Tuesday, October 3, 1961

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

Members present: Commissioners Ainsworth, Scott and Chairman Matthews.

Members absent: Commissioners Hanson and Swanson.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A monthly report from Donald C. Bennyhoff, Register of Deeds and Registrar of Titles, was ordered filed.

A letter from Rex M. Whitton, Federal Highway Administrator, relative to the Federal Aid Secondary funds allocated to Minnesota, was ordered filed.

A letter from J. W. Crawford, Champlin, relative to problems in equalizing property valuations in various taxing districts in Hennepin County, was read and ordered placed on file.

A letter from Helen Young, Director, Hennepin County Library, submitting a District Court summons in the case of Becky Brewster vs. Olof Jacobsen was referred to John K. Harvey, Attorney for the County Board.

A letter was read from David W. Bird, President, National Association of County Officials, submitting a statement for membership dues for 1962. The Board directed the Clerk to notify Mr. Bird that no provision was made in the 1962 budget for membership in said organization.

A letter from Geo. A. Totten, Jr., County Treasurer, requesting approval for the exchange of collateral security deposits of the State Bank of Bloomington, was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from John K. Harvey, Ass't. County Attorney, relative to the relief system in Hennepin County, was ordered held.

Orders from the State Water Resources Board relative to the adoption of plans for the improvement of the Nine Mile Creek and the Lower Minnesota River Watershed Districts, were ordered filed.

A letter from Edward P. Dietrich, Ass't. County Attorney, submitting a warranty deed for right-of-way property along CSAH No. 62, was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, requesting that a traffic survey be made of various county roads was read and referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

Letters were received from Kent B. Youngdahl, Highway Administrator, as follows:

1. Recommending the granting of Municipal County Aid funds to the Village of Champlin to be used for the improvement of certain streets within the village limits.
2. Requesting authorization for the transfer of certain Federal Aid Urban funds to the Federal Aid Secondary fund account.

Both letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A contract and contract bond from Herbison Bridge Company for the construction of Bridge No. 7268 at the intersection of Penn Avenue South and 62nd Street were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Duane A. Wilson, Commissioner of Agriculture, requesting the appointment of a weed and seed inspector for Hennepin County for the year 1962 was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from Stanley R. Cowle, Budget Director, as follows:

1. Requesting the employment of a buyer in the Budget and Purchasing Agent office.
2. Requesting the setting aside of funds to pay claims for work done at the Home School for Boys and the County Morgue.
3. Requesting the cancellation of two outstanding completed contracts and restoration of the balances so cancelled to the County Reserve Building and Maintenance Fund.

All of the above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisements for bids, Stanley R. Cowle, Purchasing Agent, proceeded to open bids for the plant mixed bituminous surfacing of CSAH No. 19 and No. 51 and for the gravel base, bituminous and concrete surfacing of CSAH No. 62 and No. 17.

The above bids were referred to Mr. Cowle for tabulation and report.



Tuesday, October 10, 1961

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

Members present: Commissioners Ainsworth, Scott, Swanson and Chairman Matthews.

Member absent: Commissioner Hanson.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A statement of balances in the County Revenue Allowances as of September 30, 1961, received from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, was ordered published with the proceedings of the Board and placed on file.

A notice from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, relative to the application of the Minnesota Department of Highways for a permit to construct a storm sewer outlet at a specified point on the Mississippi River in the City of Minneapolis, was referred to Kent B. Youngdahl, Highway Administrator.

A letter from Don Poteete, Mound, Minnesota, requesting that

treatment be started for the correction and control of algae in Lake Minnetonka, was read and referred to the Highway Administrator.

A letter from S. C. Smiley and Associates, Architects, requesting that they be permitted to discuss plans for the future enlargement of the Home School for Boys was ordered filed.

A letter from the Citizens League suggesting to the Board the careful screening of candidates for the position of supervisor of assessments was ordered acknowledged and filed.

Letters were received from Kent B. Youngdahl, Highway Administrator, as follows:

1. Requesting that funds be set aside from the Municipal County Aid Fund to the Villages of Deephaven and Greenwood for the improvement of streets within said villages. Ordered held.

