Tuesday, October 4, 1960

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A group of 27 Japanese farmers and their interpreter, the Reverend Mr. Andrew N. Otani, Minneapolis, were introduced by Commissioner Ainsworth. Chairman Matthews welcomed them to the meeting and explained the duties of the county board.

Reports from the Public Examiner on the financial affairs of the Villages of Mound and Island Park were presented and ordered placed on file.

A monthly report from Donald C. Bennyhoff, Register of Deeds and Registrar of Titles was ordered filed.

A letter from Raymond D. Haik, Attorney, relative to the inclusion of certain lands in the Nine Mile Creek Watershed District was referred to Vice-chairman Ainsworth, the County Engineer and the County Attorney.

A letter from John K. Harvey, Ass't. County Attorney, relative to the leasing of a portion of County-owned property at Spring Park Bay for a Christmas tree lot was read and ordered held.

Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Swanson that inasmuch as the Boy Scout Troop of the Spring Park area has shown an interest in leasing a portion of the County property on Spring Park Bay, the request of Floyd Rust, Mound, to lease said property be held until the scout troop has committed itself in the matter.

Motion unanimously carried.

A letter from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, submitting a claim against the Contributions and Awards Fund was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Howard W. Perkins, County Surveyor, submitting a severance payroll for John F. Mancino, a former employee in the Surveyor's office was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from Stanley R. Cowle, Purchasing Agent, as follows:

1. Notifying the Board of the sale to the highest bidders of homes and structures along County right-of-way and requesting that the chairman of the County Board be authorized to sign bills of sale therefor.

2. Notifying the Board of the acceptance of the low bid of Dictating Machine Sales, Inc. for furnishing an electric card file for the office of the Register of Deeds and requesting that funds be set aside to pay said award.

3. Requesting that the County Auditor be directed to set aside funds to various contracts to cover additional purchases made under said contracts.

The above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

4. Reporting on a study made by him of the duties and responsibilities of two employees in the Tax Forfeited Land Department and the Property Rentals Department and recommending a reapportionment of their time and salaries between the two departments. Referred back to Mr. Cowle.

Letters from George M. Scott, County Attorney, submitting deeds for conveyance of property along County State Aid Highways No. 18 and No. 62 were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from R. A. Anderson, 13841 S. Shirley Drive, Savage, requesting reimbursement for damages to his car incurred on CSAH #134 near the Minnesota River Bridge was read and referred to the County Attorney and the County Engineer.

A notice of hearing on a petition for the dissolution of Common School District No. 1870, Scott County, to be held in the Scott County Courthouse, Shakopee, Minnesota, on November 15, 1960, at 1:00 o'clock P.M. Referred to the County Attorney.

A notice from the State Water Pollution Control Commission of a public hearing to be held on October 20, 1960, at 10:00 o'clock A.M., in the Auditorium of the State Office Building, St. Paul, relative to the sanitary condition of the Mississippi River. Referred to L. P. Pederson, County Engineer.

A letter from L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, requesting that the County-owned property (with the exception of a small storage shed on said premises) at 1933 County Road No. 18 purchased from Sofie M. Draper for necessary right-of-way for CSAH No. 18, be declared surplus and disposed of as soon as the County acquires possession was read and referred to the Budget and Purchasing Agent.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisements for bids, Don McFadden from the State Highway Department, and L. P. Pederson, County Highway Engineer, proceeded to open bids for the construction of a portion of County State Aid Highway No. 62 (from Valley View Road to Xerxes Avenue South), Project No. 5624, S.P. 27-^{and} 662-01. The bids were referred to Mr. McFadden/Mr. Pederson for tabulation and report.

Stanley R. Cowle, Purchasing Agent, then proceeded to open bids for remodeling and construction of an addition at the Home School for Boys. The bids were referred to Mr. Cowle for tabulation and report.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That there is hereby levied a tax in the sum of \$350,445.43 during the calendar year 1961 on all the taxable property in the following school districts in Hennepin County which maintain no classified secondary schools: 282, 285, 286, 562, 564, 565, 566, 568, 569, 570, 571, 572, 573, 578, 579, 580, 581, 582, 583, 584, 585, 586, 588, 591, 887, and that said tax, when collected, be credited to the County School Tax Fund and be used for the purpose of paying such tuition.
