Tuesday, February 7, 1961

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten
o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A statement of balances in the County Revenue Allowances as of January 31, 1961, received from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, was ordered published with the proceedings of the Board and placed on file.

A monthly report from Donald C. Bennyhoff, Register of Deeds and Registrar of Titles was ordered filed.

A letter from Ralph T. Keyes, Executive Secretary, State Association of County Commissioners, submitting a questionaire on general revenue fund limitations was ordered filed.

A letter from John K. Harvey, Ass't. County Attorney, relative to certain County-owned property which the city of Crystal desires for street purposes was referred to L. P. Pederson, County Engineer.

A request from J. V. Couper, 13621 County Road No. 67, that an advertising sign be removed from the Glen Lake Sanatorium property

was referred to the County Engineer.

A request from Theo. Hanson, Mound, that the County maintain the shoreline of the channel between Emerald and Seton Lakes, Lake Minnetonka, was referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

A letter from Elmer H. Larson, Land Commissioner, requesting approval of the application of the Village of Mound for conveyance to said village of certain Tax Forfeited Lands for street purposes was referred to the Committee on Public Grounds, Buildings and Institutions.

A letter from L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, requesting approval for the exchange of a portion of the County's allotment of Federal Aid Secondary Funds for Federal Aid Urban Funds to be used for construction of CSAH #62 was referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

A letter was read from Paul W. Keve, Director, Department of Court Services, requesting that funds be set aside from the Caleb Doerr Trust Fund to M. F. Patterson Dental Supply Company for purchase of certain dental equipment for modernization of the facilities at the Home School for Boys.

Commissioner Hanson moved, seconded by Commissioner Swanson that the claim of M. F. Patterson Dental Supply Company in the sum of \$590.80 be approved and that Northwestern National Bank of Minneapolis be requested to release funds from the Caleb Doerr Trust Fund to pay said claim.

Motion unanimously carried.

Specifications for furnishing uniforms for the Sheriff's office

personnel were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Specifications for furnishing barricade mounted electric warning signals were referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

A contract and contract bond from Western Oil & Fuel Company for furnishing gasoline and oil to the Central Mobile Equipment Division for the Sheriff's vehicles were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from Stanley R.Cowle, Budget Director, as follows:

- 1. Requesting that funds be set aside to the Ernst & Ernst contract for developing an accounting system for the Highway Department and for Central Mobile Equipment Division.
- 2. Notifying the Board of the acceptance of various low bids for the purchase of buildings on County right-of-way property and requesting authorization for the chairman of the Board to sign bills of sale therefor.

The above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters from John K. Harvey, Ass't. County Attorney, submitting warranty deeds for the purchase of right-of-way property along the route of County State Aid Highway No. 62 were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Rodney S. Wallace, Chief, Sheriff's Rescue Squad, presented a Bill for an Act authorizing the County to establish a security division within the office of the Sheriff, to enter into agreements with and to

coordinate the activities of volunteer groups engaged in rescue, patrol, safety, protection service, or other similar activities in said County, and to employ personnel and appropriate money for such purposes.

Commissioner Hanson moved, seconded by Commissioner Swanson that the Bill be approved for submission to the 1961 session of the Minnesota State Legislature.

The vote on the motion was as follows: Ainsworth nay, Hanson yea, Scott yea, Swanson yea, Chairman Matthewsyea.

Motion carried.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisements for bids, Stanley R. Cowle, Purchasing Agent, proceeded to open bids for furnishing mobile radio equipment to the County.

The bids were referred to Mr. Cowle for tabulation and report.

At 10:20 o'clockA.M., hearing was called for on the petition of Robert DeGhetto, Mayor, Village of Minnetonka, and ten others for the repair of Judicial Ditch No. 2 (Purgatory Creek).

The Clerk to the Board presented the County Auditor's Certificate of mailing notices of hearing toall the petitioners.

Those present, who spoke in support of the petition, were Mayor DeGhetto, Robert Grove, Attorney for the Petitioners, Rudolph Kokesh, Marie Kokesh, Sterling Jones and Ray Porter.

John Harvey, Ass't. County Attorney, recommended that the Petitioners request the State Water Resources Board for inclusion in the Nine Mile Creek Watershed District as a more feasible means of solving their drainage problems.

Commissioner Hanson moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott that the hearing be continued to Tuesday, February 14, 1961, at 10:20 o'clock A.M., in Committee Room 130 Court House, Minneapolis.

Motion unanimously carried.

Commissioner Hanson moved seconded by Commissioner Scott that payment of salaries on an hourly basis to employees under the jurisdiction of the County Board be terminated as of July 1, 1961, and that commencing on July 1, 1961, hourly workers under Board jurisdiction be paid on a semi-monthly basis with a minimum hold-back period of from three to five days.

Motion unanimously carried.

### EXPLANATION OF INCREMENT SCHEDULE PROCEDURES

- 1) Each salary grade number and range shall have six merit and longevity increment steps of three per cent each. Merit-longevity step increases shall be an administrative procedure as outlined in this resolution.
- 2) The increases in rates of pay other than the automatic cost of living increases are not intended to be completely automatic. An employee shall be eligible for these increments only if he meets the following conditions:
  - a) That, as a new employee, he meets the requirements of length of service which are six months of continuous employment for Step "B", and an additional twelve months of continuous employment in the same classification for each of Steps "C" through "G". Employees promoted to higher classifications shall require twelve months of continuous employment in the higher classification for each successive "step" increase.
  - b) That he has the recommendation for "step" increases from his division and/or department head.

- 3) The salary of an employee who advances from one grade to another by promotion shall be the next full increment step higher than the salary last received by such employee in the lower classification. Thereafter, the salary shall increase annually according to the succeeding years' rates as set forth in the grade and range chart.
- 4) The effective date of a merit increase shall be the first day of the pay period following the anniversary of employment or promotion.
- 5) In determining years of service, absence or leave within regular leave provisions as provided in the department's rules and regulations shall not be excluded in determining such years of service. All other layoffs, suspensions, or leaves of absence shall be excluded in computing years of service and shall defer the date of salary advancement for the same length of time as that of the layoff, suspension, or leave of absence.