2. Notifying the Board that street improvements had been satisfactorily completed by the Villages of Long Lake, Tonka Bay, Morningside and Minnetonka Beach. Ordered filed.

3. Submitting a claim from Elsie Erdmann for compensation for an injury allegedly sustained on a county highway on September 28, 1960. Referred to the Attorney for the Board.

Letters were received from Elmer H. Larson, Land Commissioner, as follows:

1. Recommending approval of a special assessment list for improvements on certain tax forfeited lands in the City of Minneapolis. Referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

2. Recommending approval for the transfer of certain tax forfeited lands to the Villages of St. Louis Park and Mound. Ordered held.

A letter from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, submitting a list of claims payable from the Contributions and Awards fund was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

The plat of Kings Court Second Addition located in the Town of Eden Prairie was presented and referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

An agreement between Hennepin County and the Village of Minnetonka Beach providing for the furnishing of police radio service to said village was received and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Specifications for the purchase and removal of homes from County right-of-way were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from Stanley R. Cowle, Budget Director, as follows:

1. Requesting the cancellation of the balance remaining in a completed contract for architectural services during construction of the Highway Building and restoration of said cancelled balance to the County Revenue Fund.
2. Requesting the setting aside of funds for architectural services in connection with work at the Radio Station,
3. Recommending acceptance of the offer from the Hennepin County Crime Commission to turn over to the Central Mobile Equipment Division a Volkswagon truck to be used by the Sheriff as a mobile crime laboratory.
4. Notifying the Board of the acceptance of the low bids for the improvement of County State Aid Highways No. 62, No. 17, No. 51 and No. 19 and requesting that funds be set aside to pay said awards.

All of the above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.



At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisements for bids, Stanley R. Cowle, Purchasing Agent, proceeded to open bids for furnishing office furniture for the Sheriff's office.

A bid from Globe Office Furniture Company, which was received prior to the bid-opening time but inadvertently pushed under other envelopes, was brought into the meeting after the other bids had been opened.

Commissioner Swanson moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott, that the bid of Globe Office Furniture Company be opened and considered with the other bids.

The vote on the motion was as follows: Ainsworth yea, Hanson absent, Scott yea, Swanson yea, Chairman Matthews yea.

Motion carried.

The bids were referred to Mr. Cowle for tabulation and report.

Commissioner Ainsworth offered the following resolution, and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, The City Council of the City of Minneapolis in the County of Hennepin and State of Minnesota, on the 29th day of September, 1961, duly adopted a resolution determining the total amount which would have been assessed against the parcel of tax-forfeited land therein described for improving certain streets by sidewalks, if such parcel of land had been subject to assessment, which said public improvement was made by said city after such parcel had been forfeited to the State for non-payment of taxes; and

WHEREAS, The City Clerk of said City of Minneapolis, pursuant to Minnesota Statutes for 1945, Section 282.01, Subd. 3, as amended has duly certified to the County Auditor of said county the total amount which would have been assessed against said parcel described in said resolution if it had been subject to assessment; and

WHEREAS, The certificate of the said City Clerk in which he made such certification has been filed in the office of the said County Auditor and has been submitted to this Board by said County Auditor; and

WHEREAS, It appears to this Board that said parcel has been benefited by said public improvement in an amount equal to the amount set opposite said parcel in said resolution and certificate:

NOW, THEREFORE, This Board does hereby determine that the value of said parcel of tax-forfeited land described in said resolution and certificate and also described in the list hereinafter referred to was enhanced by such improvement to the extent of the amount set opposite said parcel in said resolution, certificate, and list, and that such amount should be added as a separate item to the existing appraised value of said parcel; and

BE IT RESOLVED, By this Board that the appraised value for the purpose of sale of such parcel of land which is described in the list designated as List No. 94, Special Assessment List for the City of Minneapolis, is the existing appraised value of said parcel plus the amount set opposite said parcel in said list and therein listed under the heading "Amt. of Assmt.", which said amount set opposite such parcel is hereby included as a separate item in fixing said total appraised value of said parcel of land for the purposes of sale; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the said list be ordered filed with the County Auditor.

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The question was on the adoption of the resolution, and the roll being called, there were FOUR YEAS and NO NAYS, as follows:



