Tuesday, August 30, 1960

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

Members present: Commissioners Ainsworth, Swanson and Chairman Matthews.

Member absent: Commissioner Hanson.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A letter was read from L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, and John K. Harvey, Ass't. County Attorney, reporting on the matter referred to them by the Board on August 9, 1960 "to make a study and report on the feasibility of enlarging the Lower Minnesota River Watershed District to include all that portion of Hennepin County which drains into the Minnesota River." Their recommendation was to enlarge the Nine Mile Creek Watershed District to include all that portion of Hennepin County which drains into the Minnesota River.

Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Swanson, that the report be adopted and that the Board concur in the recommendation of L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, and John K. Harvey, Ass't. County Attorney.

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The vote on the motion was as follows: Ainsworth yea, Hanson absent, Swanson yea, Chairman Matthews yea.

Motion carried.

A letter was read from Douglas K. Amdahl, Ass't. County Attorney, submitting an opinion on the requests of Avis P. Nelson, Superintendent of Schools, and Dr. William Guthrie, Coroner, to attend national conventions of their respective organizations. The matter was referred back to the Attorney for further study and report.

A letter was read from R. L. Brubacker, Co-ordinator, Twin Cities City Managers and Administrators Association, requesting the Board to consider retaining L. P. Pederson as Hennepin County Highway Engineer. The letter was ordered acknowledged and placed on file.

Letters from George M. Scott, County Attorney, as follows:

1. Submitting a warranty deed for right-of-way property along C.S.A.H. No. 62. Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

2. Reporting on the petition of Francis B. Segner for set off of his land from School District No. 111 to School District No. 584, which petition was heard by the Board on August 23rd, 1960. The Attorney stated that the property described in the petition is within a plat approved by the Minnesota Commissioner of Education for consolidation and any order of detachment or annexation should be withheld until after the election on the consolidation is held (September 13, 1960). The petition was ordered held until after the consolidation election.

A letter from Elmer H. Larson, Land Commissioner, submitting an application for repurchase of certain tax-forfeited land located in the Village of Shorewood was referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

Letters were read from L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, as follows:

1. Submitting a contract between the County and Northern States Power Company for furnishing electricity for lake level pumping at Lake Minnetonka.
2. Recommending that funds be set aside to the Village of Champlin under the Municipal County Aid Program for the improvement of Indian Mound Road in said village.

The above letters were referred to the Committee on Roads and Lakes and Ways and Means respectively.

Letters were read from Stanley R. Cowle, Budget Director, as follows:

1. Submitting a contract between the County and the Federal Government for the care of federal prisoners in the County Jail and recommending that it be approved.
2. Recommending that the Hennepin County Library budget for 1961 be approved in the sum of \$497,000.00 and that a mill rate sufficient to produce such an amount be levied, but not to exceed 2 1/2 mills.

The above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from George A. Totten, Jr., County Treasurer, requesting an exchange of County depository collateral securities in the Minnetonka State Bank of Excelsior was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from E. S. Giller, Giller Liquor Store, St. Louis Park, requesting information on the County's parking restrictions on West Lake Street was referred to the County Engineer.

A letter was read from John K. Harvey, Ass't. County Attorney,

submitting an opinion in re the construction of an agricultural Extension Service 4-H Building, said matter having been referred to him by the Board on August 23, 1960. Mr. Harvey stated that pursuant to law the County could levy a tax to erect such a building if the local County Agricultural Society is a member of the State Agricultural Society.

Commissioner Ainsworth moved that the County levy a tax of .20 mill on all taxable property in the county for the year 1960 for the purpose of acquiring land and erecting an Agricultural Extention Service 4-H Building pursuant to law.

There was no second to the motion.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisements for bids, Carl A. Nelson of the Budget and Purchasing Office proceeded to open bids for rental of equipment for work in Lake Minnetonka, Project No. 605.

The bids were referred to L. P. Pederson, County Engineer and Mr. Nelson for tabulation and award.

After tabulating the bids Mr. Nelson presented a letter recommending that the low bid of Lake Minnetonka Dredging Company be accepted and that funds be set aside to pay said award.

Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Swanson, that the bid of Lake Minnetonka Dredging Company be accepted for rental of equipment for work in Lake Minnetonka, Project No. 605, in the sum of \$8,890.00; and

That Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, be directed to set aside from the Lake Improvement Fund to the Lake Minnetonka Dredging Company contract the said sum of \$8,890.00 to pay said

award; and

That the Chairman of the County Board be directed to sign the contract after the bond has been approved.

At 10:20 o'clock A.M., hearing was called for on the petition of William Bittner, asking that his land described in said petition be set off from School District No. 584 (St. Bonifacius) to Joint School District No. 111 (Watertown).

The Clerk to the Board presented the publisher's affidavit of publishing the notices of hearing, the Sheriff's return of posting and the County Auditor's certificate of mailing said notices.

A letter was read from Avis P. Nelson, Superintendent of Schools, recommending that the petition be referred to the County Attorney because the set off involves a plat approved for consolidation by the Minnesota Commissioner of Education, the election on the consolidation to be held September 13, 1960.

There was no appearance in opposition to the granting of said petition.

The petition was ordered held until after the consolidation election.
