The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten
o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

Mrs. Marilyn Haugen from the Wayzata League of Women Voters was also present at the meeting.

A letter from Joseph C. Vesely, Attorney for the City of Hopkins, submitting an objection from the City of Hopkins in the matter of the change of boundaries for the Nine Mile Creek Watershed District, was ordered acknowledged and placed on file.

A letter from Morten Arneson, a resident of Edina, requesting that that portion of 70th Street between France Avenue and Normandale Road be returned to Hennepin County to become a part of the County Highway system, was read and referred to L. P. Pederson, County Engineer.

A letter from the Structo Company, Kansas City, Mo., requesting approval of their structures for installation in this area was referred

to John K. Harvey, Attorney for the County Board.

Specifications for furnishing copy machine paper for the County
Auditor and other county departments and for wrecking certain specified
homes on County right-of-way property were referred to the Committee on
Ways and Means.

Letters were received from Stanley R. Cowle, Purchasing Agent, as follows:

Cowle, Purchasing Agent, proceeded to open bids for the improvement of a portion of County State Aid Highway No. 4, being State Project No. 27-604-03. The bids were referred to L. P. Pederson, County Highway Engineer, for tabulation and report to the Board.

Bids were then opened for painting the radio antennae tower at the County Radio Station. The bids were referred to Mr. Cowle for tabulation and report.

Only one bid was received for furnishing a crawler mounted hydraulic front end loader for the Highway Department.

Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Swanson that the bid be returned unopened to the bidder, and that Stanley R. Cowle, Purchasing Agent, be directed to readvertise for bids for furnishing one (1) crawler mounted hydraulic front end loader, bids on the second advertising to be opened on Tuesday, May 3, 1960, at 10:15 o'clock A.M.

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten
o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A letter from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, certifying the current assessed valuation of the property lying within the revised boundaries of Watershed District No. 1 (the Nine-Mile Creek Watershed District) was presented and referred to the Attorney for the County Board.

A letter from D. D. Wozniak, State Representative, relative to regulation of billboard advertising along the Interstate Highway System was received and referred to John K. Harvey, Attorney for the County Board.

Letters were received from Stanley R. Cowle, Budget and Purchasing Agent, as follows:

- 1. Requesting that funds be set aside to pay for a title examination and opinion on the Welfare Building property, and for the installation of a double gate in the fence at the Hennepin County Pistol Range.
- 2. Requesting approval of the appointment of Amelia Roerich as a telephone operator for the County and of a buyer in the Budget and Purchasing Department.
- 3. Notifying the Board of the acceptance of the low bid of Sullivan & Sons for painting the antennae tower at the Hennepin County Radio Station and requesting that funds be set aside to pay said award.

4. Submitting an addendum to the specifications for furnishing various vehicles to the County and requesting Board approval of said addendum.

An agreement betweenthe County of Hennepin and the City of Minneapolis providing terms and specifications for the improvement of that portion of Marshall Street N.E. lying between Lowry Avenue N.E. and the Soo Line Railway Company's bridge was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A tabulation of the bids opened on April 19, 1960, for the improvement of a portion of County State Aid Highway No. 4, S.P. 27-604-03, Minn. S 6347 (2), County Project No. 5936, showing Reigger Roadways, Inc. as the low bidder, was received.

Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott that the County Board recommend to the Commissioner of State Highways acceptance of the low bid of Reigger Roadways, Inc. in the amount of \$50,791.56 for the improvement of a portion of County State Aid Highways No. 4 lying between T.H. No. 5 and County Road No. 67, 0.5 mile south of Glen Lake.

When the purchase price of any such parcel of land does not exceed the sum of \$50.00, such purchase price shall be paid in cash at the time of purchase; and when the purchase price of any such parcel of land exceeds \$50.00, such purchase price may be paid in full at the time of purchase or may be paid as follows, to-wit: when the purchase price of any parcel exceeds \$50.00 but does not exceed \$100.00, one-half of such purchase price, or more, shall be paid in cash at the time of purchase and the balance thereof shall be paid in five equal annual installments; when the purchase price of any such parcel of land exceeds \$100.00 but does not exceed \$500.00, one-fourth of such purchase price, or more, shall be paid in cash at the time of purchase and the balance thereof shall be paid in five equal annual installments; and when the purchase price of any such parcel of land exceeds \$500.00, one-fifth of such purchase price, or more, shall be paid in cash at the time of purchase and the balance thereof shall be paid in cash at the time of purchase and the balance thereof shall be paid in ten equal annual installments:

Installments and interest at the rate of four per cent per annum on all deferred installments become due on the anniversary of the day of purchase, provided however, that the entire unpaid balance of said purchase price with accrued interest may be paid at any time before the final installment becomes due; and

All parcels shall be sold subject to existing leases, if any; to easements obtained by any governmental subdivision or agency thereof for any public
purpose; to restrictions appearing of record at the time of the taxjudgment
sale; to all existing laws and ordinances; and to the condition that the appraised value does not represent a basis for future taxes;
