Tuesday, September 5, 1961

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

Members present: Commissioners Scott, Swanson, and Chairman Matthews.

Members absent: Commissioners Ainsworth and Hanson.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

Board of Audit Report No. 3 was presented and ordered published with the proceedings of the Board and placed on file.

A monthly report from Donald C. Bennyhoff, Register of Deeds and Registrar of Titles, was ordered filed.

A letter from George Quam, Assessor, Village of Minnetonka, requesting the consolidation of various parcels of land comprising the Home School for Boys property and the Glen Lake Sanatorium property was referred to Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor.

A letter from the Minneapolis Chamber of Commerce requesting the Board to postpone action toward adoption of that part of the proposed County Budget for 1962 which would authorize the purchase of a hot-mix bituminous plant until September 15, 1961, was ordered filed.

A letter from Minnesota Good Roads, Inc. submitting a claim for Hennepin County's membership in said organization for 1961 was referred to Stanley R. Cowle, Budget Director.

Letters from Kenneth F. McNulty, Ass't. Land Commissioner, recommending approval of the applications of the Village of Maple Grove for transfer to said village of certain Tax Forfeited lands and of the City of St. Louis Park for change of use of certain Tax Forfeited land heretofore conveyed to said city, were referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

Plans and specifications for tuck pointing and brick repair for the Highway Department and for the improvement of County State Aid Highways No. 19, No. 51, No. 62, and No. 17 were referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A notice of hearing to be held on October 9, 1961, on the petition of the City of Bloomington for annexation of certain unincorporated territory was ordered acknlwledged and filed.

A letter from C. D. Andre, City Manager, St. Louis Park, relative to the proposed establishment of a Minnehaha Creek Watershed District was ordered held.

A letter from Robert Mummah requesting the opening of the Cedar Lake Road bridge over the Great Northern Railroad Company tracks was referred to Kent Youngdahl, Highway Administrator.

A letter from Earl A. Arneson, Secretary, 12th Ward DFL Club, requesting that the question of the establishment of a county relief

program and the abolishment of the present township relief system be placed on the next County election ballot was referred to the County Attorney.

A letter from Edward P. Dietrich, Ass't. County Attorney, submitting a warranty deed for right-of-way property along CSAH No. 18 was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, submitting an agreement between the County and the City of Minneapolis for the relocation of city-owned water and sewer facilities along 62nd Street, Project No. 6163, was referred to the Road and Lake Committee.
