hotel St. Paul was ordered placed on file.

A contract and contract bond from Chicago Avenue Transfer for moving the County Highway Department to its new location in Hopkins were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from Stanley R. Cowle, Purchasing Agent, as follows:

1. Requesting approval for the full time employment of Mrs.

Gertrude Barth in his department.

- 2. Clarifying his position relative to tie bids and notifying the Board of the acceptance of the bids of International Salt Company and of McKesson Robbins Company for furnishing rock salt and calcium chloride respectively to Hennepin County during the year 1960, both of which were tie bids, and requesting that funds be set aside to pay said awards.
- 3. Notifying the Board of the acceptance of various low bids and requesting that funds be set aside to pay said awards.

A letter from L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, recommending the release of a covenant restricting the erection of billboards or other advertising signs on certain property covered by an easement given by M. T. Wolfram and wife to the County, was referred to Chairman Matthews.

Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, January 12, 1960

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A statement of balances in the County Revenue Allowances as of December 31, 1959, received from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, was ordered published with the proceedings of the County Board and placed on file.

A report from the Public Examiner on the financial affairs of Glen Lake Sanatorium for the year ended December 31, 1958 and for the period from January 1 to October 2, 1959 was ordered placed on file.

Annual reports of fees, emoluments and gratuities received by county officials during the year 1959 were presented and ordered placed on file.

An annual report from Howard W. Perkins, County Surveyor, annual and monthly reports from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, and a monthly report

from George G. Roadfeldt, County Extension Agent, were ordered placed on file.

A letter from Raymond A. Haik, Attorney, requesting that the County Auditor or proper county official be directed to determine the assessed valuation of all property located within the Nine Mile Creek Watershed District, was referred to John K. Harvey, Attorney for the County Board, Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, and Roy Haeg, Supervisor of Assessments.

A letter from Tom Chenoweth, City Manager, St.Louis Park, relative to County Ditch No. 17 was referred to the County Engineer and the Attorney for the County Board.

Barton and Associates report on a highway plan for Hennepin County was read and ordered acknowledged and placed on file.
