Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, March 15, 1960

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

Members present: Commissioners Hanson, Scott, Swanson, and Chairman Matthews.

Member absent: Commissioner Ainsworth.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

Mrs. Perry Parmalee from the Bloomington League of Women Voters was also present at the meeting.

Monthly reports were received from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, and from George G. Roadfeldt, County Extension Agent, and ordered placed on file.

A notice of hearing from the Minnesota Water Resources Board in re the petition for a change of boundaries of the Nine Mile Creek Watershed District was referred to the County Engineer and the Attorney for the County Board.

An order from the Minnesota Water Resources Board denying the petition for the establishment of a Lake Minnetonka Watershed District

was ordered placed on file.

A letter from Alexco Aggregates, Inc. requesting permission to rent a portion of the old Highway Shop Buildings was referred to the County Engineer and the Budget and Purchasing Agent.

A letter from Elmer H. Larson, Land Commissioner, submitting an application from the Village of Crystal for transfer of certain tax forfeited lands for park and playground purposes was referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

Letters from George M. Scott, County Attorney, submitting warranty deeds for property necessary for right of way along County State Aid Highways No. 18 and No. 62 were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, submitting an agreement between the County and the City of Minneapolis for the improvement of a portion of Portland Avenue was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from Stanley R. Cowle, Purchasing Agent, as follows:

- 1. Notifying the Board of the acceptance of the low bids of Wm. H.Ziegler Co. Inc. for furnishing one diesel motor grader and of Phillippi Equipment Company for furnishing one gasoline motor grader, both for the County Highway Department, and requesting that funds be set aside to pay said awards. Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.
- 2. Evaluating the parking situation at the Juvenile Center and recommending a policy to be adopted with reference to the assign-

ment of parking areas. Referred to the Committee of the Whole.

3. Submitting Addendum #1 to the specifications for furnishing a wheel industrial tractor, Project No. 004-51, and a wheel tractor with backhoe and loader, Project No. 003-51.

Commissioner Hanson moved, seconded by Commissioner Swanson that said Addendum #1 to the specifications for furnishing a wheel industrial tractor, Project No. 004-51, and a wheel tractor with backhow and loader, Project No. 003-51, be approved and made a part of the said original specifications approved by this Board on March 1, 1960.

The vote on the motion was as follows: Ainsworth absent, Hanson yea, Scott yea, Swanson yea, Chairman Matthews yea.

Motion carried.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisements for bids, Stanley Cowle, Purchasing Agent, proceeded to open bids for the following items of material and equipment:

- 1. Medium curing cut-back asphalt
- 2. Asphalt emulsion
- 3. Wheel tractor with backhoe and loader
- 4. Wheel industrial tractor
- 5. Corrugated metal pipe culvert

All of the above bids were referred to Mr. Cowle for tabulation and report.

Commissioner Scott offered the following resolution, and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, The Hennepin County Board of Commissioners knows, of its own experience, the urgent need of retired people for hospital and medical care, and a study of one union alone showed twenty-five (25%) per cent of their pensions absorbed by hospital and surgical insurance, and

WHEREAS, The Forand Bill (HR 4700) now in Congress, would pay in full for 60 days of hospital care for all persons eligible for old age and survivor benefits, including dependent children of widows, meet the costs of combined nursing home and hospital care up to 120 days a year, and cover certain surgical expenses, and

WHEREAS, Social Security records will be used to establish rights of applicants, and will include safeguards as to the quality of care, negotiation of rates, and freedom of cooperating instutitions from government interference,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That this Hennepin County Board of Commissioners hereby endorses the Forand Bill and recommends its passage by Congress, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be sent to each senator and representative from the State of Minnesota.
