The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A letter from John K. Harvey, Ass't. County Attorney, relative to the claim of Jack Bergeran for damages allegedly sustained while hauling gravel for the county was referred to the Committee of the Whole.

A letter from Dr. F. G. Gunlaugson of the Minneapolis Health Department, requesting the commitment of two patients to Glen Lake Sanatorium, was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Dr. William G. Guthrie, Coroner, requesting an automobile allowance for a deputy in his department, was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.
