Tuesday, February 9, 1960

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

Three young men from the University of Minnesota, namely,
Raman Gover, Laverne Jervas and Lester Kjos, were present at the meeting.

Commissioner Scott offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

A monthly report from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, was ordered placed on file.

A letter from the Hennepin County Sheriff Rescue Squad Association summarizing the activities of the association during 1959 was ordered placed on file.

A report and recommendation from the Department of Corrections for the State of Minnesota made after an inspection of the Hennepin County Jail was referred to the Municipal Building Commission.

A letter was read from the Civic Amphitheater Committee inviting the County Board to participate in their meetings.

Chairman Matthews appointed Commissioner Hanson to attend the meetings of the Amphitheater Committee as a representative of the County Board. A copy of a resolution adopted by the Board of Park Commissioners for the City of Minneapolis notifying the County Board of their opposition to the adoption of the Barton plan for a highway system for Hennepin County was read and referred to the Committee of the Whole.

A letter from L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, reporting on a meeting attended by himself, members of the Morningside Village Council, and of the St. Louis Park City Council, the Sewer Engineer for the City of Minneapolis, and John K. Harvey, Ass't. County Attorney, relative to the status of County Ditch No. 17 was read and ordered placed on file.

A letter from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, submiting a list of claims payable from the Contributions and Awards Fund was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter was read from Norman Woodard, President, Glen Lake
Optimist Club, requesting permission to use a plot of ground owned by
Hennepin County to further their program of providing scouting,
recreation and athletic opportunities for the youth in the Glen Lake
community. The matter was referred to the Committee on Public Grounds
and Buildings.

A letter from George G. Roadfeldt, County Extension Agent, requesting the appointment of two members to serve on the Agricultural Extension Committee for a period of three years from January 1, 1960, was referred to Commissioner Ainsworth.

A letter from the Anoka County Welfare Department requesting reimbursement for University Hospital costs incurred by a Hennepin County patient who claimed, at the time of hospitalization, to be a resident of Anoka County, was read and referred to the Attorney for the County Board.

A letter from Walter P. Halstead, Director, Hennepin County Civil Defense, notifying the Board that he would be on active duty with the United States Navy taking a course in radar intelligence for two weeks in February, was read and ordered placed on file.

A letter from Rodney S. Wallace, Chief, Hennepin County Rescue Squad, submitting a tentative budget for 1960 for the Hennepin County Sheriff Water Patrolwas ordered held for one week and the matter was referred to Stanley R. Cowle, Budget Director.

A letter from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, submitting a police radio service agreement between the County and the Animal Rescue League for two-way radio service to an Animal Rescue League truck was presented and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters from William G. Guthrie, M.D., Coroner, notifying the Board of the appointment of three new deputies in his department and requesting a mileage allowance for them were read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from Douglas K. Amdahl, Assistant County Attorney, as follows:

l. Notifying the Board of an offer of settlement in a proposed appeal from the award made to Mr. F. L. Dean for the taking of a piece of land owned by Mr. Dean and referred to as Parcel No. 62

(Project No. 5914) in the condemnation proceeding entitled Hennepin County v. Miller et al. Referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

2. Submitting a highway easement in re C.S.A.H. No. 4, Project No. 5914. Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, March 1, 1960

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten
o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

Members present: Commissioners Hanson, Scott, Swanson and Chairman Matthews.

Member absent: Commissioner Ainsworth.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A letter from John K. Harvey, Ass't. County Attorney, relative to payment of a claim from the University Hospitals for service rendered to Josephine Overby, a resident of Anoka County, was ordered placed on file.

A letter from the Minnesota Safety Council requesting that Hennepin County participate in "Vehicles - Safety Check Month" in May, 1960, was ordered placed on file.

Letters were received from Elmer H. Larson, Land Commissioner, as follows:

1. Submitting applications from the Village of Minnetonka for

conveyance to said village of the tax forfeited lands described therein for drainage and road purposes.

2. Submitting an application for repurchase of certain tax forfeited lands.

The above letters were referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

A letter was read from the Wayzata Chamber of Commerce requesting that the pumps at Lake Minnetonka be turned on when the water reaches a dangerously low level. The Board directed that the letter be acknowledged and that the Wayzata Chamber of Commerce be advised that the matter of pump operation at Lake Minnetonka is being studied by the Board.

A letter from the State Association of County Commissioners requesting endorsement by the Hennepin County Board of the statement of policy as adopted by the Executive Committee of the Eight County Area organization on February 22, 1960, was ordered acknowledged.

Commissioner Swanson moved, seconded by Commissioner Hanson that the Hennepin County Board of County Commissioners go on record as concurring in the said statement of policy.

A letter was read from the Minneapolis Board of Public Welfare requesting that Kenneth F. McNulty, Appraiser and Ass't. Land Commissioner be authorized to advise them relative to rentals being charged at the North Minneapolis Court housing project.

Commissioner Scott moved, seconded by Commissioner Swanson that the matter be referred to Chairman Matthews and that Kenneth F. McNulty

be authorized to advise the Minneapolis Board of Public Welfare as requested.

A letter was received from Paul W. Keve, Director, Department of Court Services, requesting a mileage allowance for a staff member in his department and the removal of the name of another staff member from the list of those eligible to receive such allowance. Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, requesting authorization for one of his deputies to attend a seminar on Law Enforcement Photography to be held at the general offices of the Eastmen Kodak Company in Rochester, New York. Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, requesting approval of the agency contract with the State Highway Department for improvement of a portion of County State Aid Highway No. 4 was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Douglas K. Amdahl, Ass't. County Attorney, submitting easements acquired for right of way along County State Aid Highway No. 19 was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Specifications were received for furnishing the following materials and equipment:

- 1. Corrugated metal pipe culvert.
- 2. Medium curing cut-back asphalt
- 3. Asphalt emulsion
- 4. Wheel tractor with backhoe and loader
- 5. Wheel industrial tractor
 All of the above specifications were referred to the Road and Lake

Committee.

Contracts and contract bonds from Bridge Builders, Inc. for construction of Bridge No. 475 on CSAH #5 and from Edward Kraemer and Sons for furnishing crushed rock to the Highway Department were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from Stanley R. Cowle, Purchasing Agent, as follows:

- 1. Notifying the Board of the acceptance of the low bid of Paper Calmenson & Company for furnishing the necessary steel inventory supplies for the Highway Department in 1960 and requesting that funds be set aside to pay said award.
- 2. Requesting that funds be set aside to the Graybar Electric Company contract for furnishing steel storage shelving to pay for additional materials delivered under said contract.
