Tuesday, November 15, 1960

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

Members present: Commissioners Ainsworth and Swanson and Chairman Matthews.

Member absent: Commissioner Hanson.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

Mrs. George Wilson from the Edina League of Women Voters, was present at the meeting.

A monthly report from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, was ordered filed.

An order from the Railroad and Warehouse Commission authorizing the County and the Great Northern Railroad Company to establish and maintain grade crossings at the intersection of the Great Northern tracks and CSAH No. 3 as relocated, was ordered filed.

An order from the State Water Resources Board changing the boundaries of the Lower Minnesota River Watershed District was ordered placed on file.

A letter from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, submitting claims payable from the Contributions and Awards Fund was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter was read from M. G. Pfunder, President, Citizens League, requesting an outline of any reapportionment proposal the County Board may plan to present to the 1961 State Legislature. The matter was referred to the Committee of the Whole,

A letter from Elmer H. Larson, Land Commissioner, recommending approval of the request from the City of St. Louis Park for conveyance of certain tax forfeited lands for drainage purposes, was referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

A petition from Francis B. Segner asking that his lands described in said petition be set off from School District No. 111 (Watertown) to School District No. 110 (Waconia), both districts joint with Carver County, was referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

A letter from Paul W. Keve, Director, Department of Court Services, requesting a mileage allowance for certain employees in his department, was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Geo. A. Totten, Jr., County Treasurer, requesting approval of the exchange of collateral securities of Midland National Bank was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from George M. Scott, Co. Attorney, submitting a warranty deed for property along the right of way of County State Aid Highway No. 19 was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Specifications for furnishing various vehicles for the Central Mobile Equipment Division were referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisements for bids, Stanley R. Cowle, Purchasing Agent, proceeded to open bids for furnishing drafting tables to the Highway Department and real and personal property tax envelopes for the County Treasurer.

The bids were referred to Mr. Cowle for tabulation and report.

At 10:20 o'clock A.M., hearing was called for on the petition of William Bittner asking that his lands described in said petition be set off from School District No. 110 (Waconia) to School District No. 111 (Watertown), both districts being joint with Carver County.

The Clerk to the Board presented the publisher's affidavit of printing the notices of hearing, the Sheriff's return of posting, and the County Auditor's certificate of mailing said notices.

A letter from Avis P. Nelson, County Superintendent of Schools, recommending the granting of said petition, was read.

There was no appearance either for or against the granting of the petition.
