Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, May 23, 1961

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the city of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

An approval from the Division of Waters, State of Minnesota, of the overall plan for Nine Mile Creek Watershed District, adopted by the Board of Managers March 3, 1961, was presented and ordered placed on file.

A letter from Helen A. Young, Director, Hennepin County Library, relative to the settlement of a claim was referred to John K. Harvey, Attorney for the County Board.

A letter from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, submitting a list of claims against the Contributions and Awards Fund was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Walter P. Halstead, Director, Office of Civil Defense, requesting authorization for two Civil Defense personnel to

attend the State Civil Defense Conference to be held in Bemidji was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Edwin S. Stranberg, County Bookbinder, recommending the granting of a leave of absence to Franz O. Erickson, Assistant Bookbinder, was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Thomas M. Bambery, Ass't. County Attorney, submitting a warranty deed for right of way property along County State Aid Highway No. 18 was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, as follows:

- 1. Submitting an agreement with the Village of Orono for the division of costs for the improvement of a portion of CSAH No. 51. Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.
- 2. Requesting the employment, pursuant to Chapter 500, Laws 1959, of L. P. Zimmerman as a full-time consultant to the Hennepin County Highway Department with all rights and benefits appertaining thereto.

 Referred to the Committee of the Whole.

Letters were received from Stanley R. Cowle, Budget Director, as follows:

- 1. Notifying the Board of the forfeiture by A. G. Bogen Company of their check in the sum of \$339.50 deposited with their bid for the purchase of Parcels 8 and 9 (6136 and 6137 Queen Avenue South), Contract No. 131, because of their failure to fulfill the conditions of their contract. Ordered filed.
- 2. Notifying the Board of the acceptance of various low bids and requesting that funds be set aside to pay said awards. Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Specifications for the grading and bituminous surfacing of portions of County State Aid Highways No. 3, No. 4, and No. 61 were

referred to the Committee on Roads and Lakes.

The plat of Watson Acres in the Town of Champlin was presented and referred to the Committee on Public Grounds, Buildings and Institutions.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisement for bids, Stanley R. Cowle, Purchasing Agent, proceeded to open bids for the furnishing of metal nameplates to Hennepin County.

The bids were referred to Mr. Cowle for tabulation and report.

At 10:20 o'clock A.M., hearing was called on the petition of the State of Minnesota by L. P. Zimmerman, its Commissioner of High-ways, for the right to make a minor alteration or change in County Ditch No. 13 in Brooklyn Center, in conjunction with the construction of Trunk Highway 94=392.

The Clerk to the Board presented the publisher's affidavit of publishing the notice of hearing, the Auditor's certificate of mailing said notices and the Sheriff's return of serving and posting said notice.

A letter was read from the Village of Brooklyn Center stating that the village has no objections to the granting of the petition.

Gerald Geheren, Ass't. Attorney General, representing the petitioner, addressed the Board relative to the requested alteration or change in County Ditch No. 13.

There was no appearance in opposition to the granting of the petition.

The matter was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Commissioner Hanson offered the following resolution, and moved its adoption:

BE IT RESOLVED, That the petition of the State of Minnesota, by L.P. Zimmerman, its Commissioner of Highways, to make a minor change or alteration in County Ditch No. 13 in Hennepin County, be granted; and

That the Chairman of the County Board be directed to sign said order granting such permission on behalf of Hennepin County.

The question was on the adoption of the resolution, and there were YEAS and Nays, as follows:

ORDER OF COUNTY BOARD

RE: Petition of State of Minnesota, by L. P. Zimmerman, Its Commissioner of Highways, for the Right to Make a Minor Alteration or Change in County Ditch No. 13, in Hennepin County.

The above entitled matter came on for hearing before the County Board of Hennepin County, in the County Commissioners' Room in the Court House, in Minneapolis, Minnesota, on the 23rd day of May, 1961, at 10:20 o'clock A.M.

The petitioner appeared by Gerald Geheren, Ass't. Attorney General.

The petitioner presented evidence in support of its petition for permission to make a minor alteration or change in Hennepin County Ditch No. 13, as shown in the plans attached to the petition.

It was made to appear that the minor alteration or change in said Hennepin County Ditch No. 13, petitioned for by the petitioner, would be advantageous or desirable in the maintenance and construction of Trunk Highway No. 94=392.

It was further made to appear that said minor alteration or change in said Hennepin County Ditch No. 13 would in no way impair the efficiency or functioning of the drainage system.

The County Board, having heard the evidence adduced by the petitioner in support of its petition for permission to make a minor alteration or change in Hennepin County Ditch No. 13, as shown on the plans, profile, marked Exhibit "A", and right of way map, marked Ex-

hibit "B", attached thereto and made a part thereof, hereby makes its order consenting to and granting permission to said petitioner to make the minor alteration or change in Hennepin County Ditch No. 13, as shown in the plans, profile and right of way map attached to said petition and made a part thereof.

The Board further orders that the petitioner, State of Minnesota, by L. P. Zimmerman, Commissioner of Highways, pay the sum of \$28.25 to the County of Hennepin for publication and filing fees incurred by said County in this matter.

It is further ordered by the Board that damages, if any, for any additional lands necessary for said change or alteration shall be paid by the petitioner herein.

WHEREAS, The Board of County Commissioners previously gave approval to the relocation of a portion of County State Aid Highway No. 6 within the Minneapolis Industrial Park area, said construction of County State Aid Highway No. 6 to be constructed at no expense to the county for a 9-ton axle roadway for four lanes of traffic of 50 feet in width with the exception that the County, at its expense, shall place a one (1) inch bituminous base and three (3) inch bituminous wearing surface; and

WHEREAS, Minneapolis Industrial Park, Inc. has proceeded to award contracts for the industrial park and has requested at this time a permit to cross the present and future County State Aid Highway No. 6 with a spur track;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That upon the recommendation of the County Highway Engineer the County of Hennepin grant to Minneapolis Industrial Park, Inc. an easement to construct a spur track across the right of way of the present and future County State Aid Highway No. 6; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the easement be granted with the following stipulations:

- 1. That no more than two (2) spur tracks shall cross the present County State Aid Highway No. 6, nor more than one (1) spur track shall cross the future County State Aid Highway No. 6.
- 2. That on present County State Aid Highway No. 6 automatic railroad crossing signals will not be required.
- 3. That on the future relocation of County State Aid Highway No. 6 automatic railroad crossing signals be installed at no expense to the County of Hennepin; said signals to be the regular standard type approved by the Minnesota Railroad and Warehouse Commission.
- 4. That the signals will not be required until such time the first train movement will cross the new section of County State Aid Highway No. 6.

- 5. That the section of track across the right of way of proposed County State Aid Highway No. 6 be constructed permanently in advance of the permanent construction of new County State Aid Highway No. 6.
- 6. That the stipulations above be a written agreement between the County and Minneapolis Industrial Park, Inc. for this spur track easement.
